


When the principal is absent, who is there to take his place? Mrs. Sarah McDaniel. She assumes full responsibility for the operation of the school in the absence of the principal.

INTERCLUB COUNCIL










TORCH and HATCHET





BETA CLUB




MARCHING BAND


B-TEAM









8th GRADE





INTRAMURALS




















SNOW QUEEN '74

The top event was the Christmas Dance and the crowning of Kaye Faszholz, Snow Queen, 1974.








COUNSELORS

Math becomes more specialized as students advance toward the center ring, hitting the black ring for 3 points in Algebra I, the blue ring for 5 points in Geometry, and the red ring for 7 points in Algebra II. Those students who have reasonable accuracy in archery are then taught Algebra III or Analysis, the gold ring worth 9 points. The Bull's-eye Archery school also offers Calculus for those students who continually hit bull's-eye.
