












The student body as a group is a dull thing. It's only when one meets each student as a unique individual rather than a "member of the mass" that the experience becomes interesting.










Some people are intent on attaining a certain goal and studiously apply themselves to reaching it. Others are concentrating on the present, with no thought for the future or what might be in store for them.

And then there are those people who are growing. Growing in knowledge, maturity, and even size.












"Up, Up, and Away with the Eagles, "the theme of Homecoming 1968, proved to be a winning title for the SENIORS of '69.


Sophomores Experience First Date
