The year . . . 1978. It was going to be and then it happened . . . and now it was. How can we recapture what has already sped past?

Musing, the lens of the mind's unconscious eye becomes clouded. Fog rolls in around the edges of the memories.

Isolating one event blends it into another . . . and another . . . and yet another. What will bring each memory back into focus?





The year . . . 1978. New York blacked out for a day, while Anita Bryant, basking in Florida's sunshine, protested the rights of the dormant political volcano, the gay community. However, the sun failed to shine on Bert Lance, President Carter's Federal Budget Director who resigned after his personal finances were attacked by politicians and press alike. The frenzy of the press was not limited to political reporting. Another example of press hysteria was Son of Sam, the most publicized criminal of the year, a ruthless and rancorous compulsive killer.

The press reported just a spot of news about His Royal Highness Prince Charles, Prince of Wales, who paid Atlanta a visit and attended a performance of Gladys Knight and the Pips at the historic Fox Theater. Also on the sovereign scene, Charles' sister, Princess Ann, provided for a royal baby, and Monaco's royalty, Princess Caroline, prepared for a wedding.

As much a part of life as birth and marriage . . . death claimed several celebrities in 1978. "You Bet Your Life" Groucho Marx, who brought so much laughter into so many lives, died. And so did Bing Crosby, who warmed every winter of our childhood with "I'm Dreaming of a White Christmas." And killed in a plane crash in Mississippi were three members of the well-loved band, Lynyrd Skynyrd. But the most shocking death of the year was that of the King of Rock and Roll, Elvis Presley.

A sampling of other news morsels show that the Food and Drug Administration threatened to take saccharin off the market; and as Americans were bombarded with advice concerning what to eat from doctor, television, and government, Uganda's abominable Idi Amin admitted to eating people.

In a local overview, Maynard Jackson was re-elected and remarried. His old antagonist Lester Maddox gave up antagonizing in favor of singing, and later survived a heart attack.

Of technological interest, 1978 was the 20th anniversary of the Russian Sputnick of considerable importance since it was the spark which ignited the American space program. Other fly-able technology included the Space Shuttle, making its debut, and the Concorde jet, stirring up controversy. And adding to the controversy were the neutron bomb, the proliferation of atomic energy plants, and the swelling Energy Crisis.


But 1978 was comprised of more than just serious events.

In the sports headlines the famous soccer player Pele retired, moving out of the spotlight, while the famous tennis player, Dr. Renee Richards moved into it (for mostly non-sports reasons). And for sports reasons, namely for winning the U.S. Open in tennis, Chris Evert was the spotlight figure in women's sports.

1978 witnessed several noteworthy victories, both probable and improbable. The Falcons played strongly despite the fact that Steve Bartkowski was out, having suffered a serious knee injury and a divorce. And Atlanta's own Ted Turner, "Captain Outrageous," successfully defended the America's Cup. Even the Atlanta Braves won a commendable game or two.

Seattle Slew reigned, winning the Triple Crown. The Yankees won the World Series in a spectacularly showy last game as Reggie Jackson hit three home runs, a feat accomplished before only by Babe Ruth. Muhammed Ali continued to proclaim himself "The Greatest" although he showed signs of age in a few unimpressive matches. Tom Watson proved that he possessed golf's hottest putter by mastering Jack Nicklaus in Augusta,





In 1978 the camera certainly picked up on Farrah Fawcett, an ex-Charlie's angel who appeared with millions of guys on their T-shirts, and in their bedrooms in multi-million selling posters. To the delight of millions of viewers, Cheryl Ladd was the replacement angel.

While some of us were watching "Charlie's Angels," others of us preferred to tune in to "Fernwood 2-Night," a cooky, mock-talk show, or "Soap," a shockingly candid serial. "Washington Behind Closed Doors" created a small sensation.

However, the most talked about television entertainment consistently remained "Saturday Night Live" and never failed to offer amusing dialogue, music, and a variety of comic characters from Baba Wawa to the coneheads.



One of the most spectacular entertainment events of the year hit Atlanta when Heart, The Atlanta Rhythm Section, Bob Seger, and others boogied away on Grant Field and produced the Dog Day Rock Fest. Governor Busbee proclaimed an Atlanta Rhythm Section Day.

Bad Company put on a show, and lots of people were flying high with the Eagles. Atlanta also saw Stevie "Guitar" Miller begin his 1978 tour in a flash of green laser beams. Crosby, Stills, and Nash appeared less Young. Peter Frampton was still "Live" as ever playing "I'm in You." Emerson, Lake, and Palmer did positively "Work."




Among albums to hit the top, Fleetwood Mac's RUMOURS shone out. J.T. was pretty handy.

A combination of LITTLE QUEEN by Heart, ANYTIME ANYWHERE by Rita Coolidge, and the hit single "Nobody Does It Better" by Carly Simon boosted female rock vocalists back into popularity. Ted Nugent got CAT SCRATCH FEVER, and Dave Mason LET IT FLOW, while Dan Fogelberg was off in the NETHERLANDS writing "songs that the darkness composes to worship the light."

On the radio, the competition between the local stations Z-93, 94-Q, and 96-Rock was evident as each appeared on belt buckles, bumper stickers, and billboards.

James Bond made a daring return in THE SPY WHO LOVED ME. A BRIDGE TOO FAR might have been an hour too long, but it attracted many movie goers. STAR WARS, a science-fiction fairy tale entailing the age old theme of good versus evil, was the most sensational box office knock-out. But, Diane Keaton, star of LOOKING FOR MR. GOODBAR and Woody Allen's witty ANNIE HALL was a pretty big knock-out herself.


1978 was characterized by hundreds of fads and fancies. Among them ladies' hair combs and decorative flowers made a well-timed comeback from the thirties. And from the fifties, dock sider moccasins and clutch purses returned. Innovations included western style boots and leg warmers, rainbow sandals and bracelets, khaki fatigues, gym shorts, cowl neck shirts, and cable knit sweaters.

Guys were wearing argyle socks and oxford shirts, and they finally decided to shed their inhibitions (and their clothes) and wear racing suits, a modest way of saying "bikinis".




For commuting, Mopeds (little bicycle-like, peddle-able motorcycles) became increasingly more dangerous and popular as did skateboards.

Edible fads included Bubble Yum, frozen yogurt . . . which also answered to the name of Fro Yo or Frogurt . . . and variations on the tune of chocolate chip cookies from the Factory. Noble Roman's substituted satisfactorily for Steverino's and the now extinct Jocko's as a hang-out.

Another quirk in the personality of 1978 was a strange and fascinating substance, sold at every retailer's cash register-Green Slime. It . . . oozed . . . all over . . . the year . . . 1978.
