#### Mrs. Cochran Leaves Us This Year





The Language Arts department recognizes all four fundamentals of communications—reading, writing, speaking, and listening—in its course offerings at CPHS. English courses emphasize careful reading of the American, English, and world literature given and constant training in the expression of one's ideas through speaking and writing. Foreign courses strive to give the student a reasonable mastery of its language.

The four years of Latin offered at CPHS stress the many uses of the classical and understanding of the Roman culture. 


### Military
