
As we begin our five years at College Park High, time seems of little consequence and the years look endless upon viewing our time of leaving . . .




thoughts as we look back on the years past—somehow we wish that they might be relived. The feeling is the same for each class, each individual student.








ahead of us. All the days, filled with work and play, are recounted in clear-cut symbolism on our CLASS RINGS where, as tokens of our high school days, they remain forever.







Classes


As 1960 draws to a close the Class of '60 goes out into the world to take their places.
