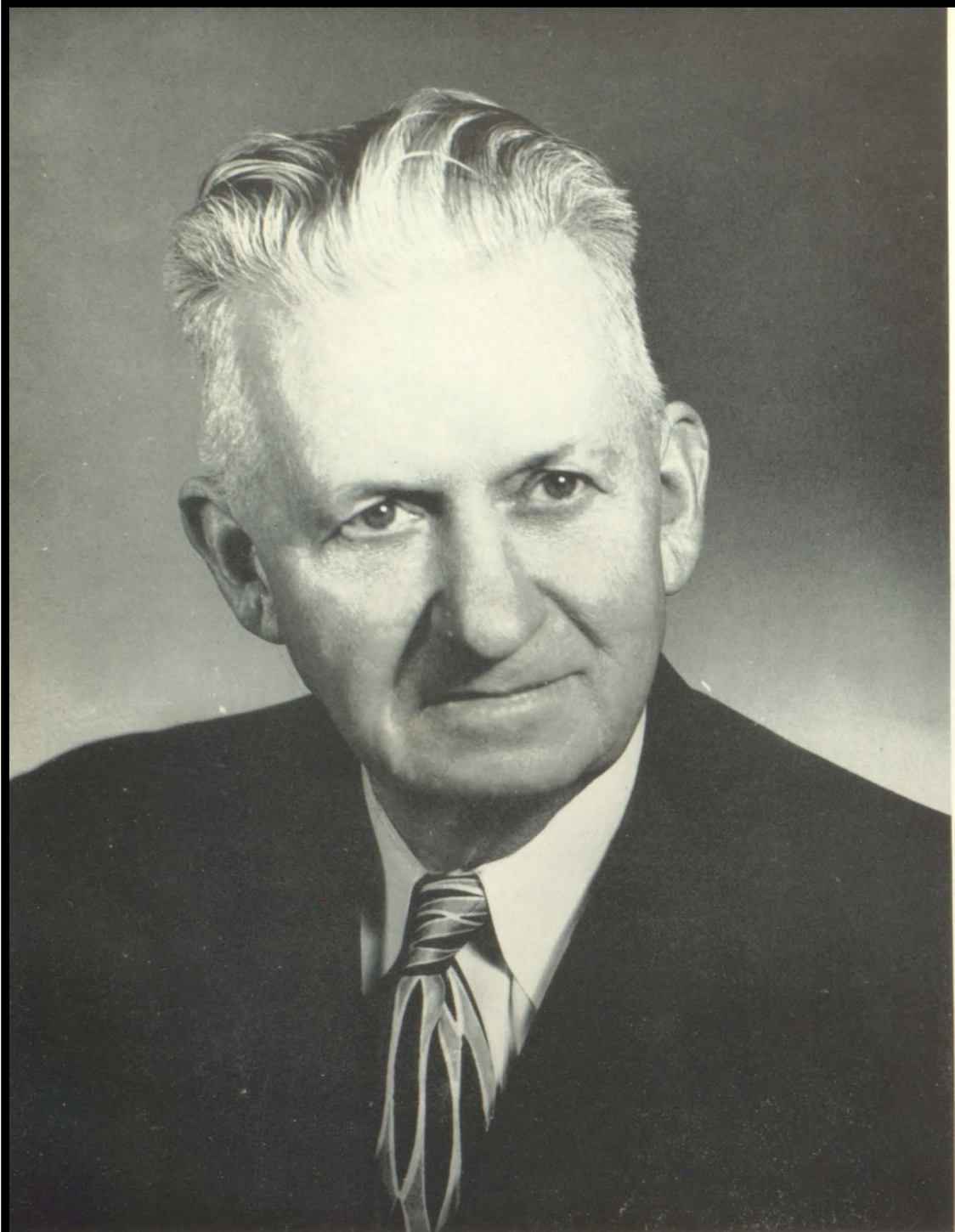
PARADE OF HITS

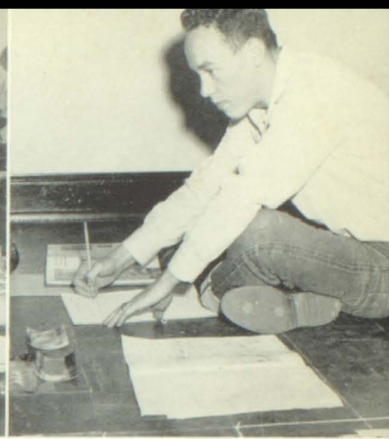

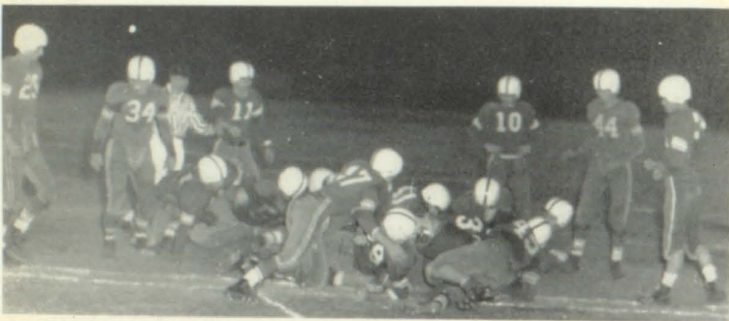

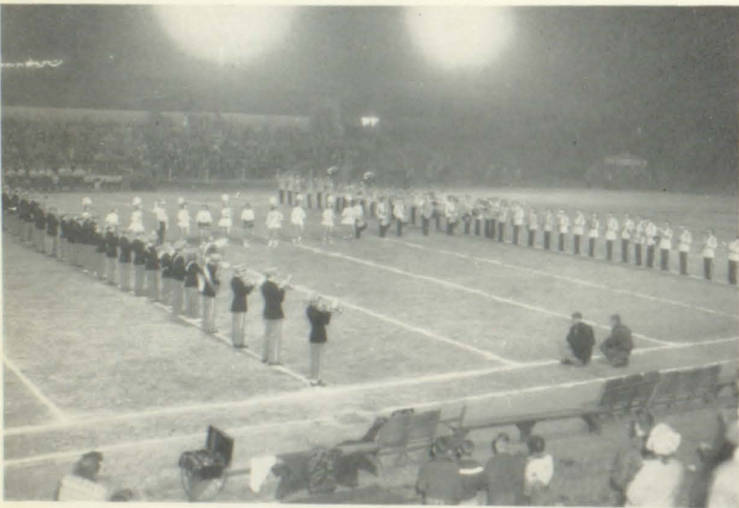

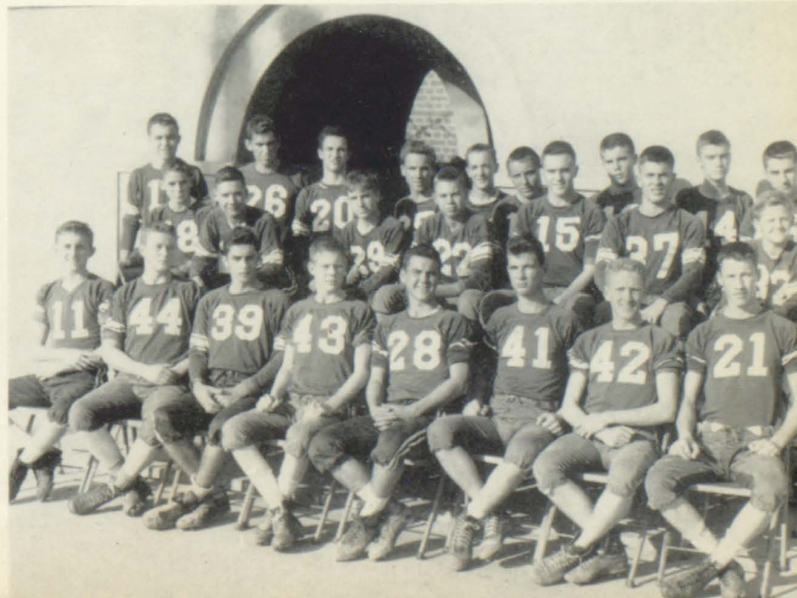

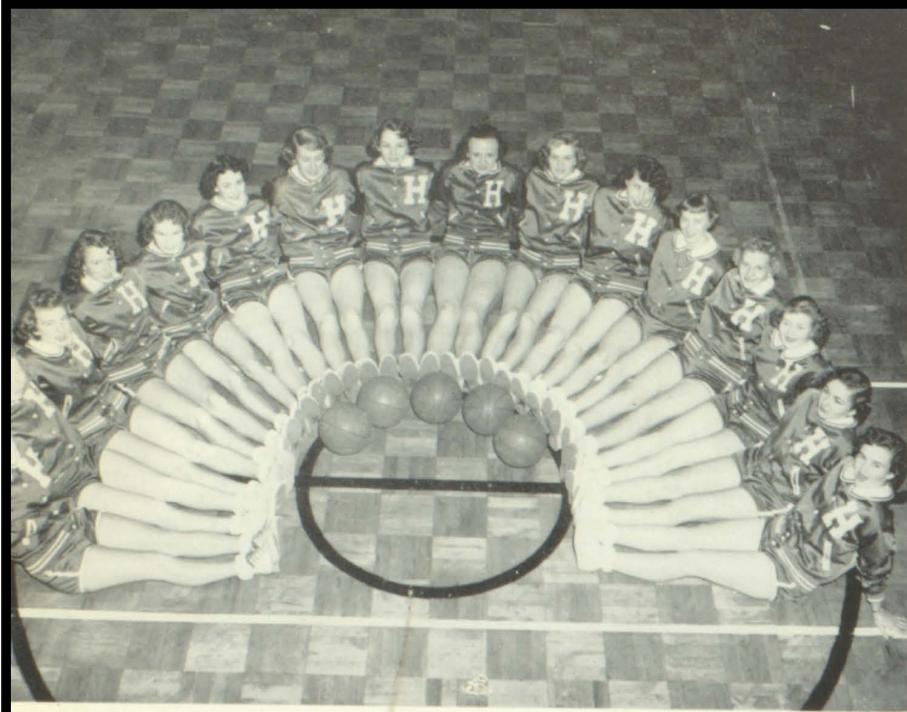
