

JANUARY 1961

Lakeshore High School opens with Principal Linton Deck, Jr. There is no Senior class. Mrs. Cunningham begins teaching in the science department. The empty trophy case serves as a lost and found.

1962-1963

The school is already too small! Two new wings are added, as well as a music area. Students help serve in the cafeteria. The first class graduates.

1963-1964

The Lancettes are formed. Mrs. Cunningham is chosen Star Teacher.

1964-1965

Mr. George Woodruff becomes Principal. New classrooms are added again and the school finally has a stadium, but in April a fire destroys half the building. Lakeshore students attend Briarwood on double session for the remainder of the year.

1965-1966

George Lee is Star Teacher. The tennis team is the school's first state champion.

1966-1967

Integration comes to Lakeshore as a handful of black students join the student body. The Cross Country team brings home the region championship.

1967-1968

Both football and Cross Country teams are region champs. The first black teachers come to LHS.

1968-1969

The quarter system begins for Lakeshore's 1300 students. The basketball team advances to 3rd in state AA finals.

1969-1970

Students are on double sessions due to overcrowding. Football team is region champ. Mrs. Cunningham is Star Teacher. Mrs. Mitchell joins faculty in Business Department.

1970-1971

Mrs. Cunningham is Star Teacher.

1971-1972

Region champs in football.

1972-1973

The Afro and the mini-skirt come into style.

1961-1988

1973-1974

State Champs in Cross-Country. 1974-1975

The latest fad is stuffing people into VW's. Girls begin wearing pants to school for the first time.

1975-1976

Three crowns: football, baseball, and basketball teams win Region. Basketball team goes on to win State Championship! The juke box in the cafeteria plays "Shake Your Booty" at lunchtime.

1976-1977

The first of several Donkey Basketball games is held in the gym. Baseball team is region champ.

1977-1978

Mrs. Mitchell becomes Assistant Principal. The volleyball team begins.

1978-1979

First year for the math team.

1979-1980

Jacque Bryant is the first black Homecoming Queen.

1980-1981

There is no yearbook so Mrs. Willingham and the Accolade staff publish Volume I of Bronze Reminiscence.

1981-1982

The Flag Corps is begun. Fads this year are Izods, designer jeans, and Rubik's Cubes. 1982-1983

The Homecoming Queen is announced at the school's first Coronation Ball. Mrs. Willingham is Fulton County TOTY.

1983-1984

Trailers are moved in for eighth graders. 1984-1985

Mrs. Cunningham is Fulton County TOTY. The football team wins the region. The first Gong Show raises money for the yearbook.

1985-1986

Mrs. Mitchell becomes Principal. Eighth graders are abolished to Camp Creek. Region championships in football and basketball.

Lakeshore High School's ultimate year.
















A NIGHT OF
