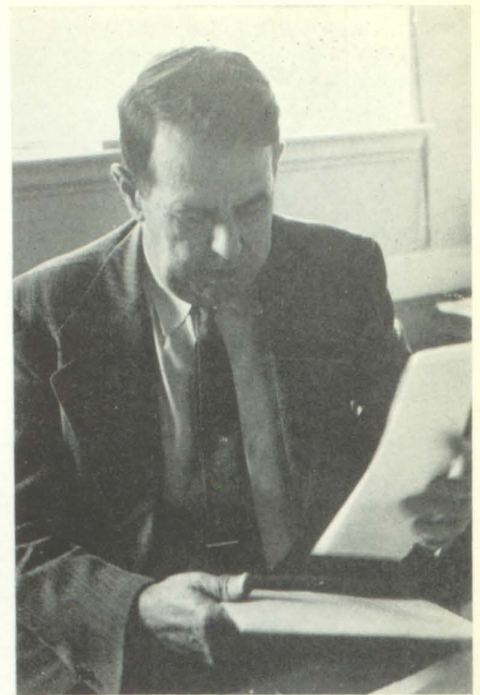
DEDICATION

The Faculty

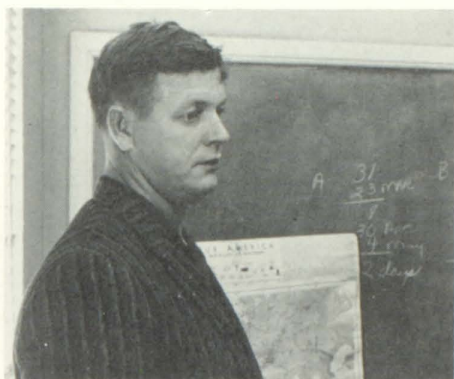

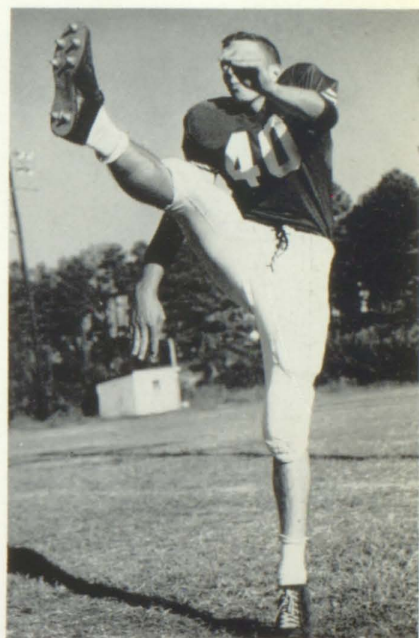

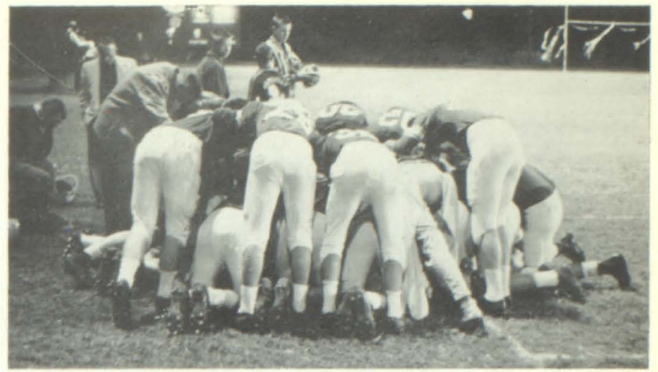

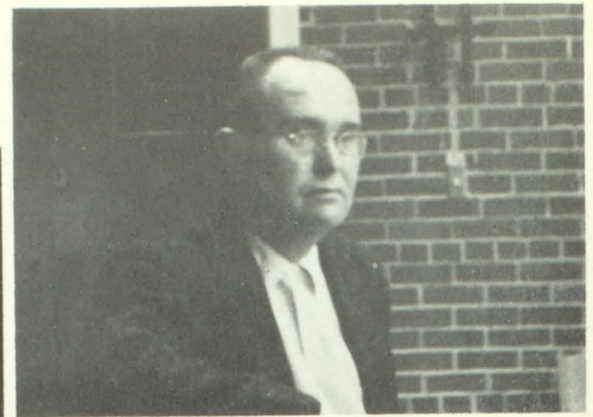

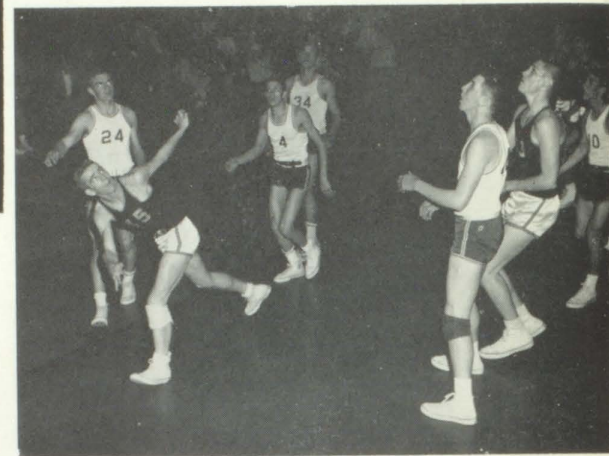

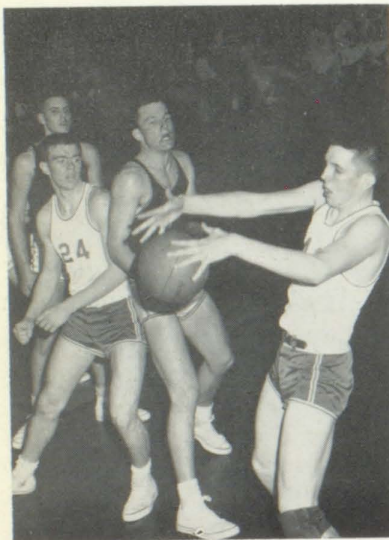

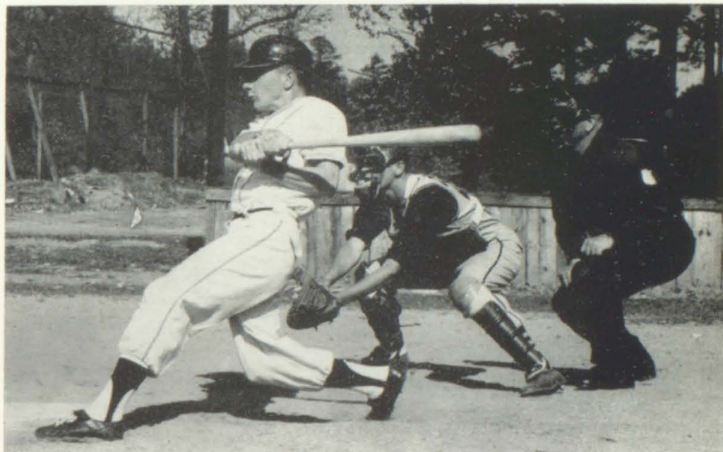

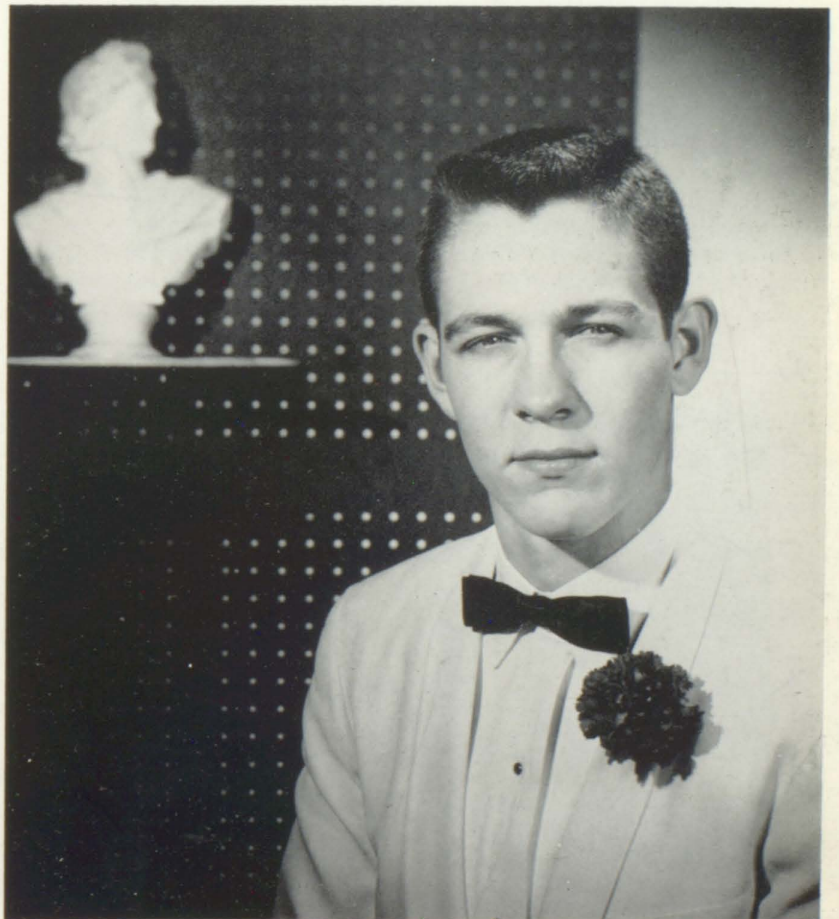
