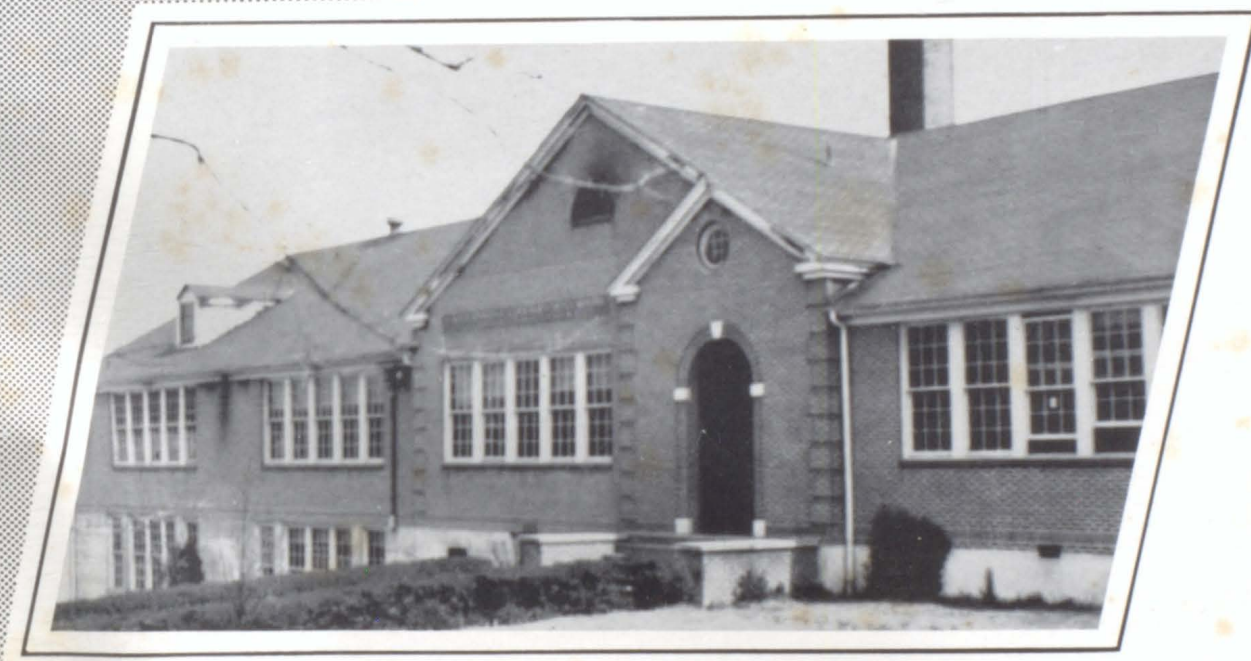

She typifies for us the poetic facts that "Beauty (Of soul and spirit)" is indeed its own excuse for being.

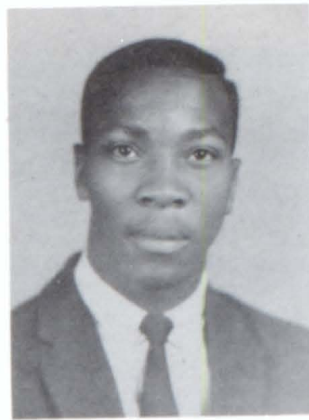
She will long be remembered for her quiet perseverance and integrity.

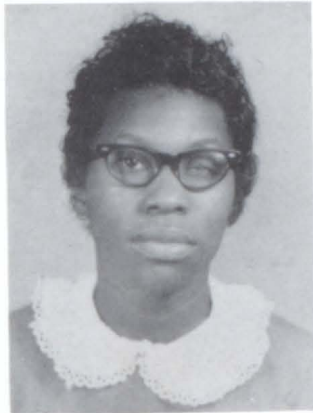

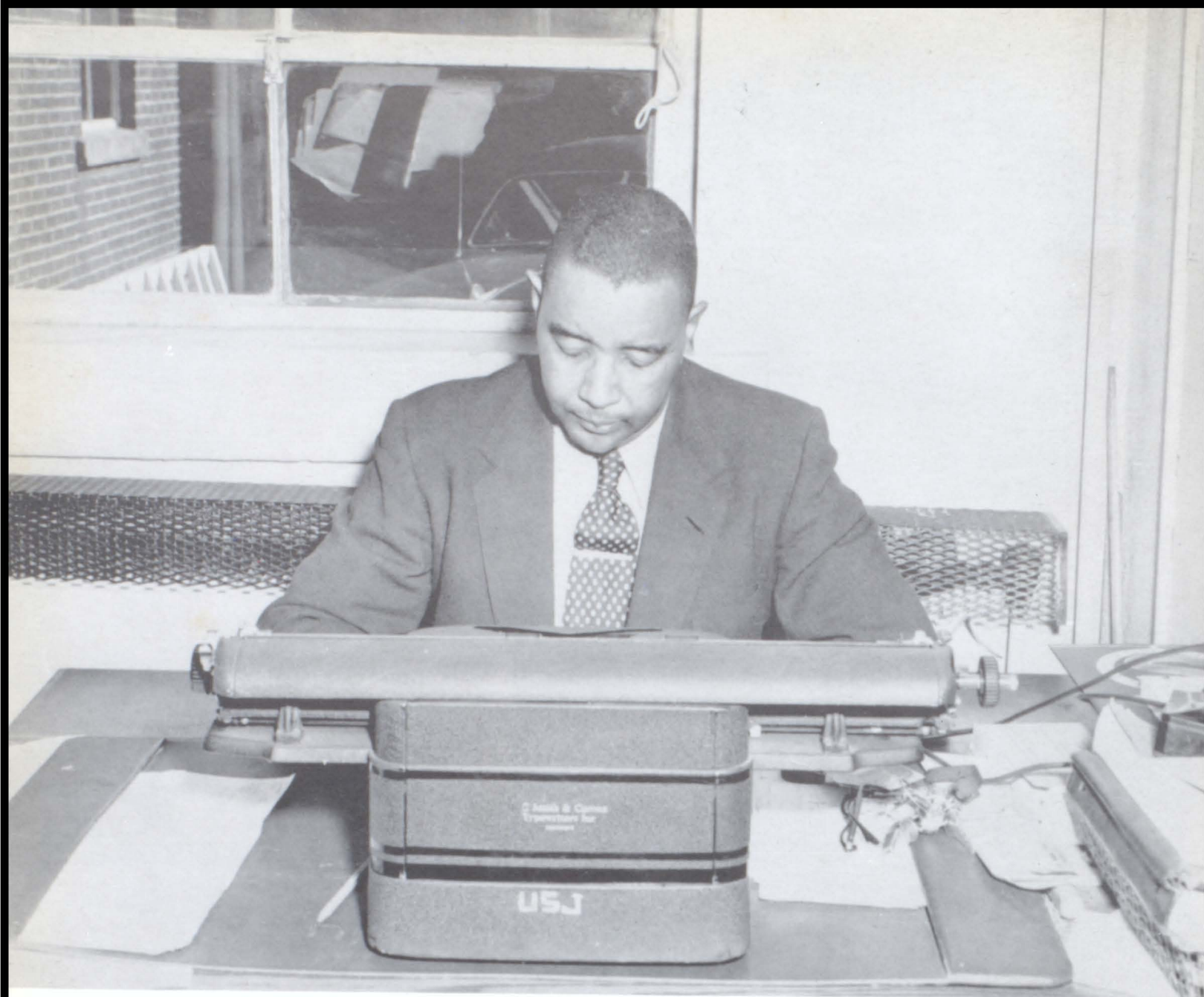

We are proud to have Mr. Brown as our counselor.



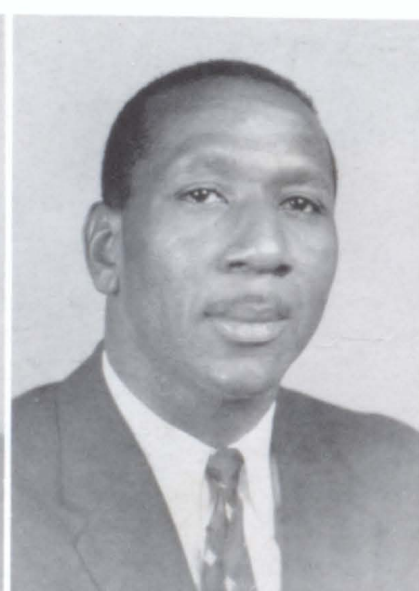

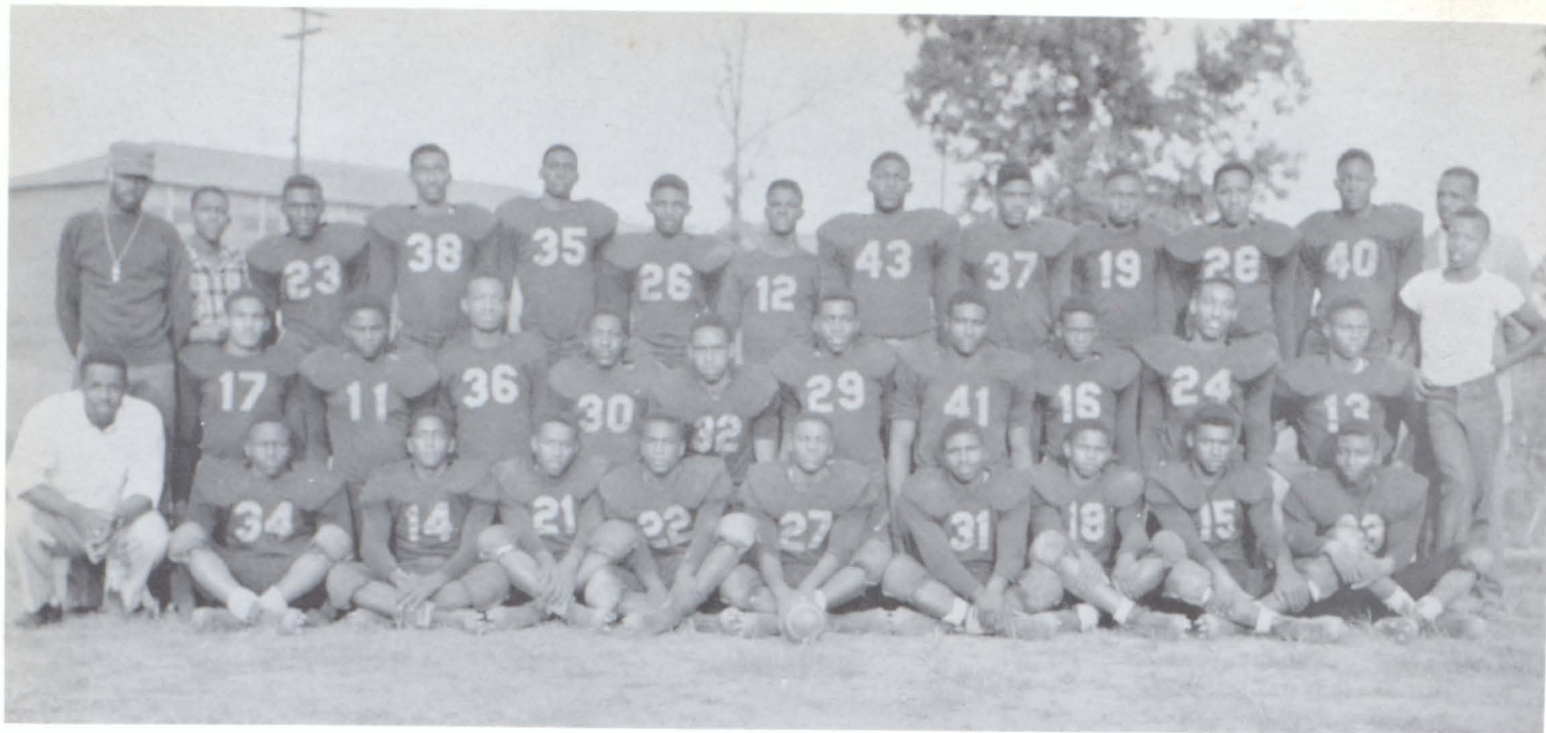
