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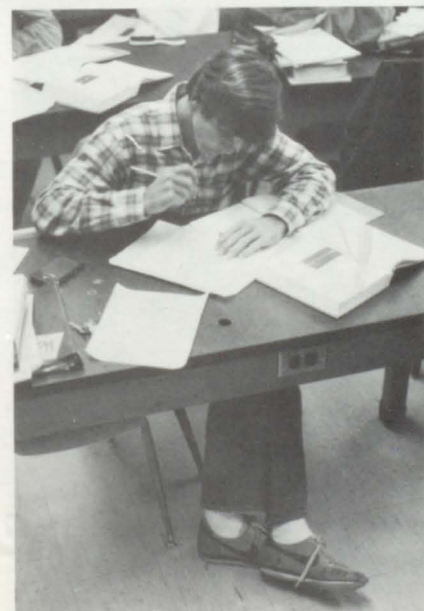
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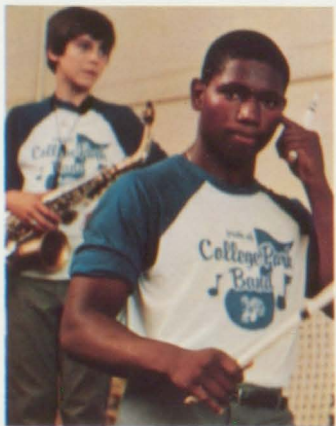


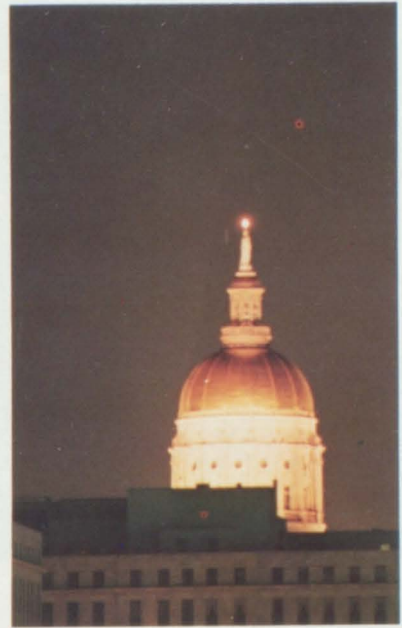


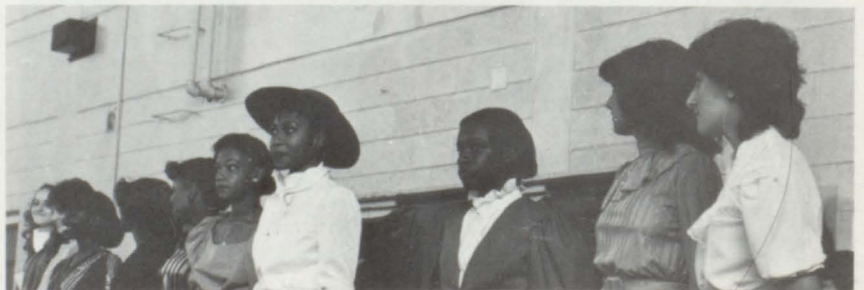
WHAT WE OFFER

WHAT'S: These people are the ones who are not in the school, but they are not in the school.

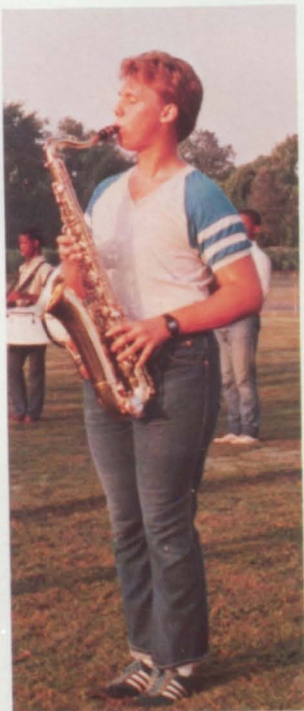

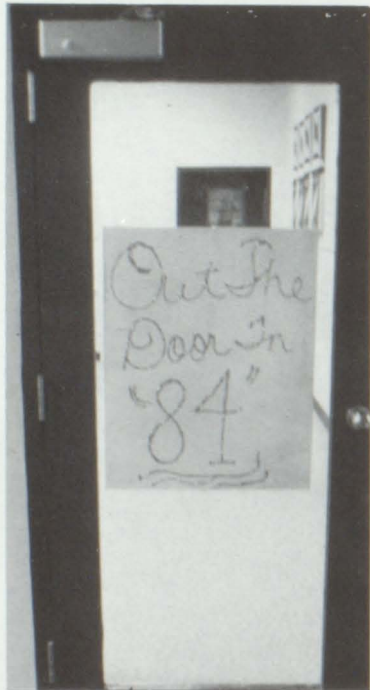

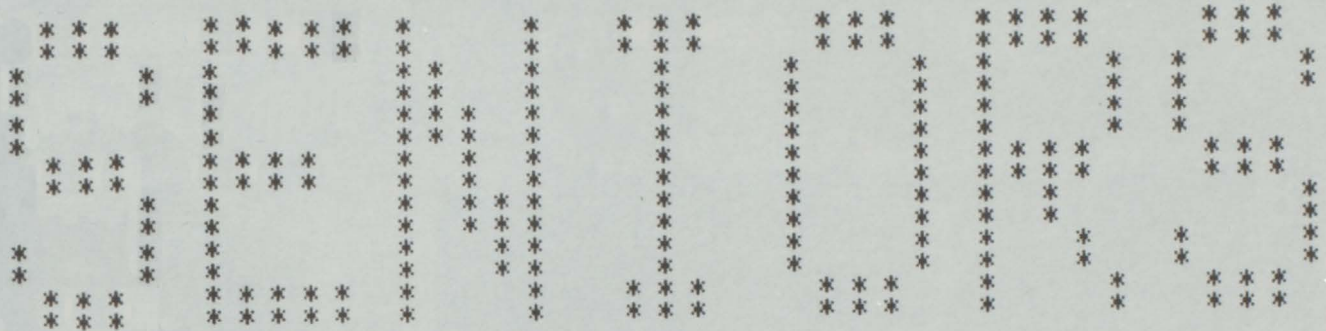
FRIENDS

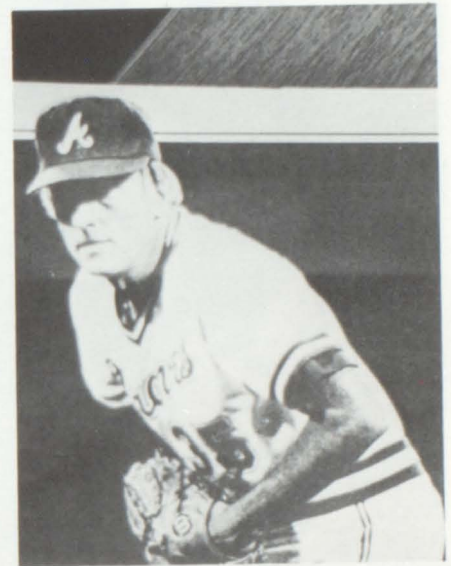
Impressions of 1983

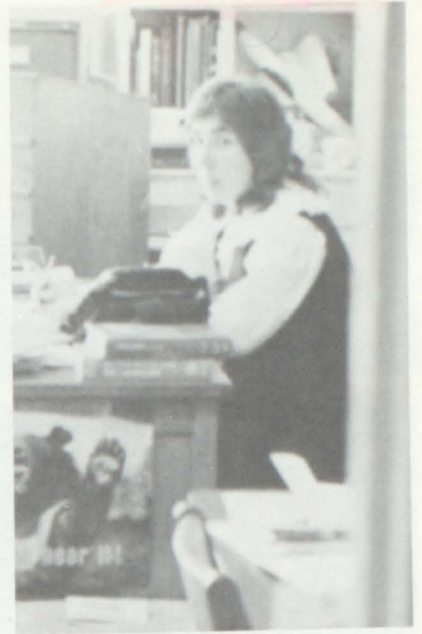


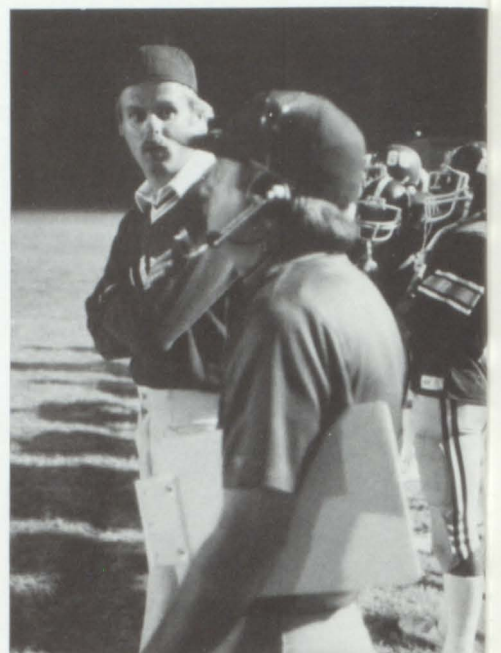
DEDICATION

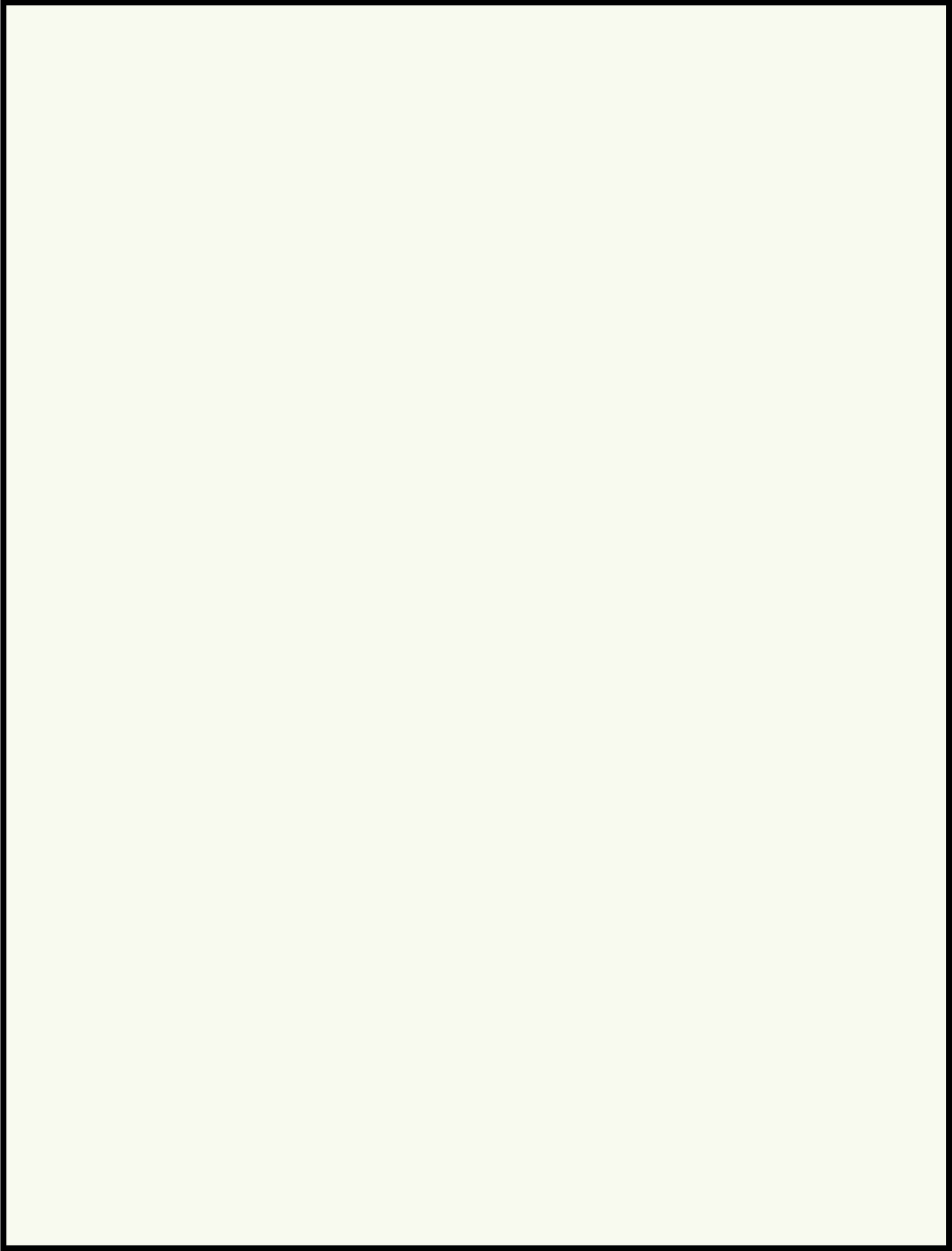
