We are glad to leave it for those who come after us.

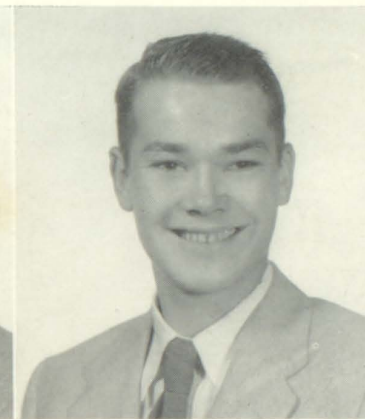

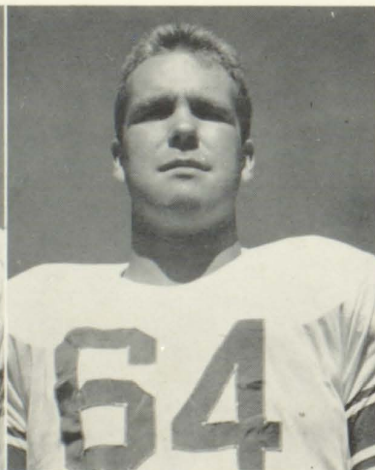

The Hornets, using subs freely in the latter stages of the game, walloped Marist 26-6. There were 14 first downs, 247 yards rushing, and 93 yards passing.



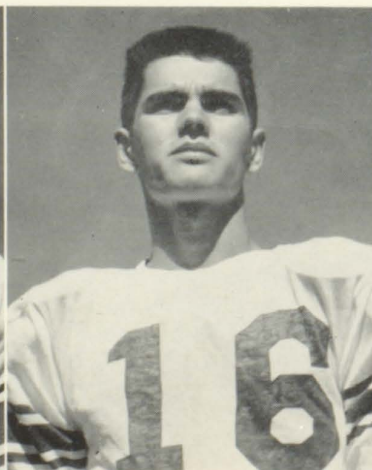

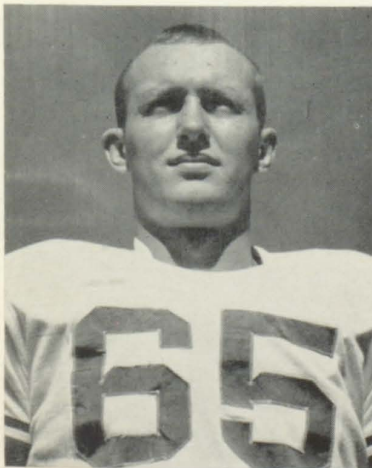

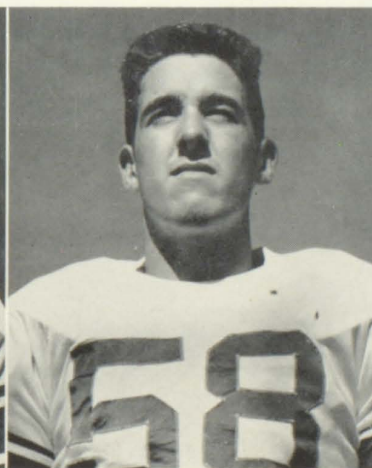

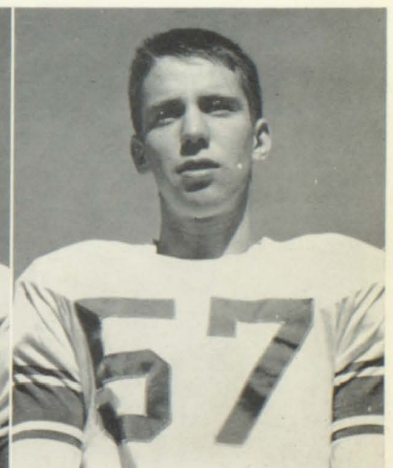

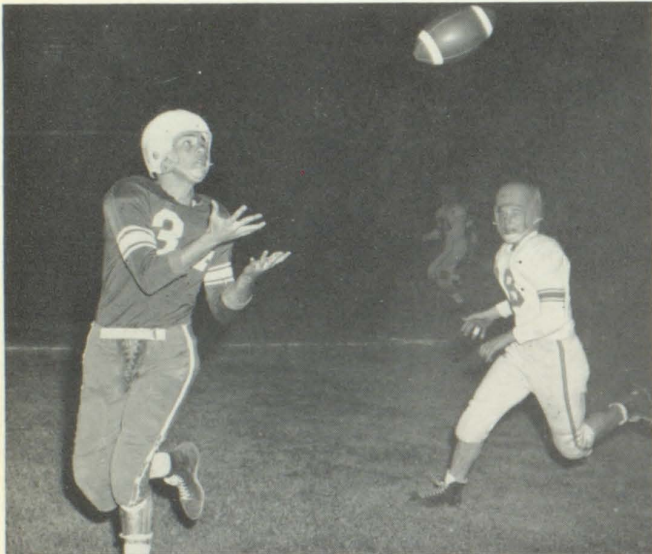

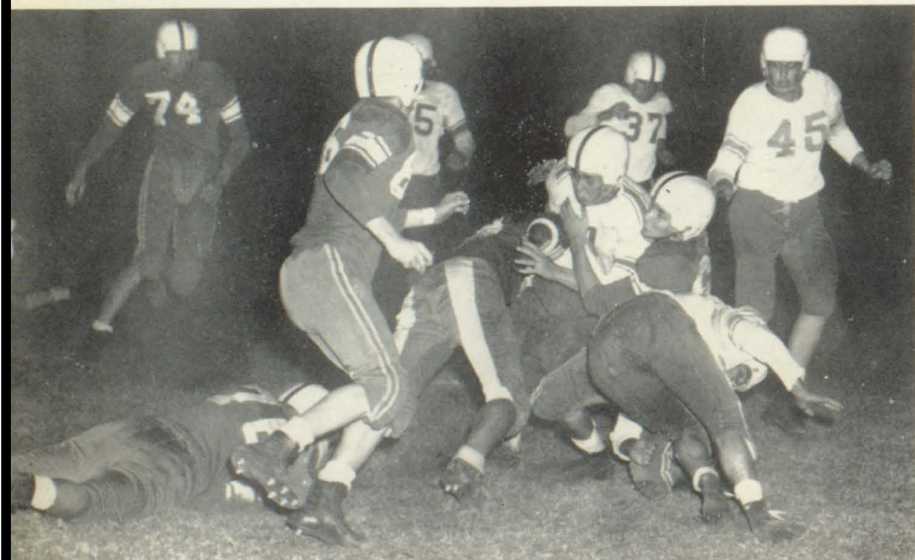

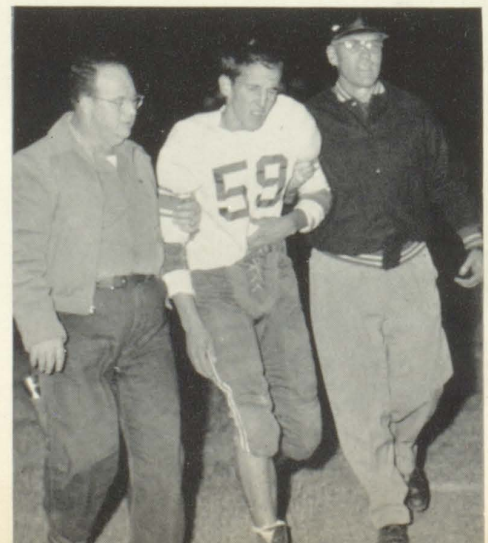

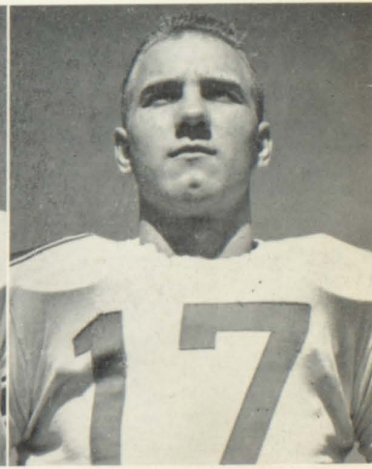
