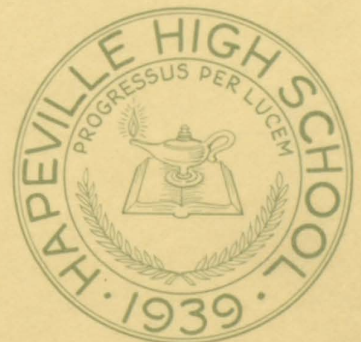
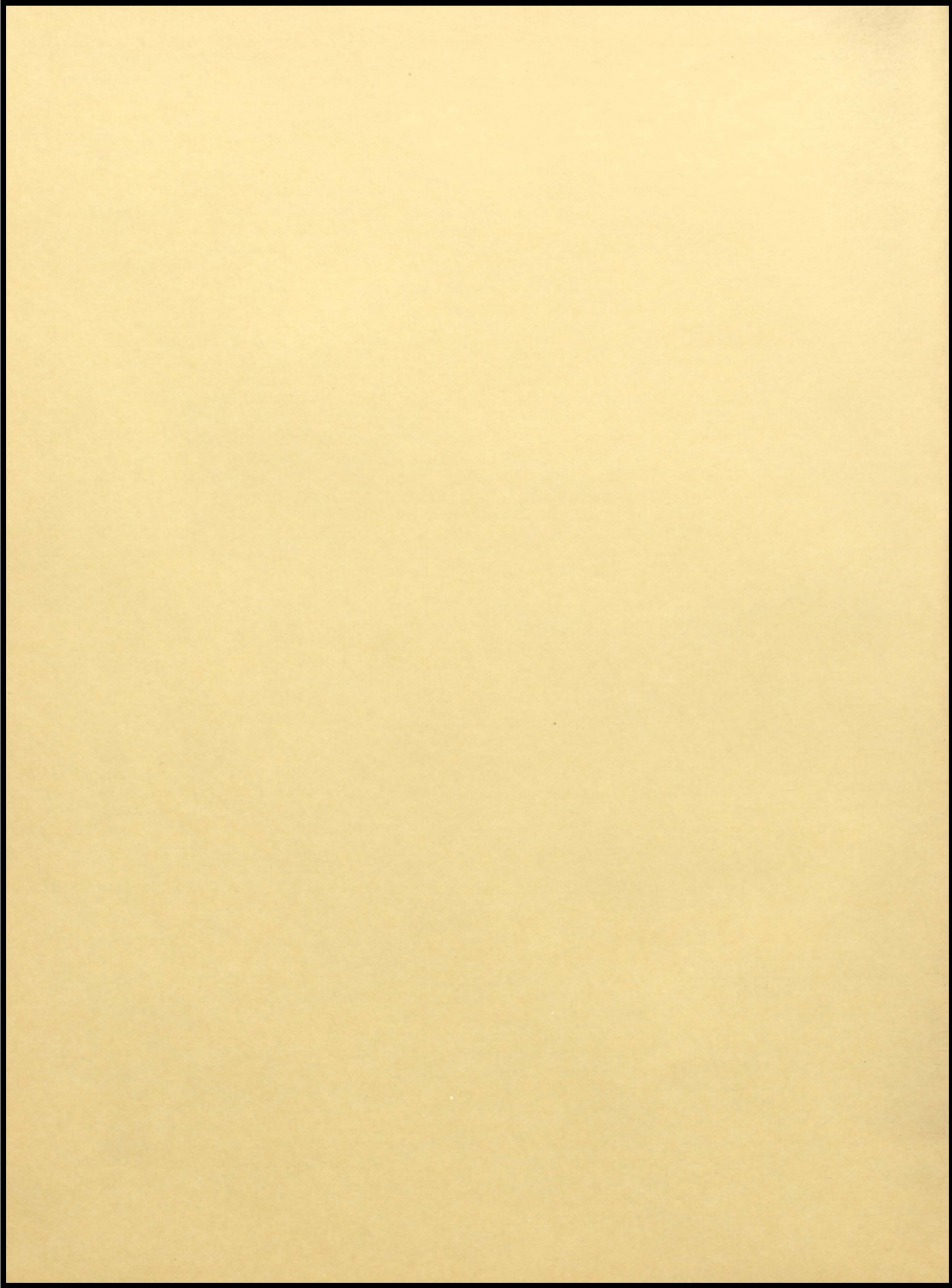


The official seal of Hapeville High, first drawn up in 1951, was adopted by the Student Council. It made its appearance on the cover of the *Hilltop* that year.

In 1959 an attempt was made to adopt a new design. This design, too, appeared on the *Hilltop* cover. The design included too much detail.

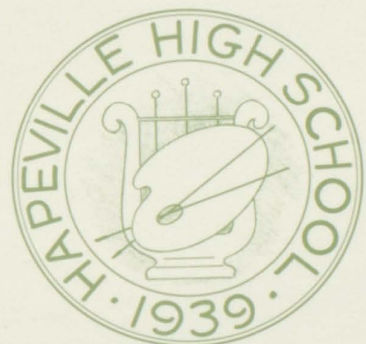
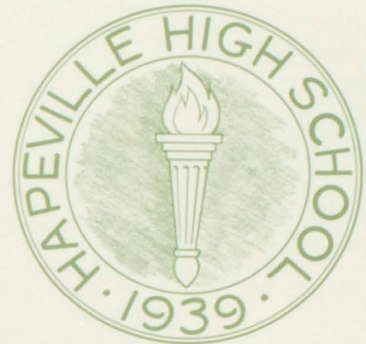

"Like a mighty army," Hapeville students give meaning to Christian character in their effort to develop radiant personality.

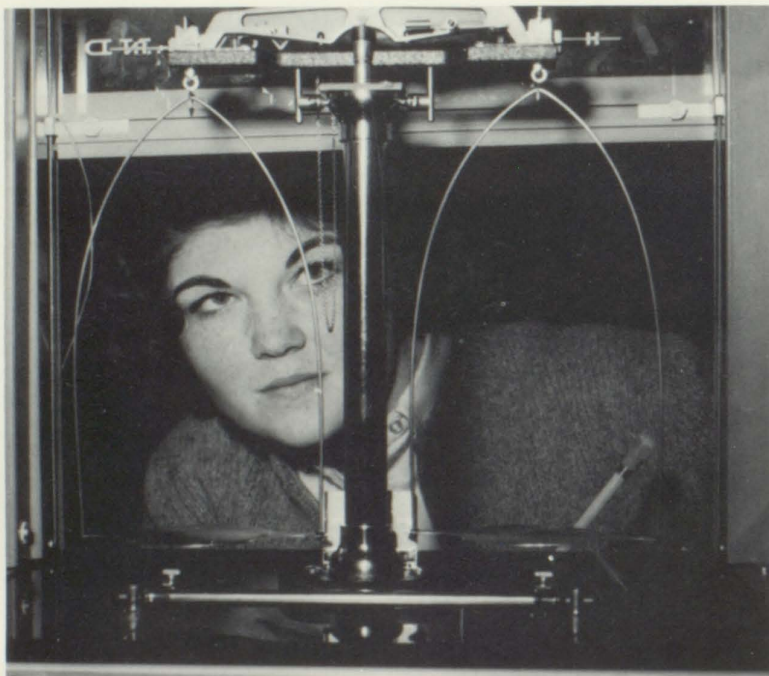
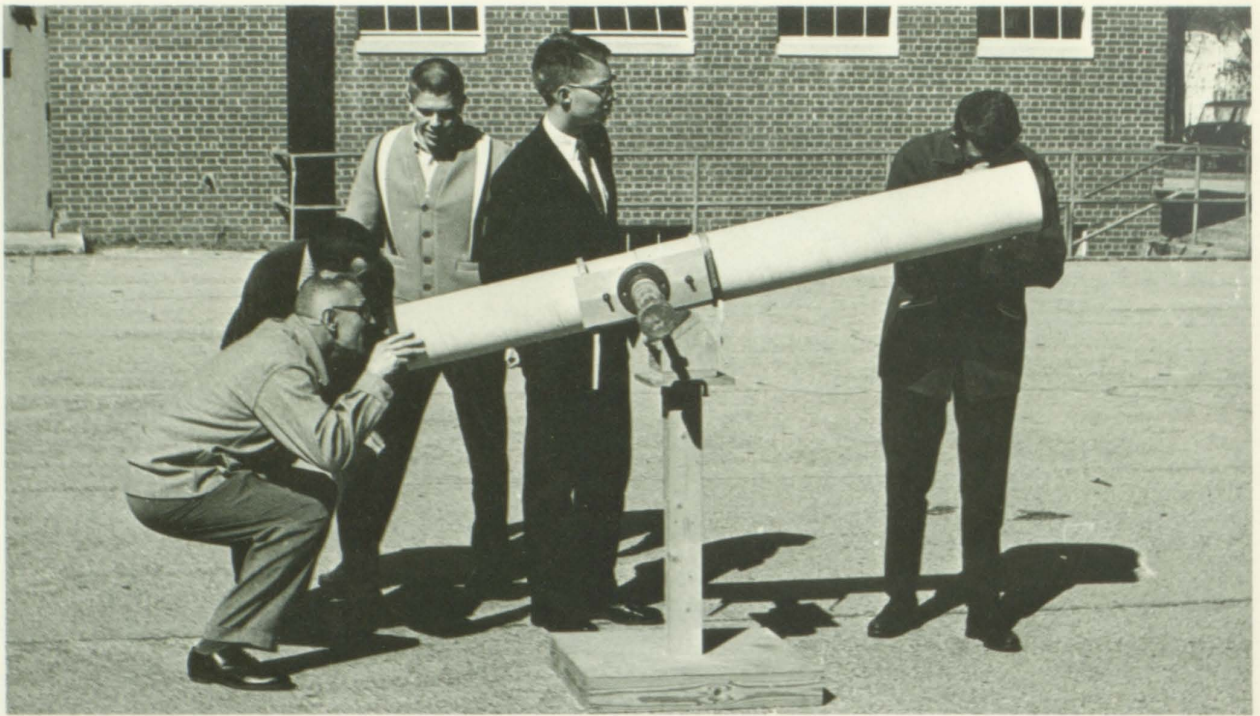

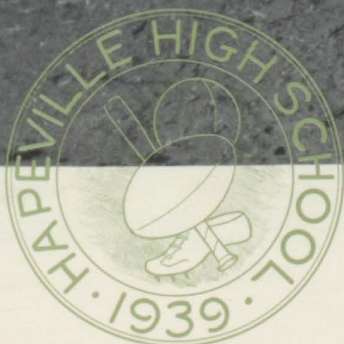

Hapeville's excellent gym facilities help students keep physically fit. Hornet players are recognized for quality sportsmanship.



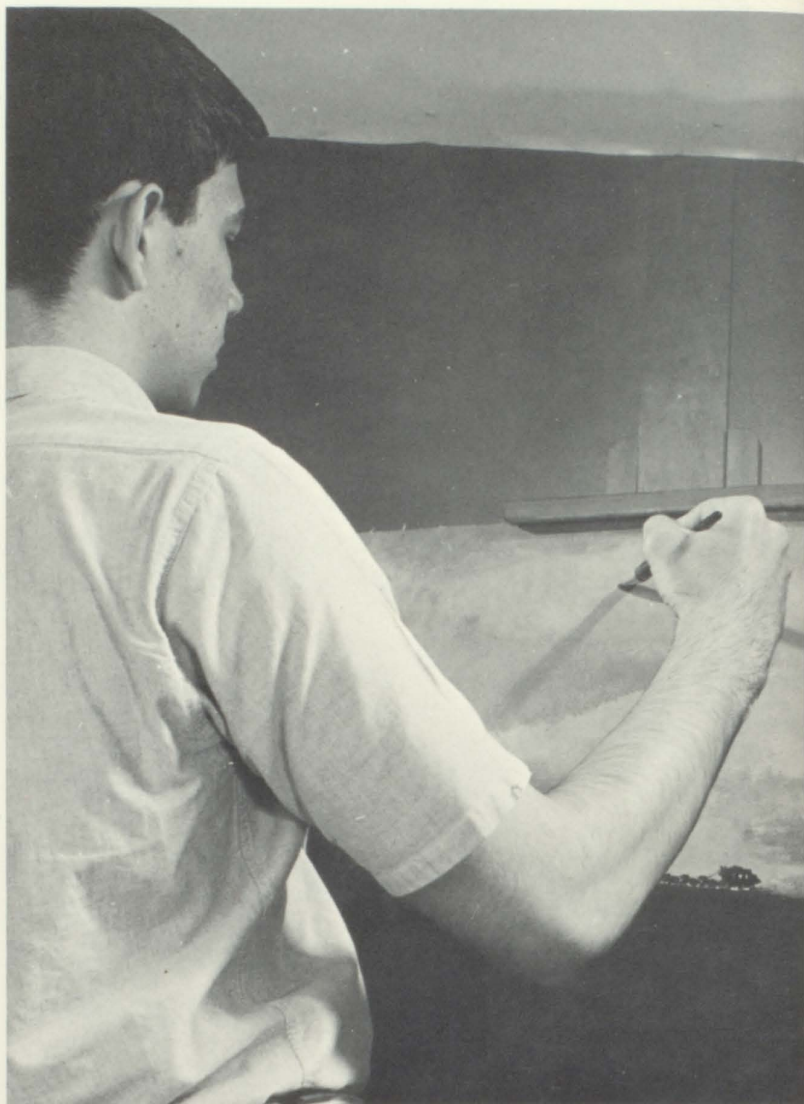


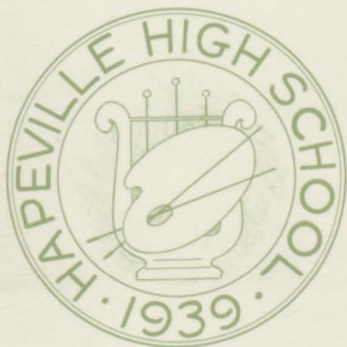

TO THE STUDENTS OF HAPEVILLE HIGH SCHOOL:



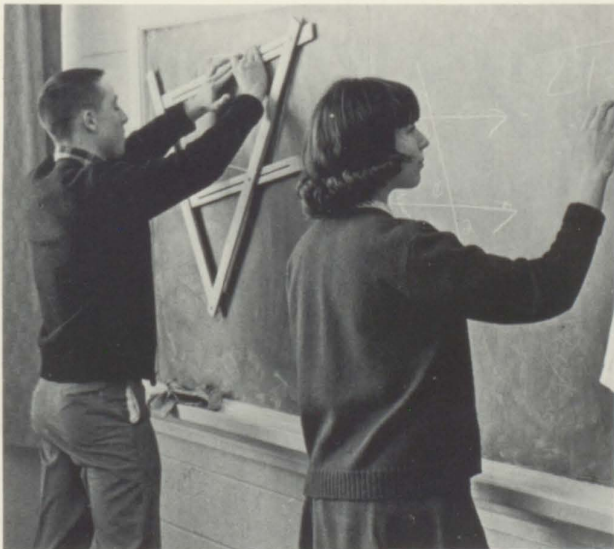

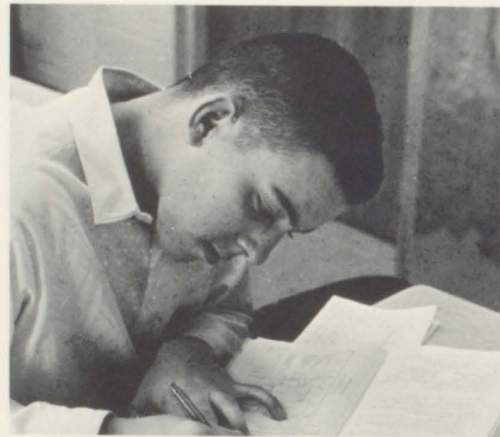

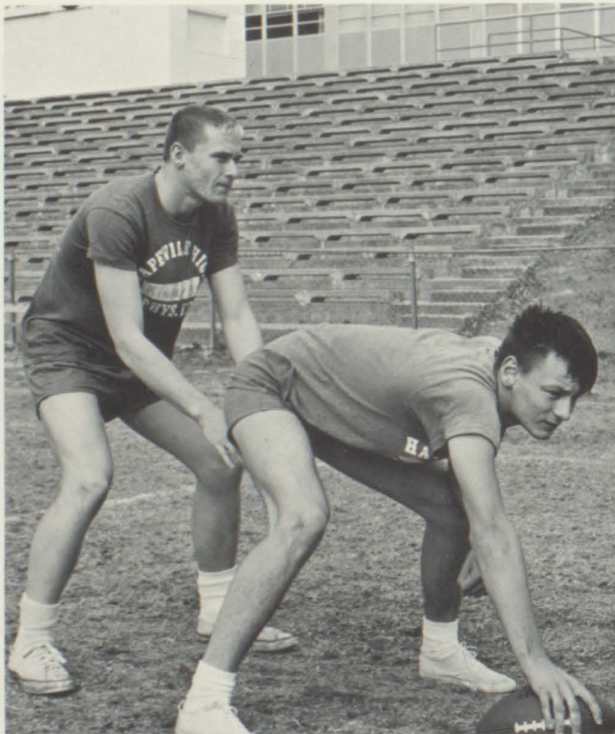

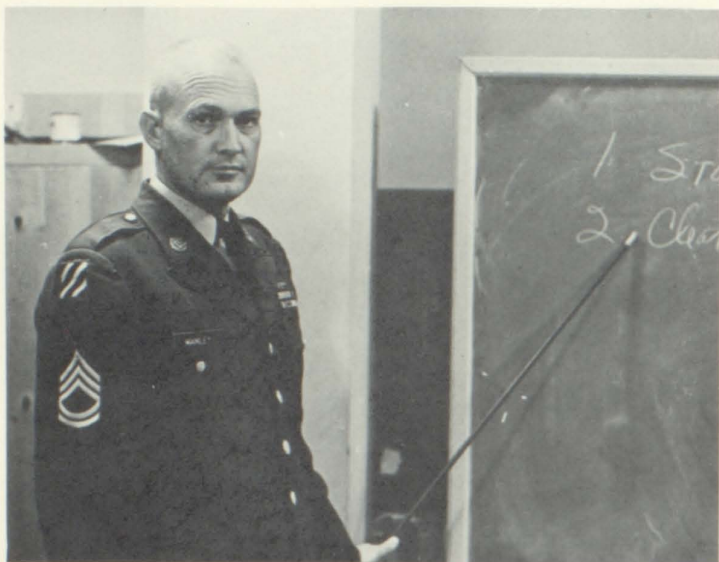

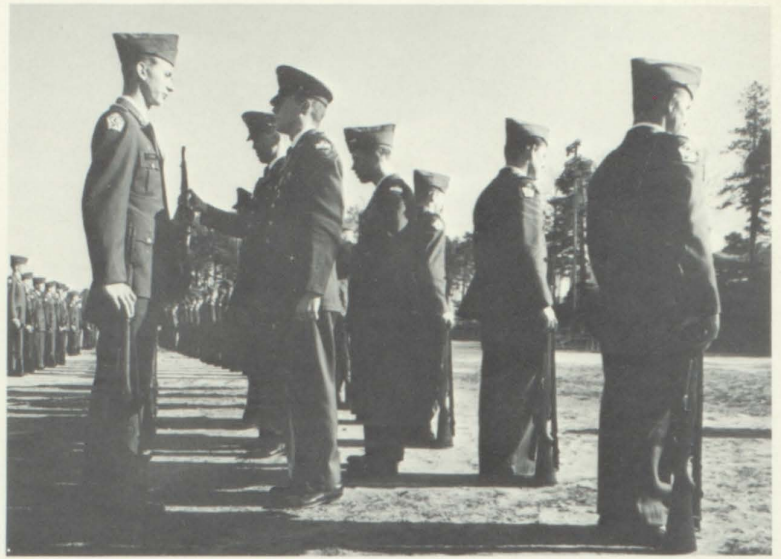

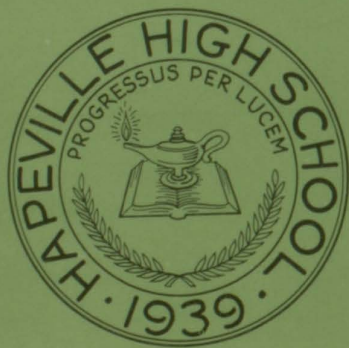

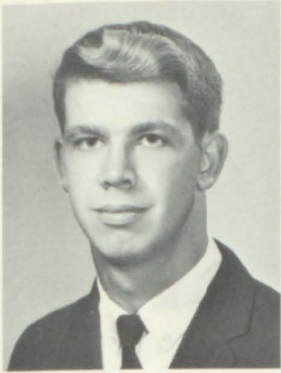

The memories of the graduates will not linger and "softly fade away" in Hapeville's halls; they will remain in the hearts of all who leave.

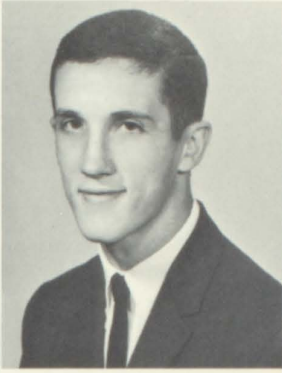

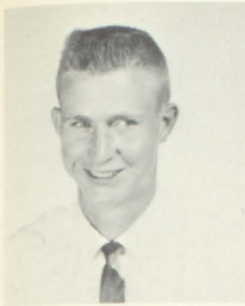

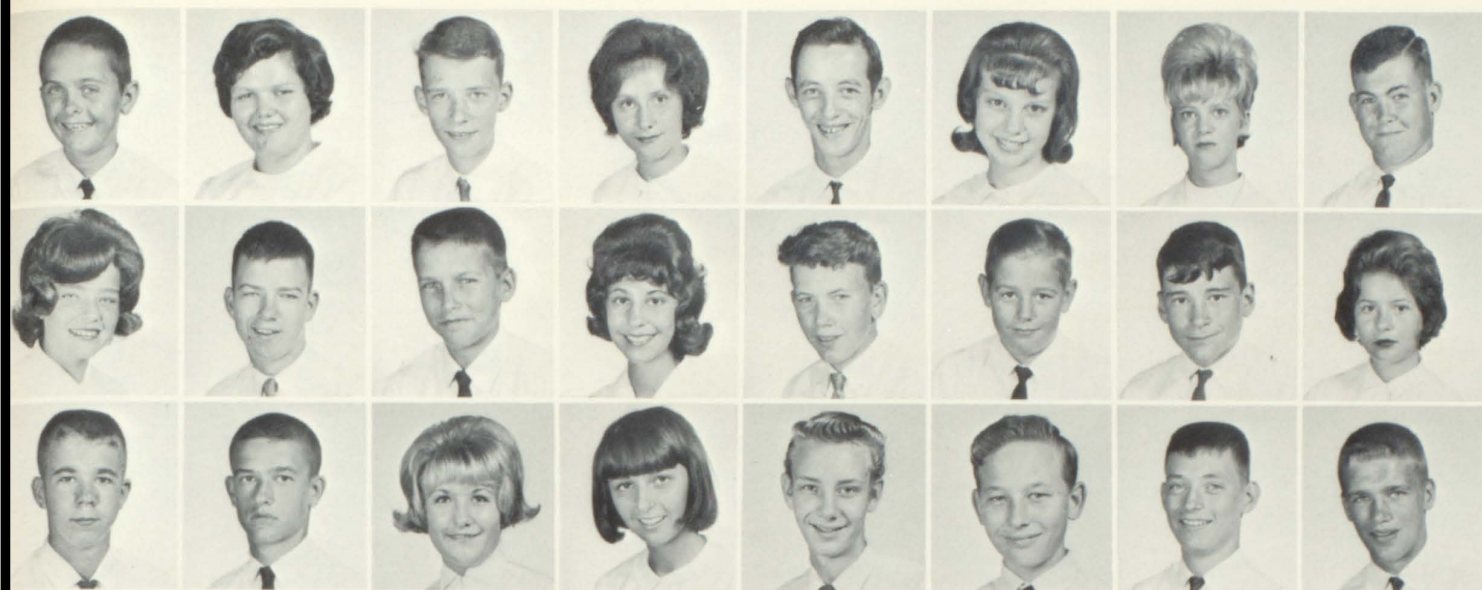
## FRESHMEN CHOOSE COURSES: BIG DECISION

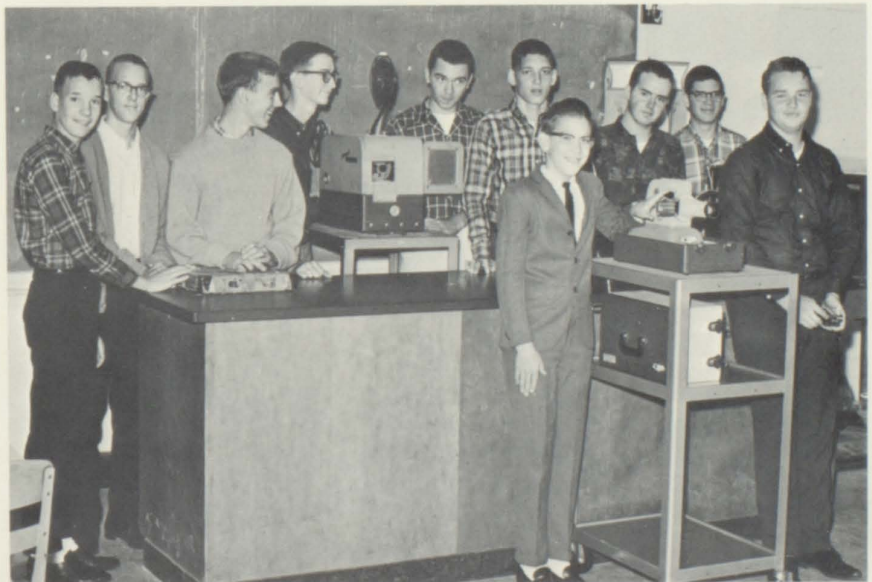

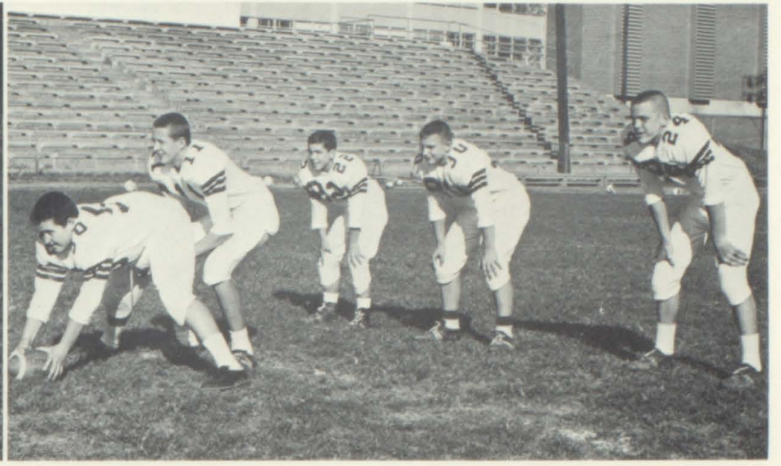

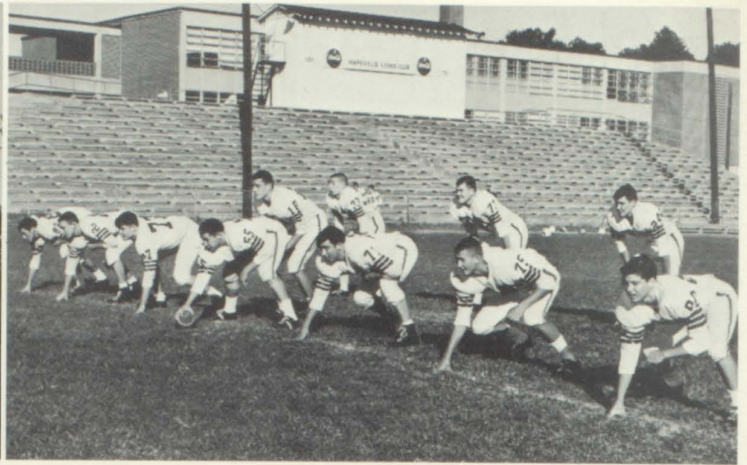

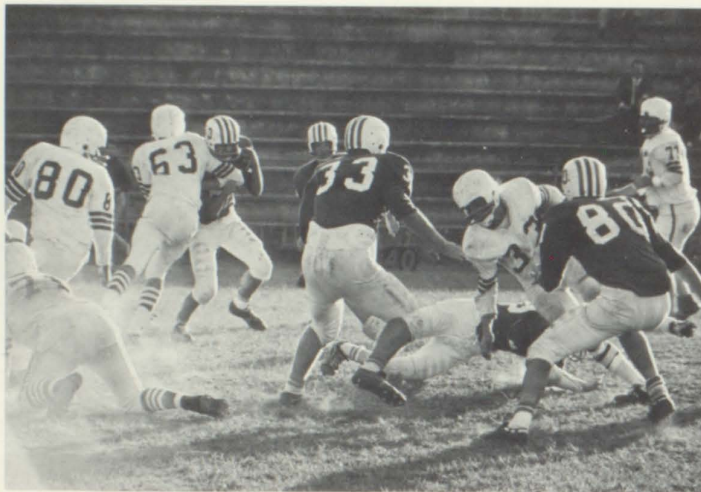

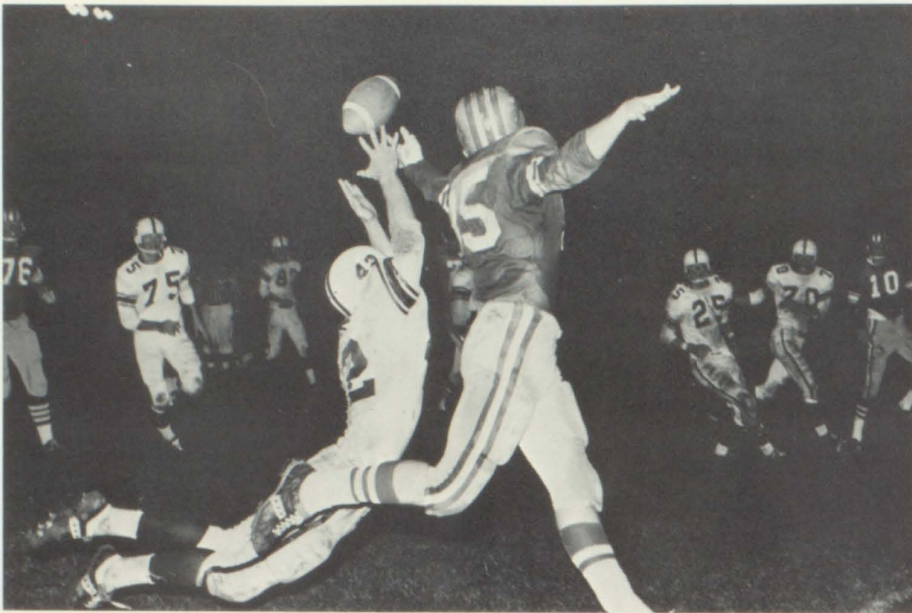

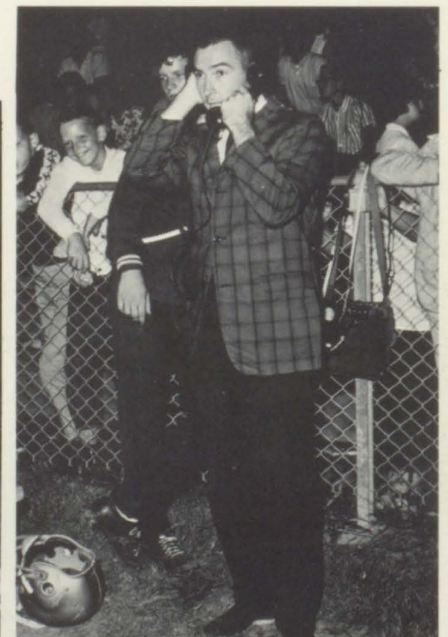

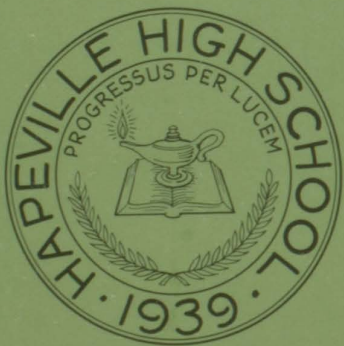

The official seal of Hapeville High, first drawn up in 1951, was adopted by the Student Council. It made its appearance on the cover of the *Hilltop* that year.
