Revival of Homecoming Parade

What is a parade without a band? College Park's marching band, traditionally the head of our homecoming parade, does its best to get spectators into high spirits.



Since last October at College Park passed without seeing the traditional homecoming parade, everyone was in doubt this year as to whether we could re-establish the custom or not. It's a well known fact, though, that this year's administration is reasonably liberal-minded when it comes to granting the student body's wishes, as well as being fairly pro-sports; sure enough, with much postponing of dates (but with no regard to superstition), the parade was held after school on Friday the thirteenth. (We lost the game that night, too.) Rugby Avenue marks the beginning of the parade which progresses down Main Street past the school and turns the corner at the A&P. Those not participating in it either in the band, majorettes, military, or on floats are mainly underclassmen, and the parade gives them an introduction to most of the organizations in high school. 




Today's Students, Tomorrow's Greats




Distributing the ARIES







Girls Varsity Basketball: Another Successful Season












Guidance and Counseling






Social Science
