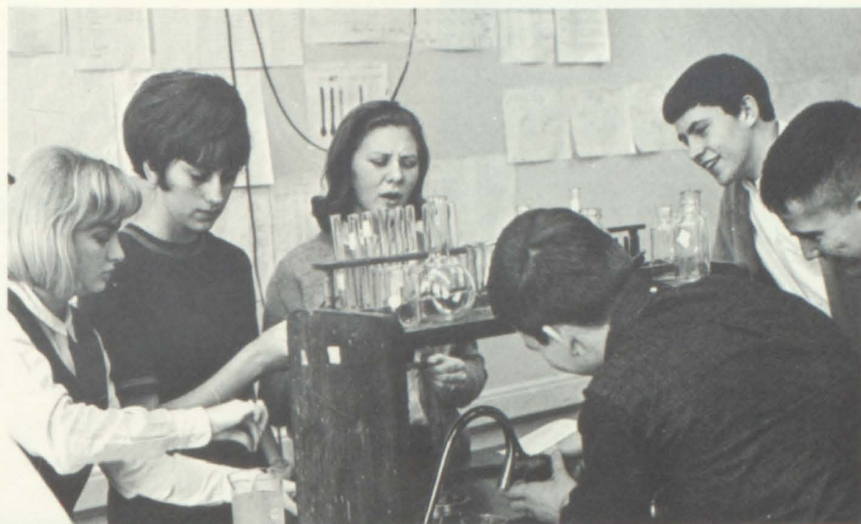


History

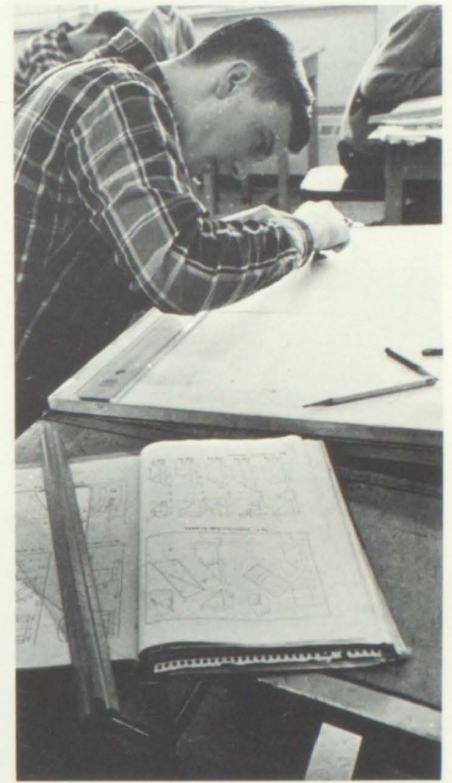

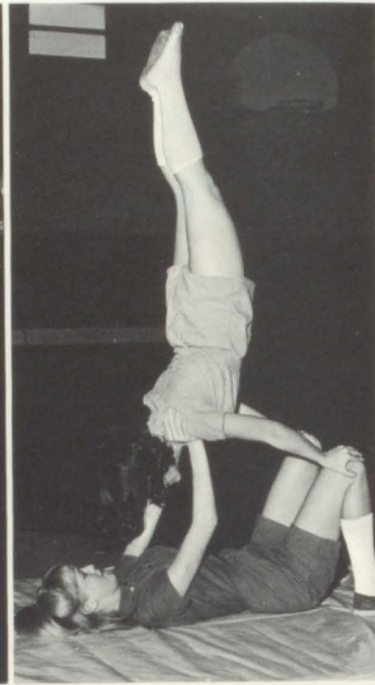

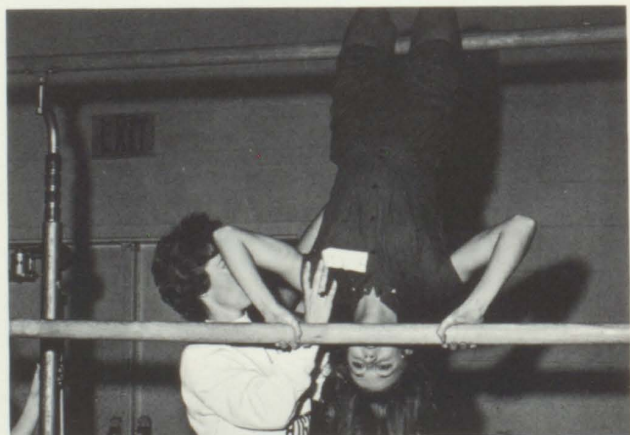

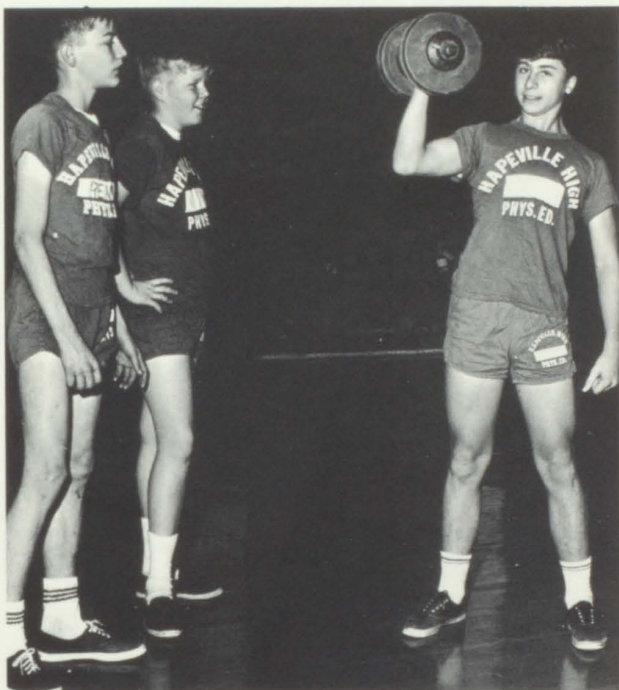

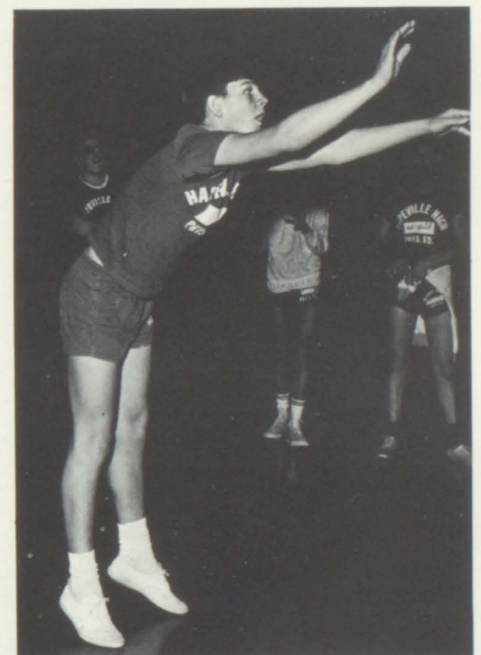

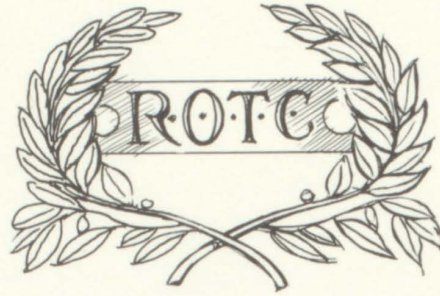

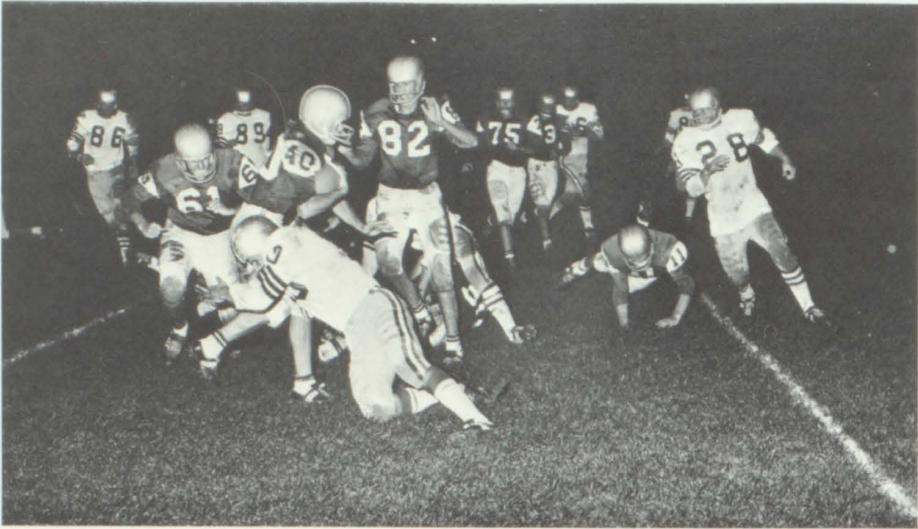

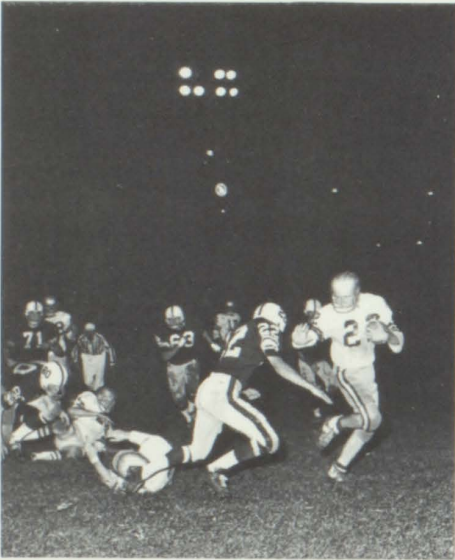

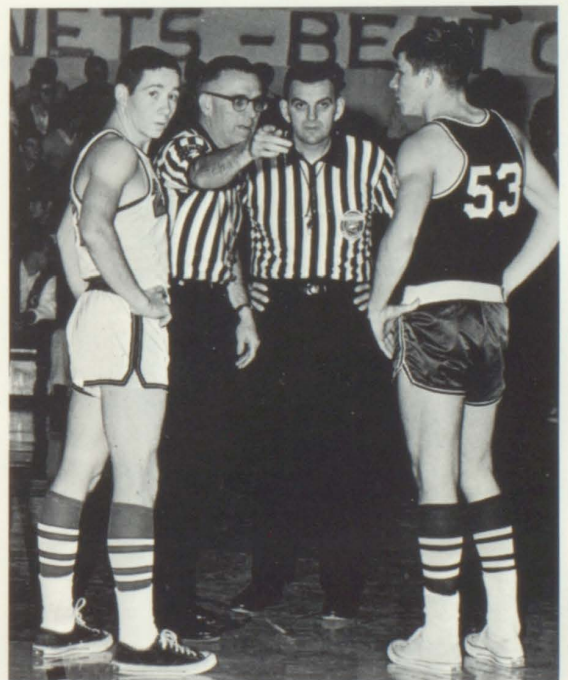

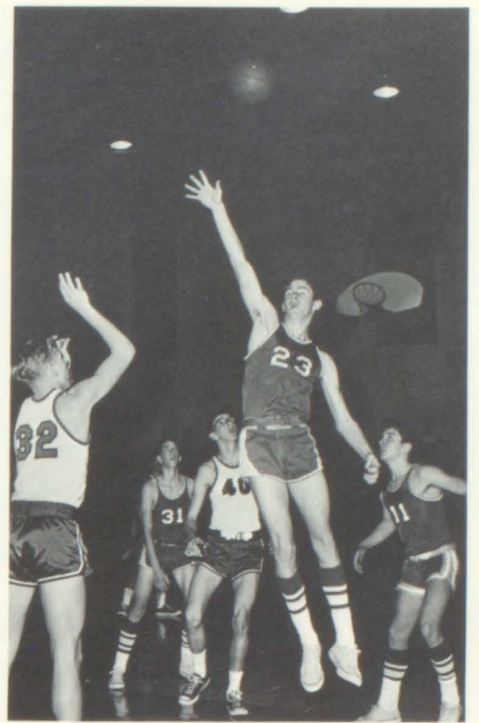

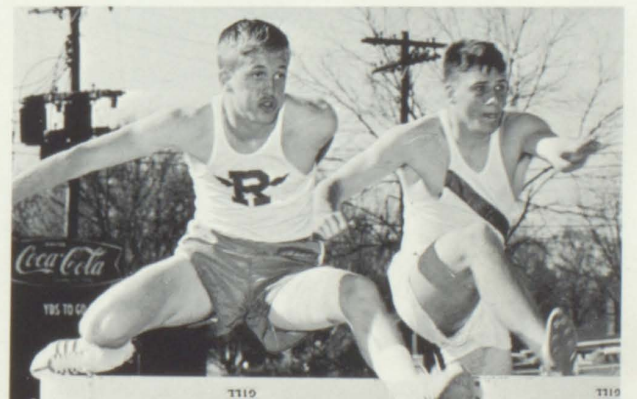

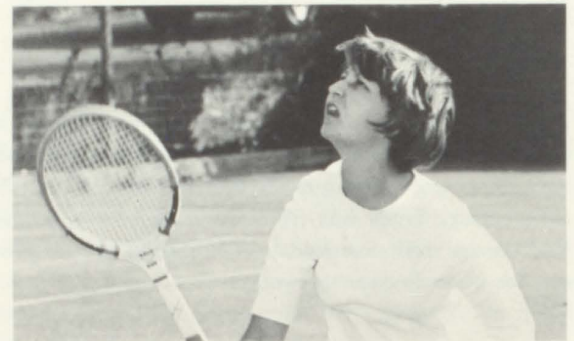

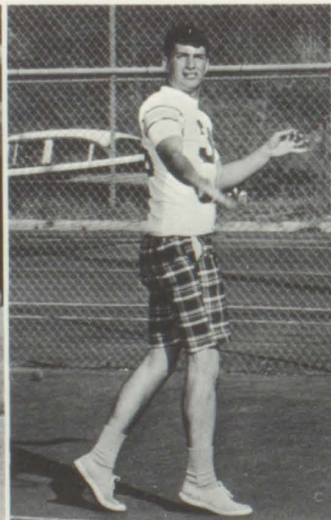

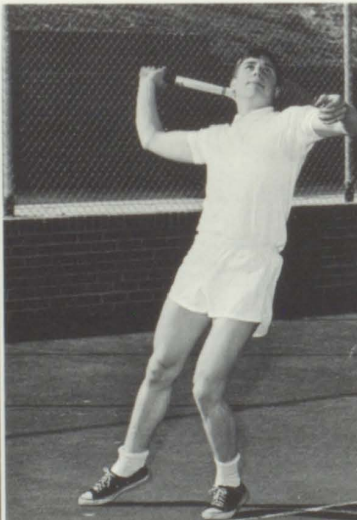

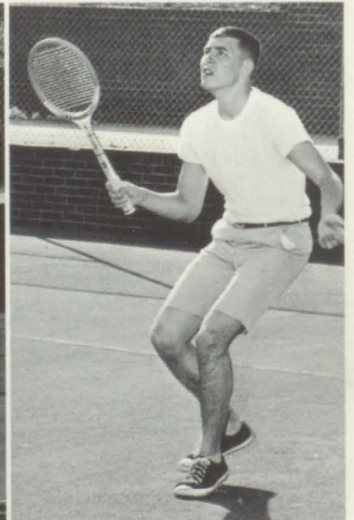

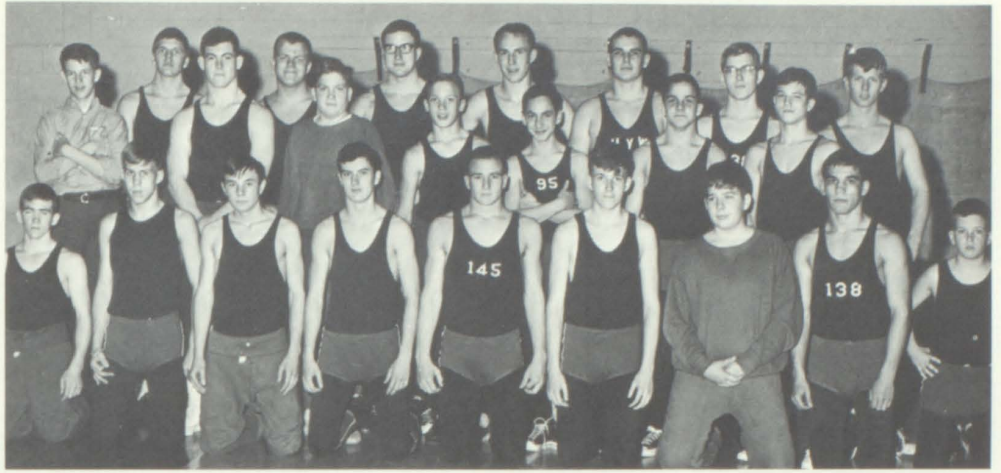

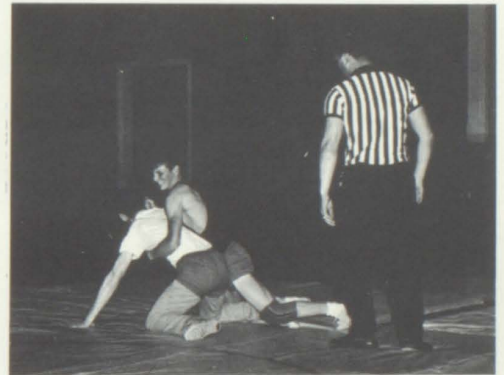
