The Language Arts department recognizes all four fundamentals of communications—reading, writing, speaking, and listening—in its course offerings at CPHS. English courses emphasize careful reading of the American, English, and world literature given and constant training in the expression of one's ideas through speaking and writing. Foreign courses strive to give the student a reasonable mastery of its language.

Spanish students are taught listening comprehension, and speaking as well as reading and writing. The four years of Latin offered at CPHS stress the many uses of the classical and understanding of the Roman culture. The two journalism courses, the *Aries* or yearbook course and the *Ram's Horn* or newspaper course acquaint its students with the basic principles and techniques of the mass media as well as application through school publications.

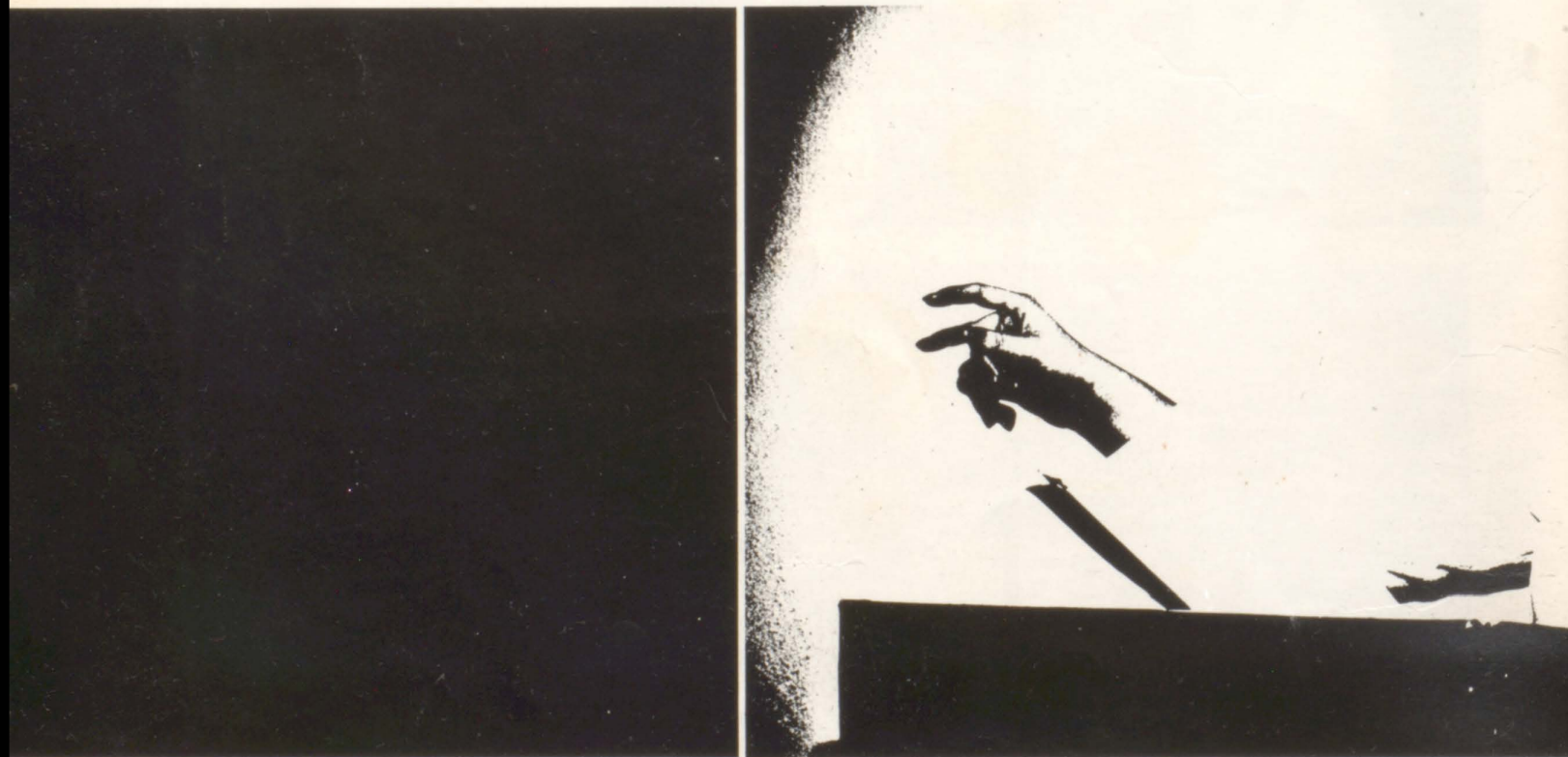
C.P.H.S. Appreciates Custodial Help

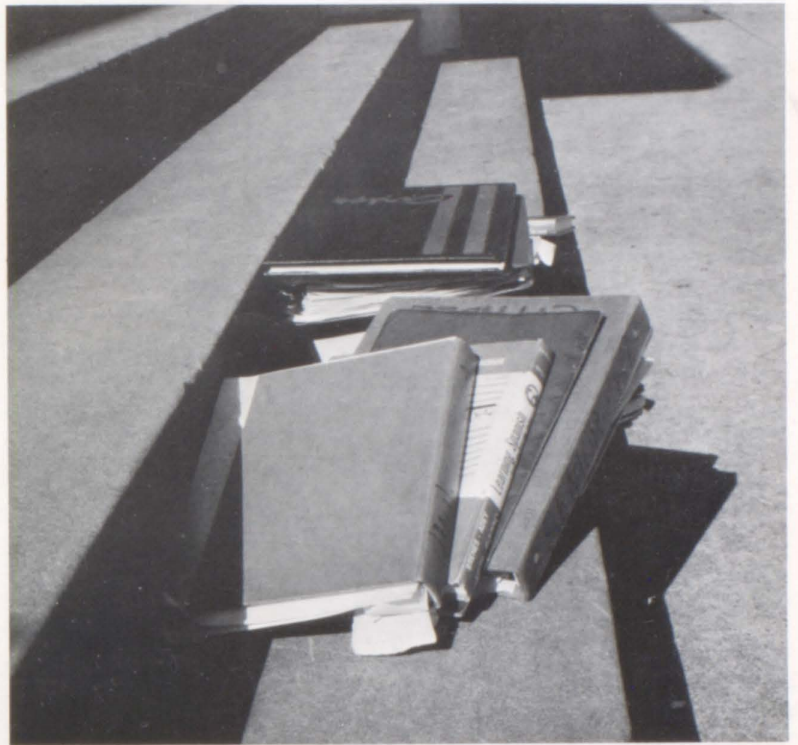

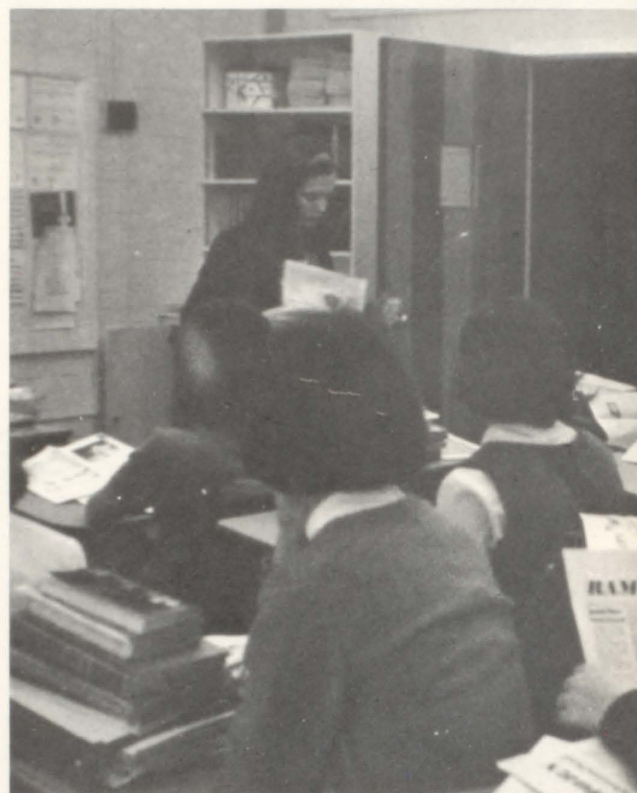

This year College Park High School was asked to become a chapter of the National Spanish Honor Society. Eleven second-year Spanish students were chosen for this honor on the basis of grades and character.

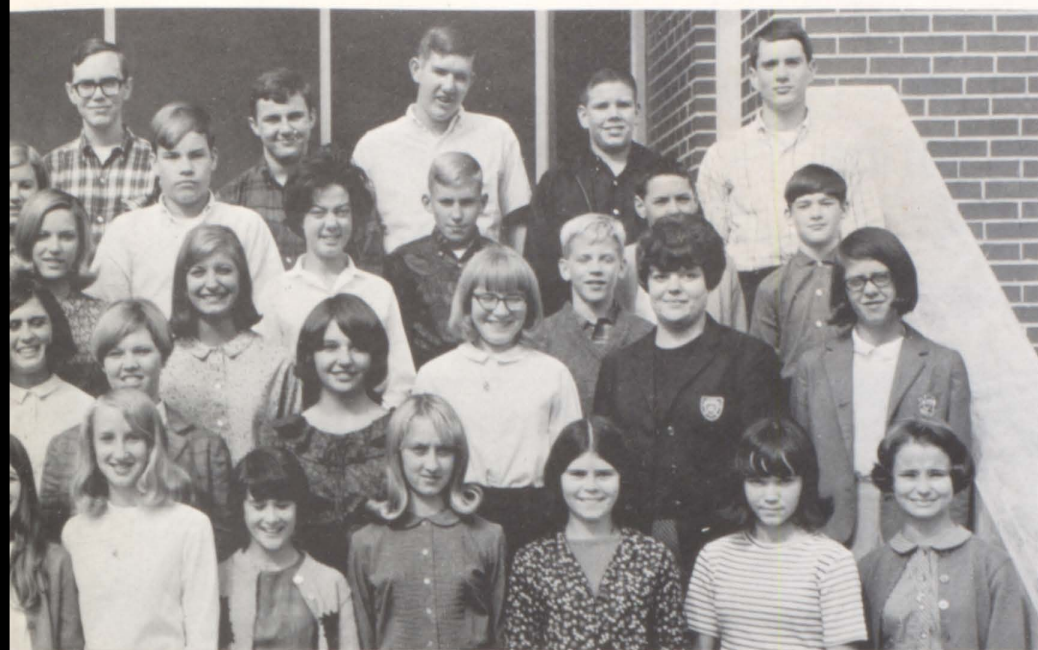

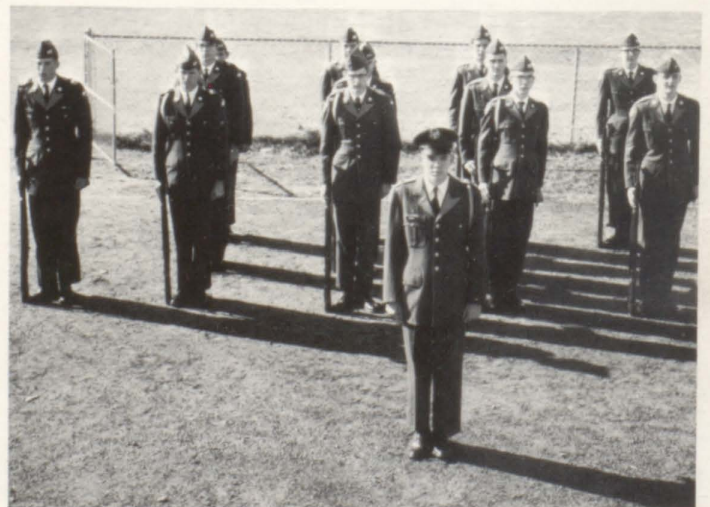


Military
