





The SCHOOL






Campus View Points: Crowning events—high point opponents, slap-stick staging, snacking around, just listening—these, to the students at Hapeville High, are the Points of Interest.






Academic Subjects Challenge



Mathematics and Science

Traditional math gives way to the new math only in the aspect of language. A continuing cycle of new and better methods aids the student in his understanding of computation. After obtaining a basis from Algebra, the student progresses in his knowledge of math to more specialized courses in Geometry and Trigonometry.

Science requires a basic knowledge of man, his development, and his surroundings. The observation and classification of facts and the experimentation to discover new facts instills in a student a desire for this knowledge.




























