
### A Place In Flux ...












### Eagerness For Achievement...






### Off Campus: A Maze of Activity






### McDavid And French "Keep In Touch" With Students

As school clerk, Mrs. Helen French has the duty of managing the school's money, the school's correspondence, and typing transcripts. Her desk is the general information center to all.






### Hapeville Academic Standards Stimulate Thinking








### Basic Skills Emphasized In Industrial Arts




### D. C. T. Offers Job Training.




### H. H. S. Band Represents Outstanding Unit























With a new school record of 36 points, Edward Goss posed the biggest threat against Headland. Authory Kirkland also led his team to victory with 16 points.






















