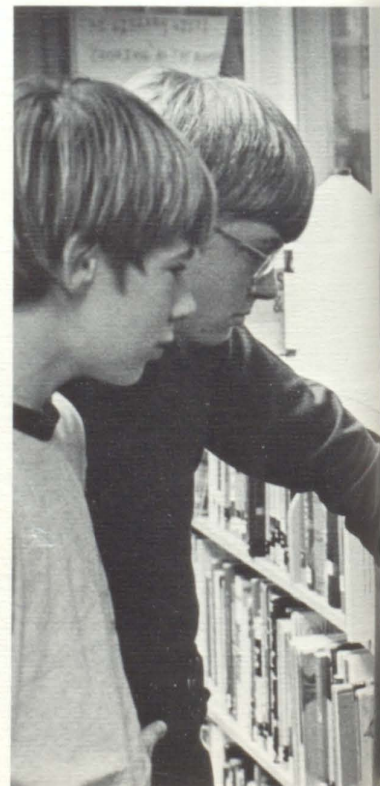




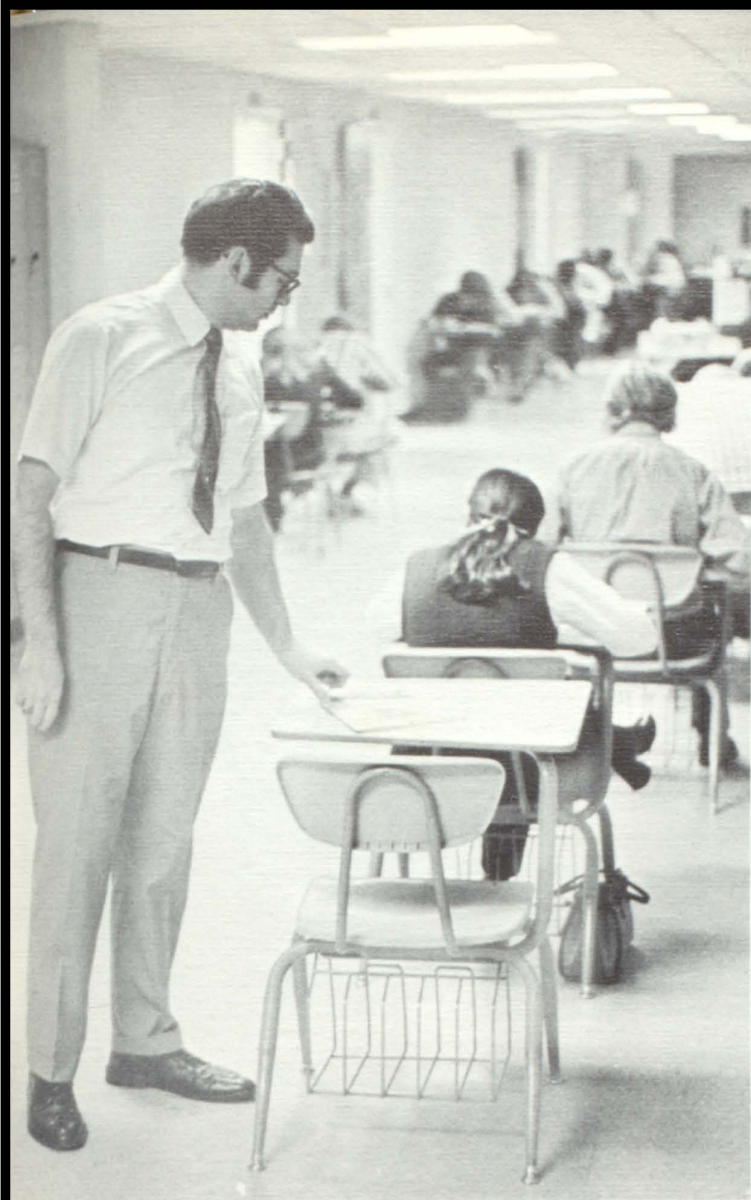


## LIBRARIANS AND COUNSELORS

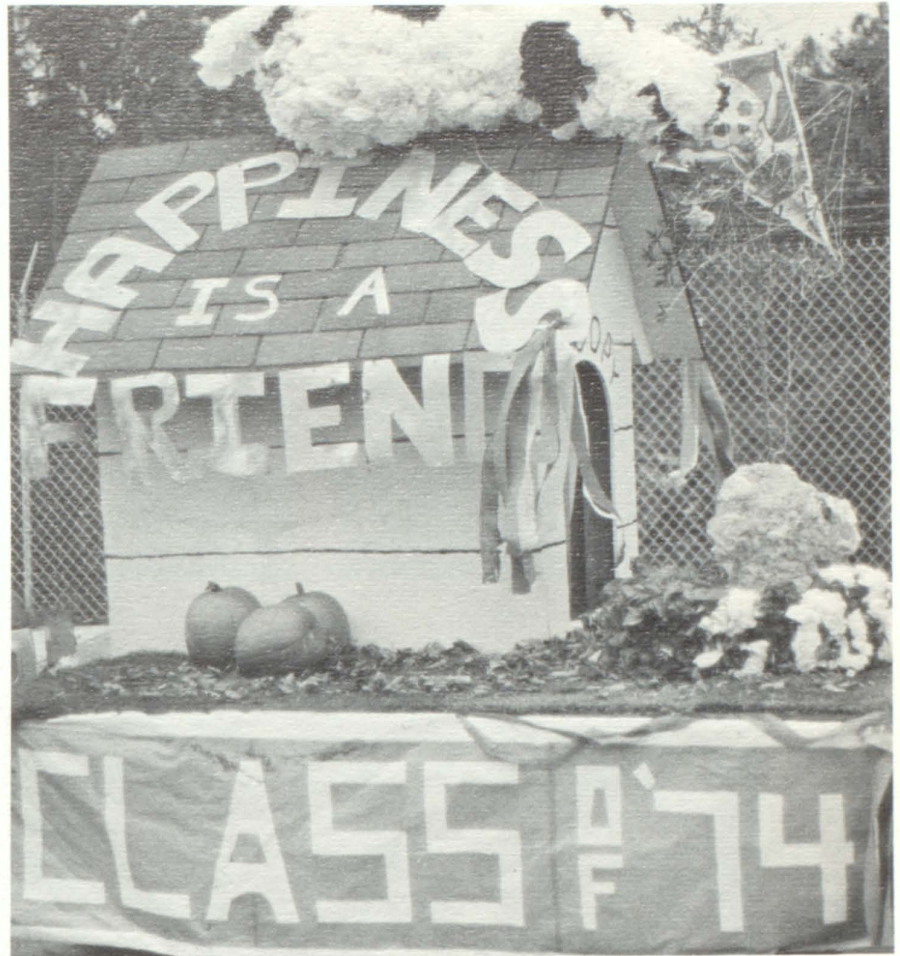




# HOMECOMING 1972







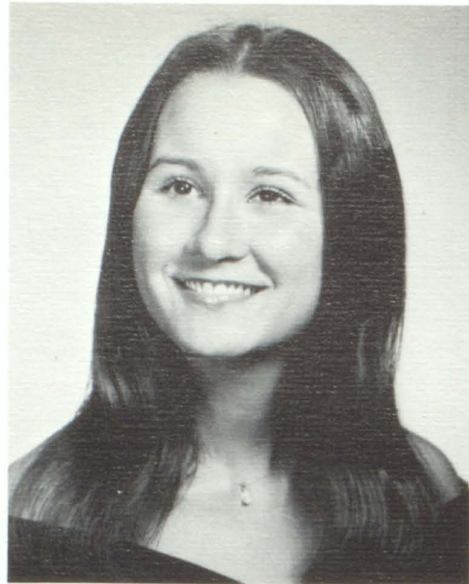

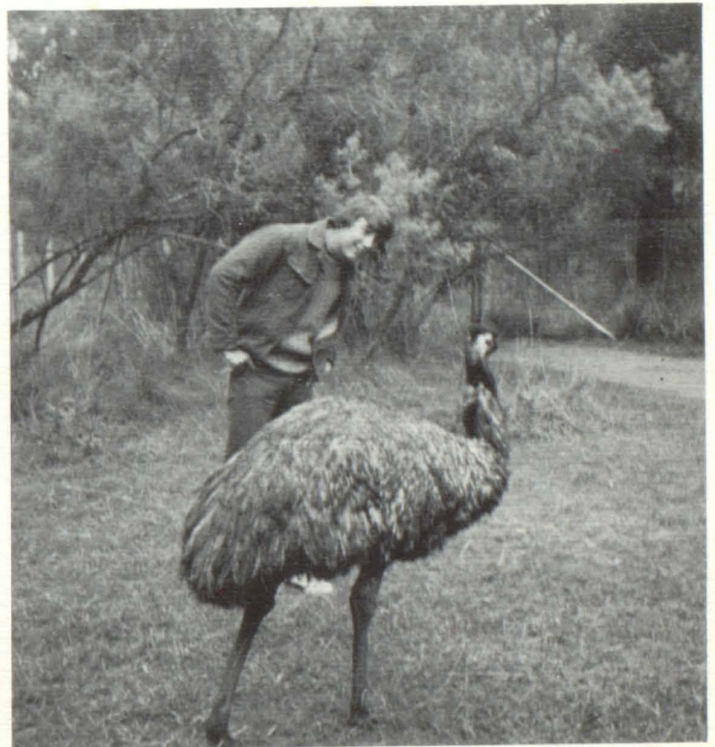
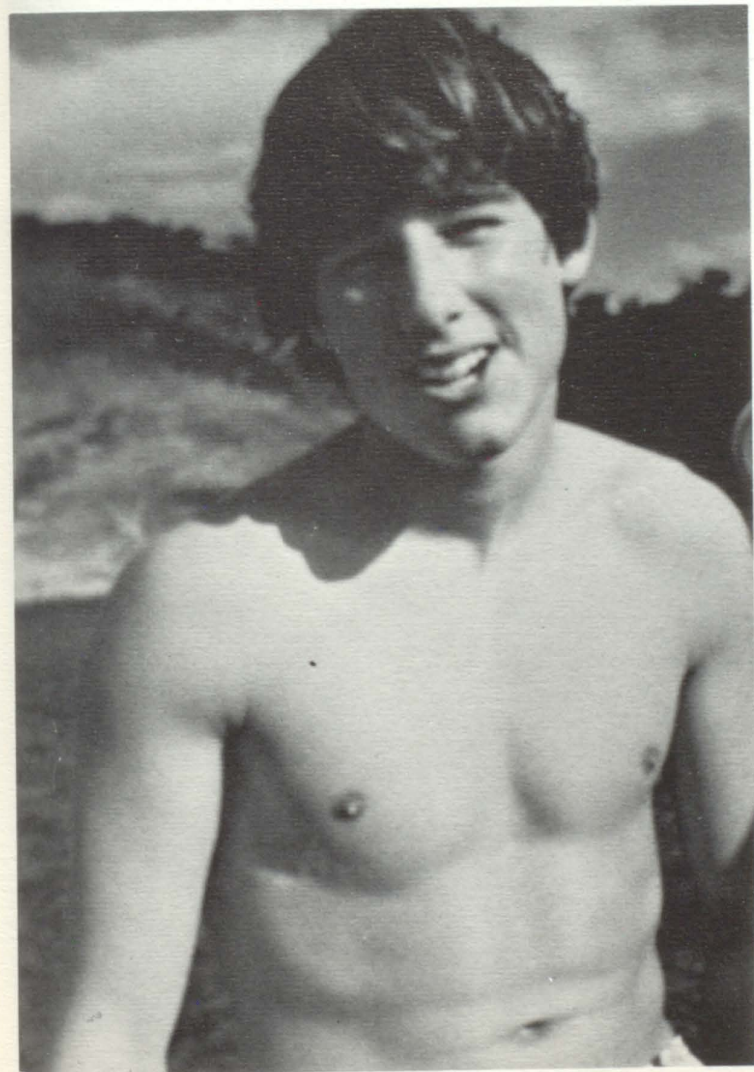
## KANGAROOS, KOALAS AND KILTON

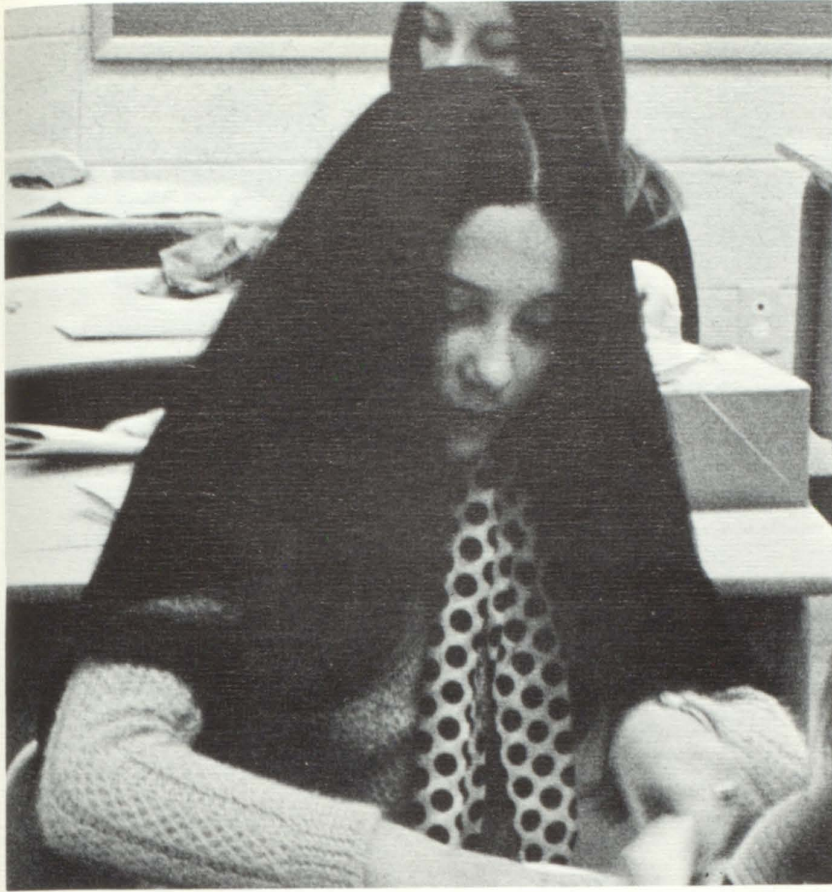
## PACAS, PINOLES AND PILAR

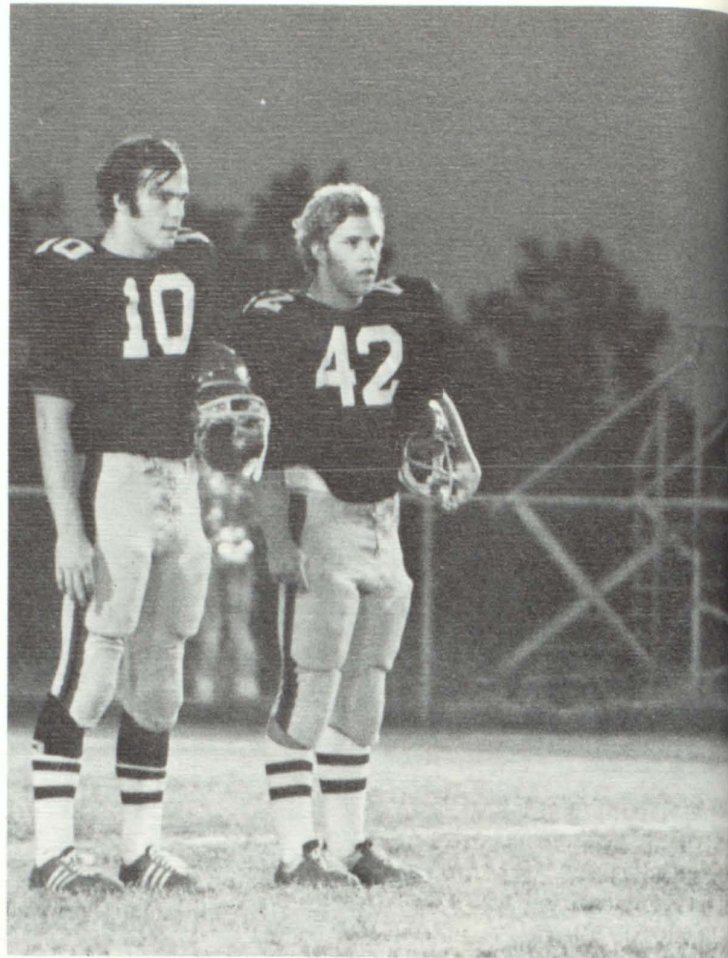




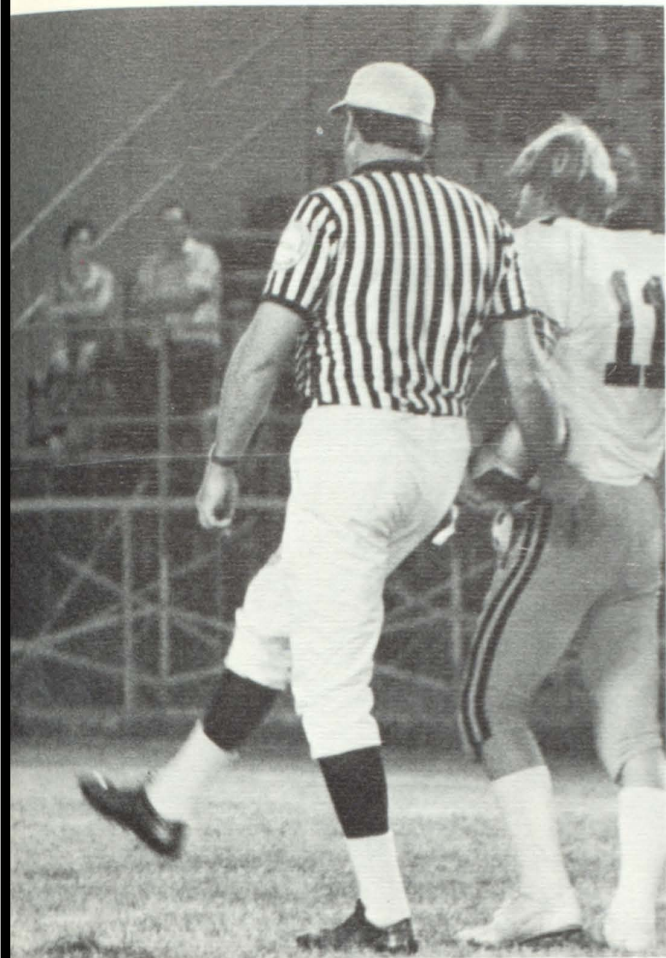


## VARSITY FOOTBALL

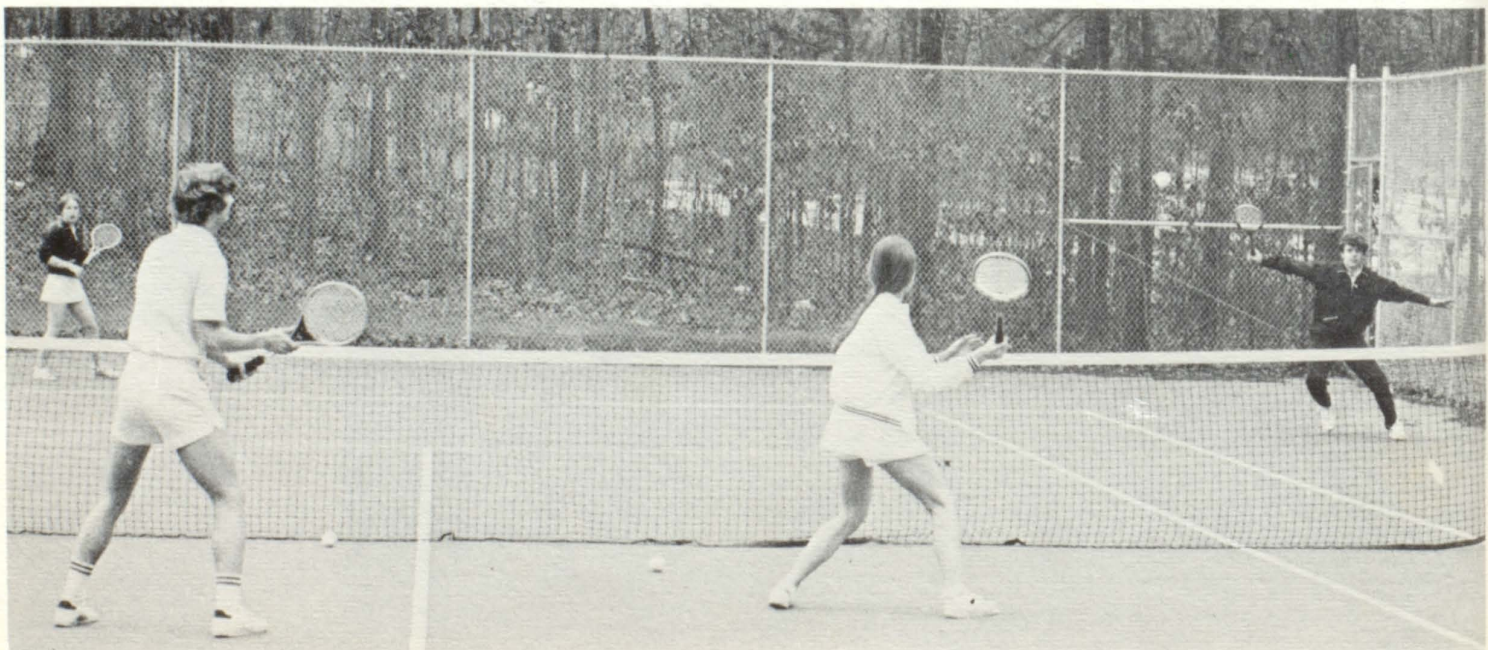




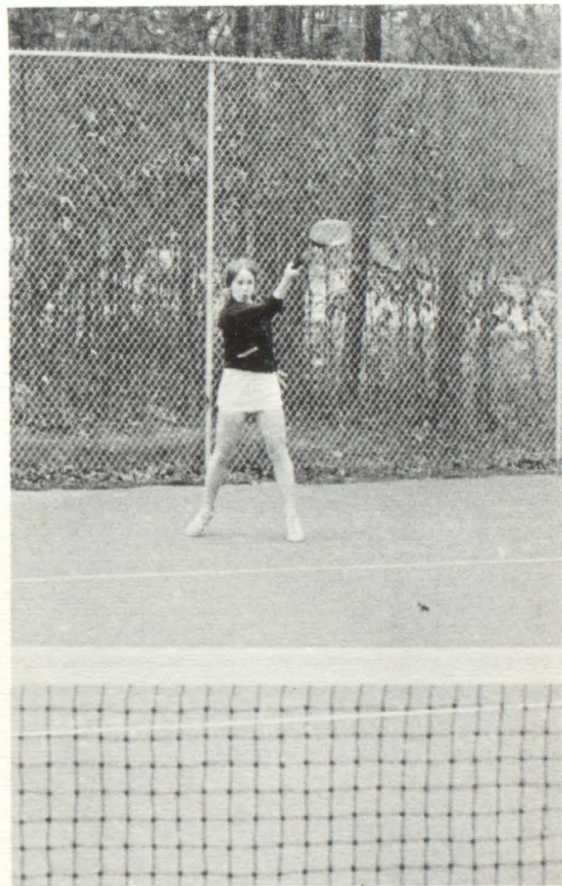
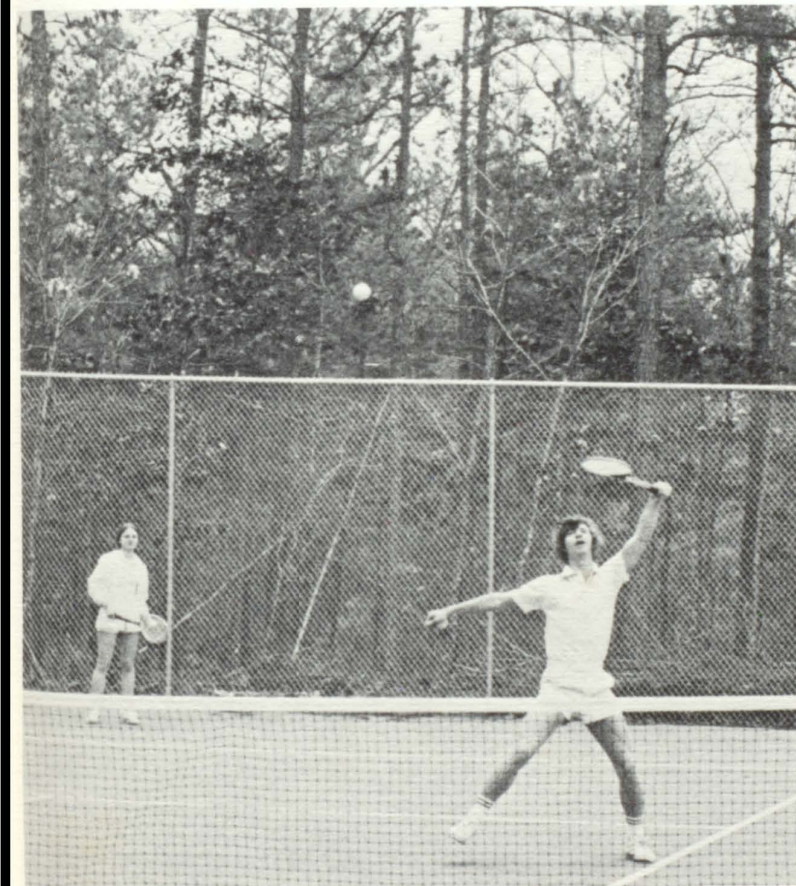
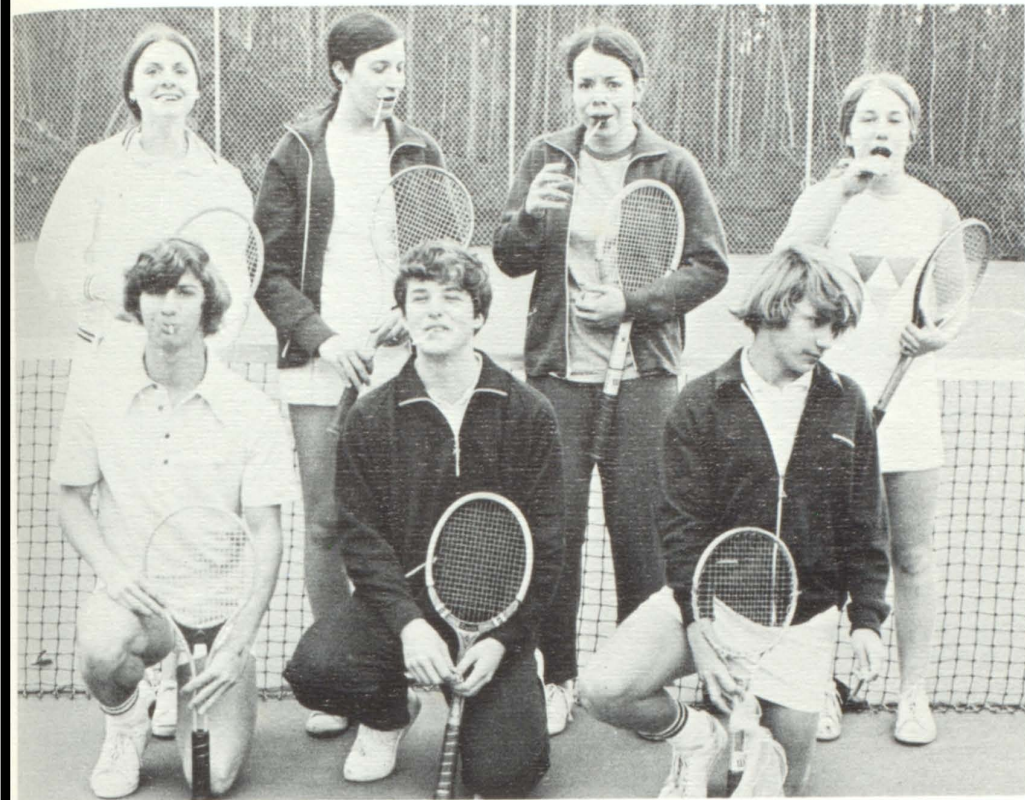


# TENNIS

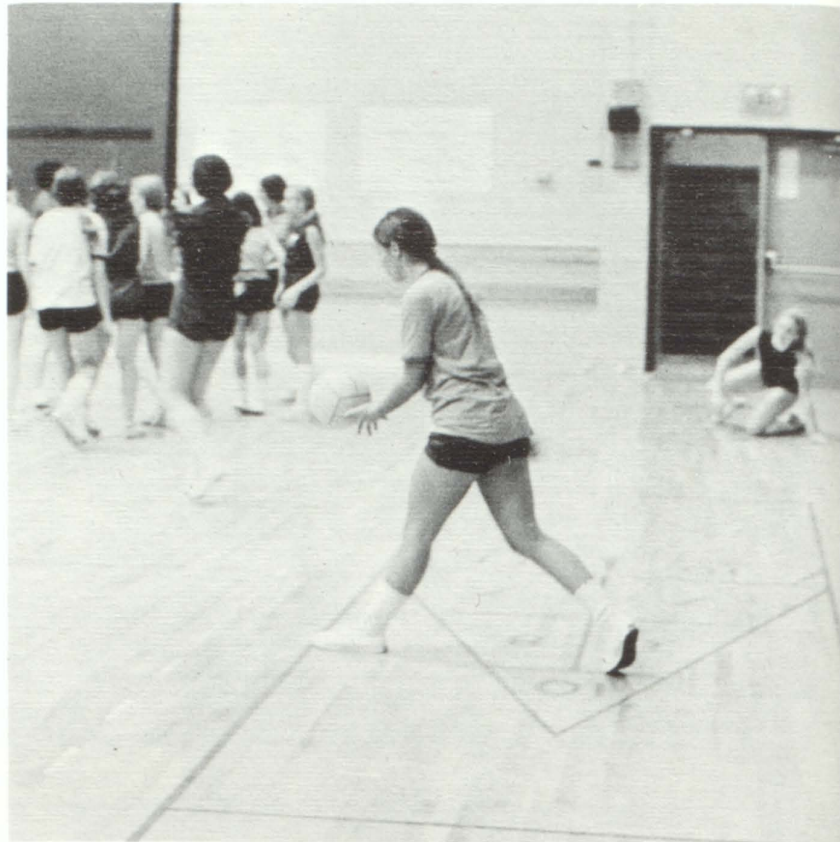




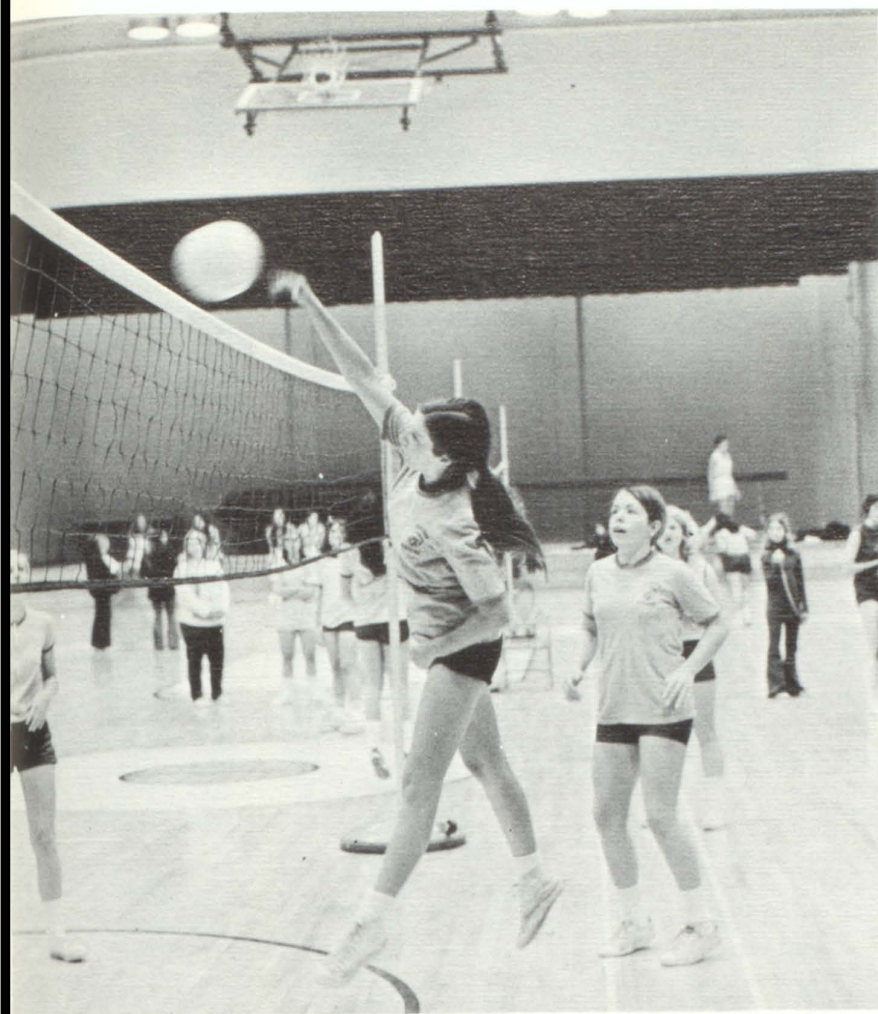


# GIRLS INTRAMURALS

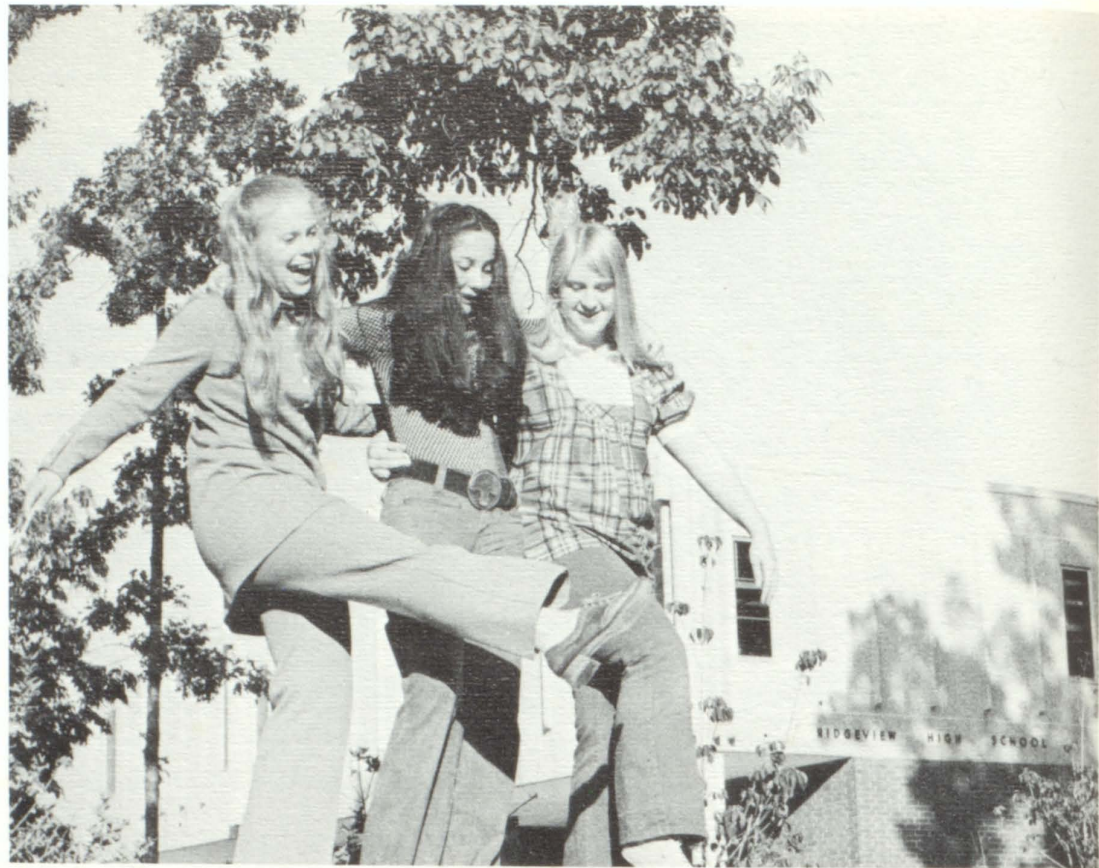




## A.F.S.

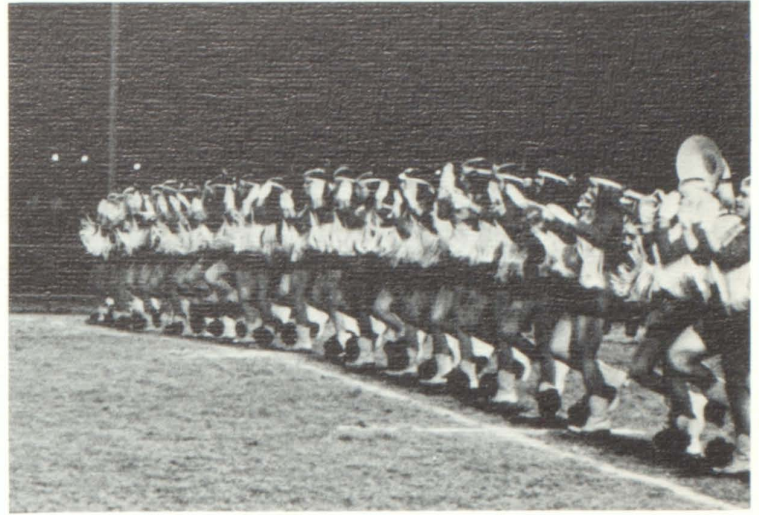


## KACHINA DOLLS

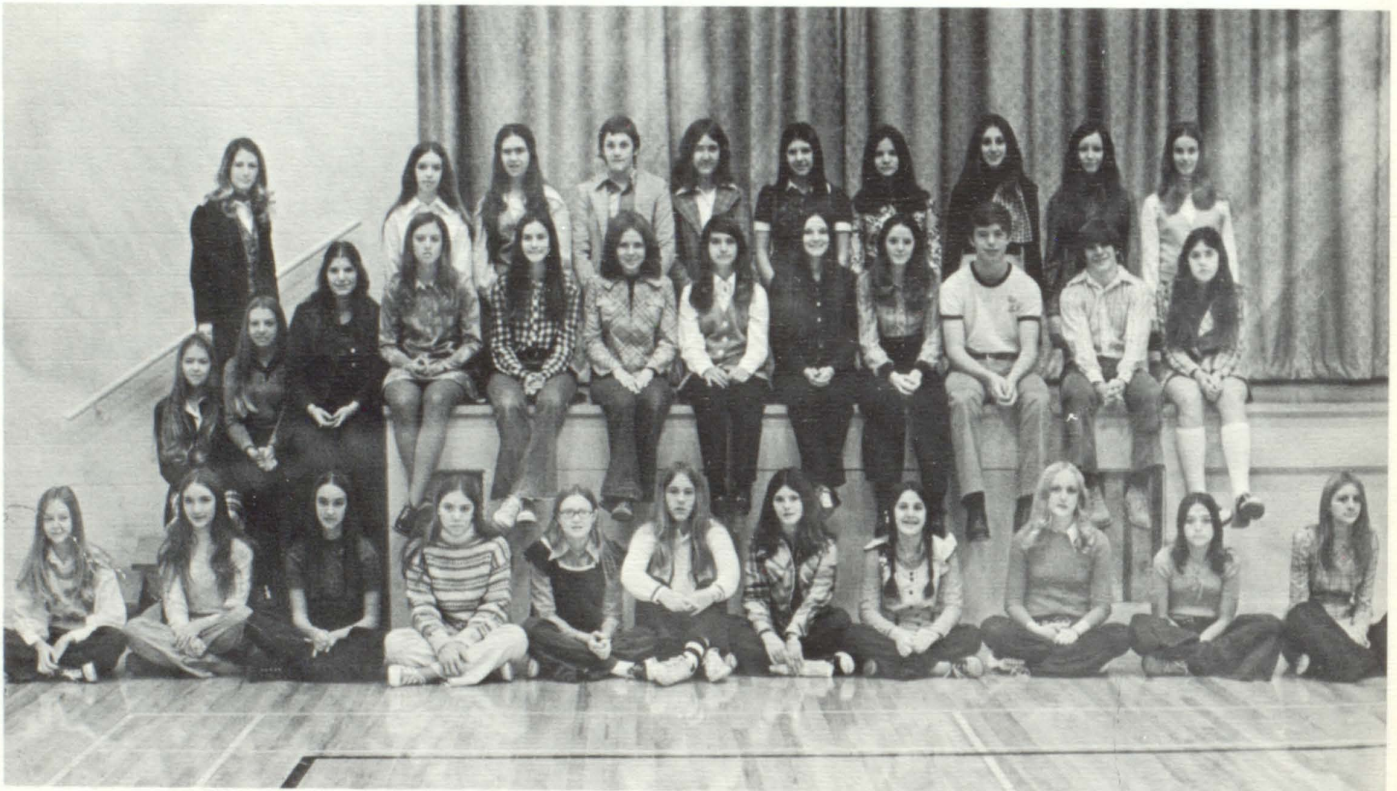

"That perfume stinks!"

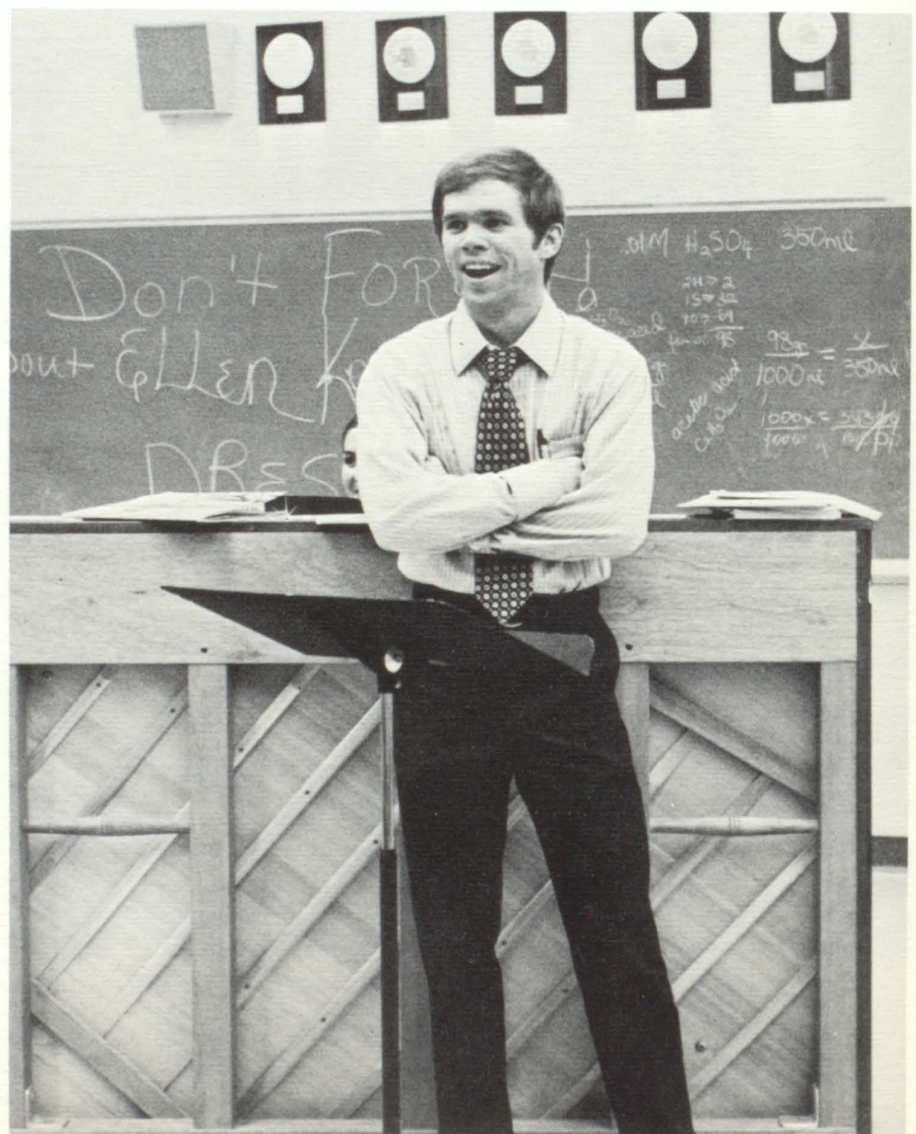
"All right, who's gonna work the concession stand?"
