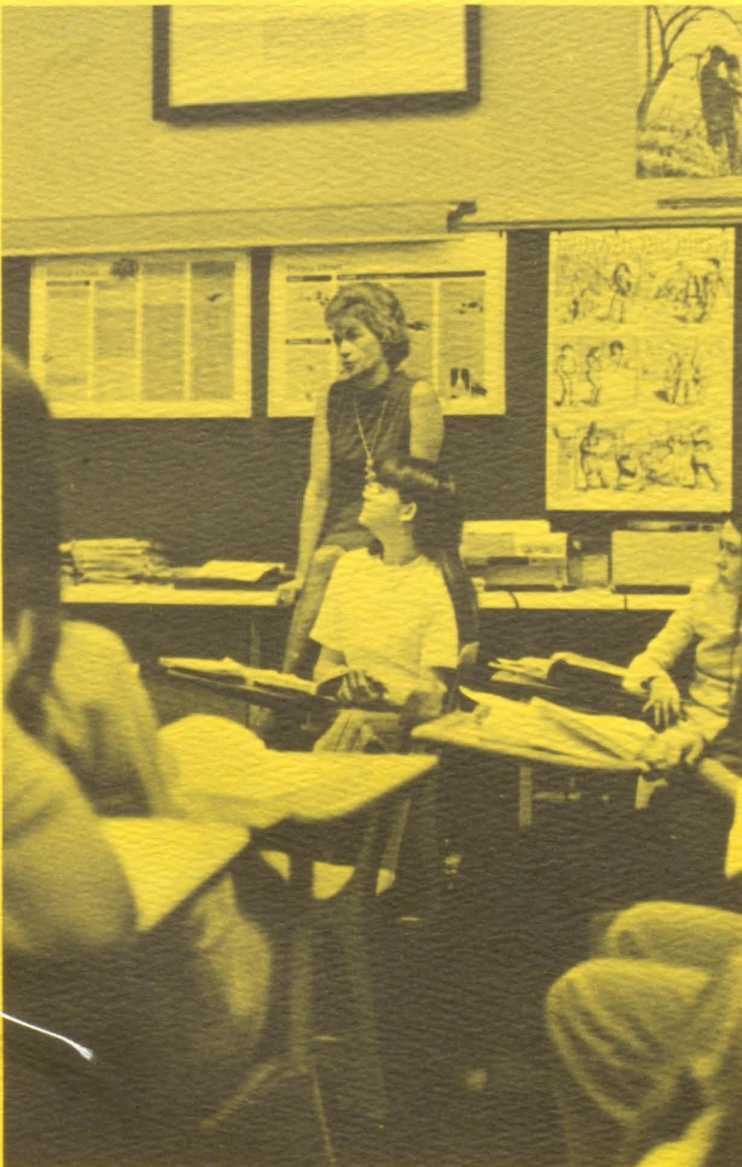

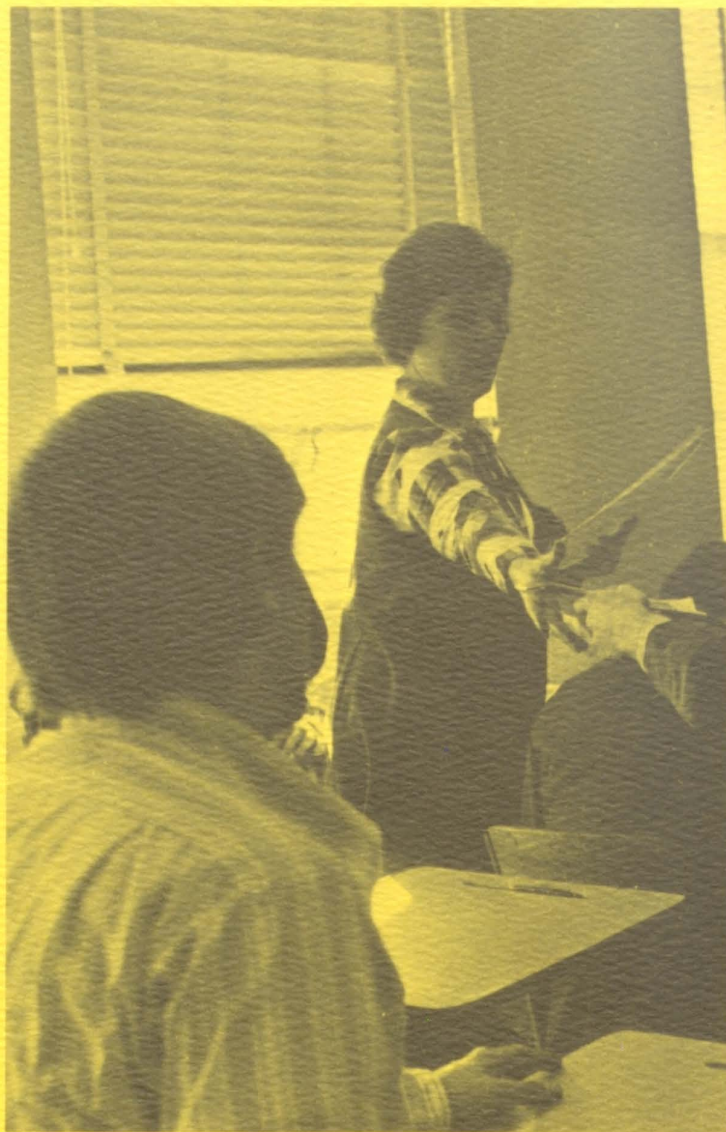


improbable questions — indelible memories

english raises almost as many questions as it answers, including such choice remarks as the eight graders' "what's so jolly about jolly rogers?" freshmen are intrigued by the wild lives of gods and goddesses. sophomores are stumped by the puritans' jargon as they ask "what's a 'wot'?" then three minutes before class starts some junior shouts "hey, was ivanhoe the horse or the prince?" exasperated seniors secretly wonder why, among other things, it is so crucial to understand the difference between metonymy and metaphor.

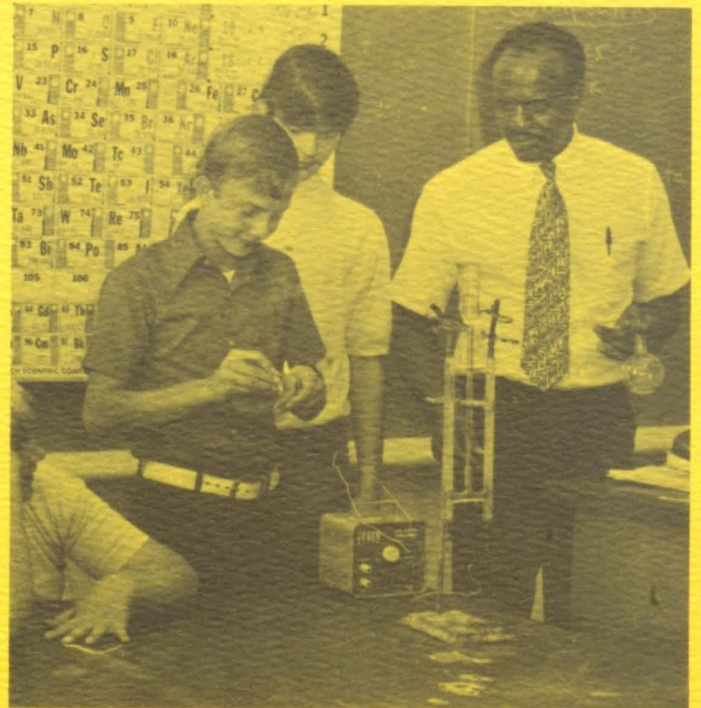
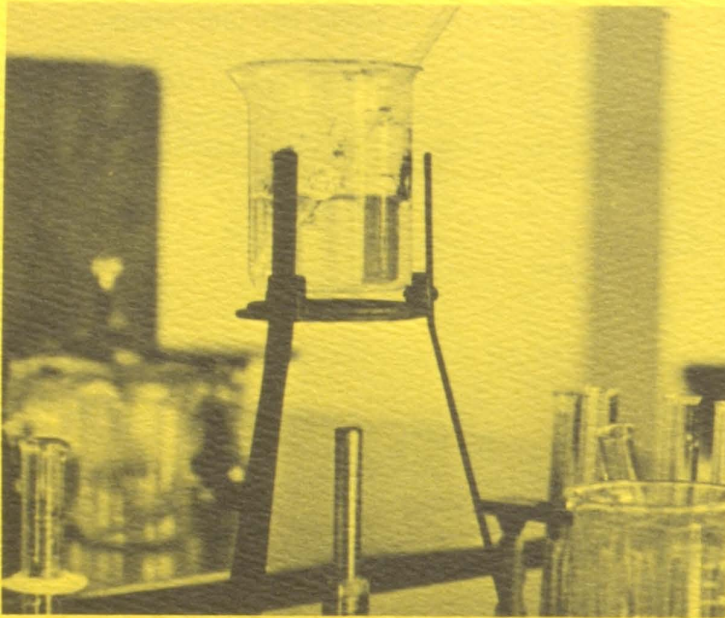

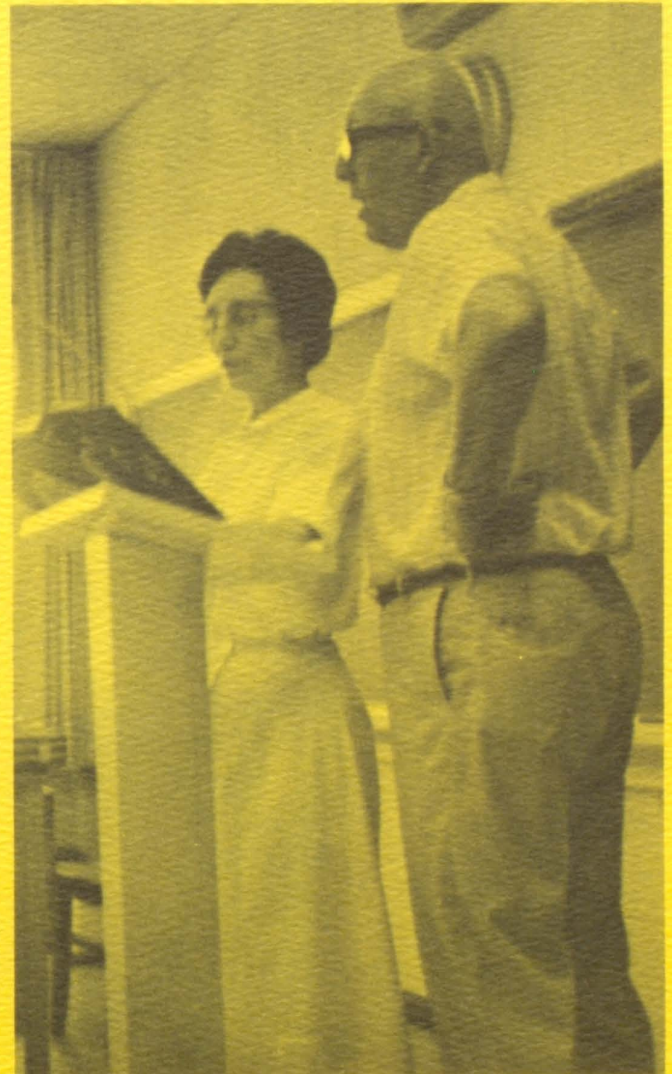

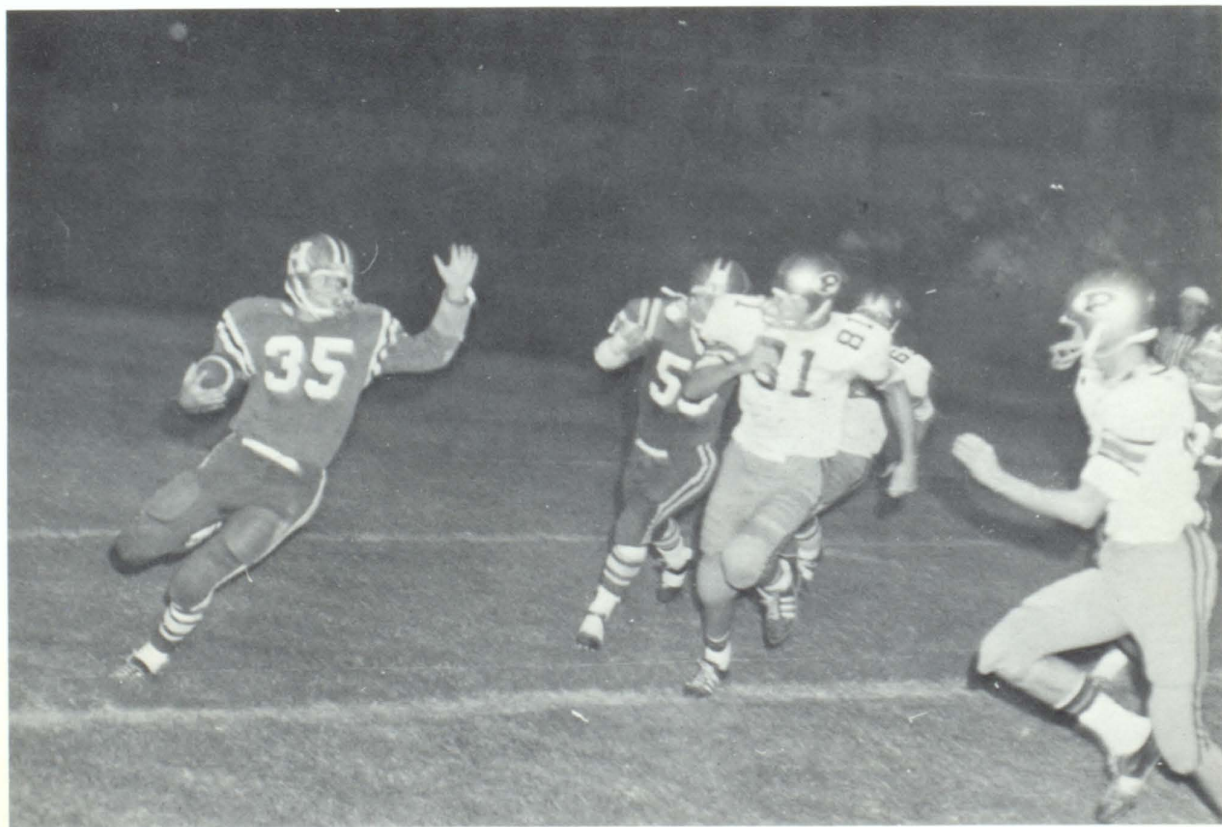
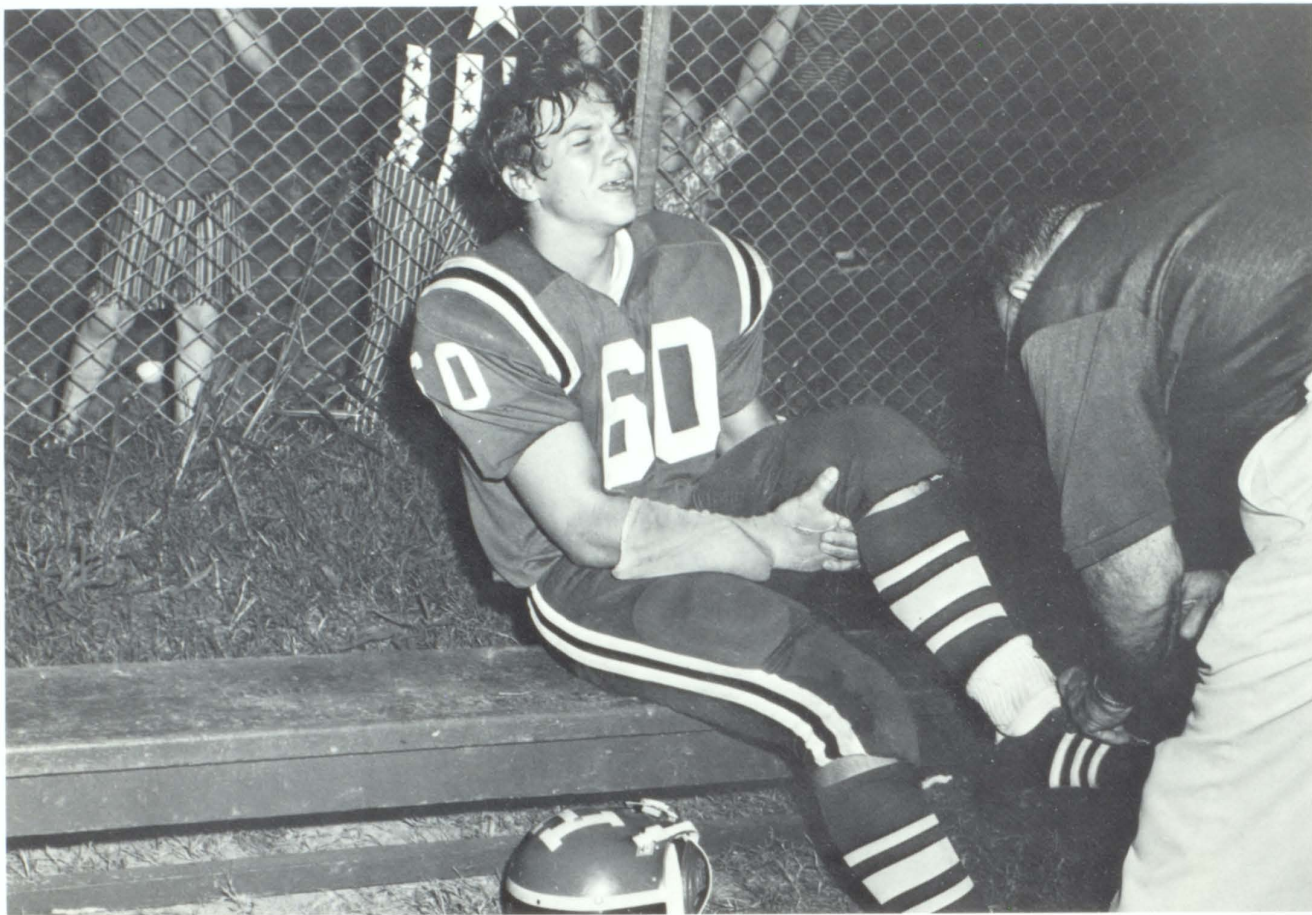


defense shines in hornet eleven

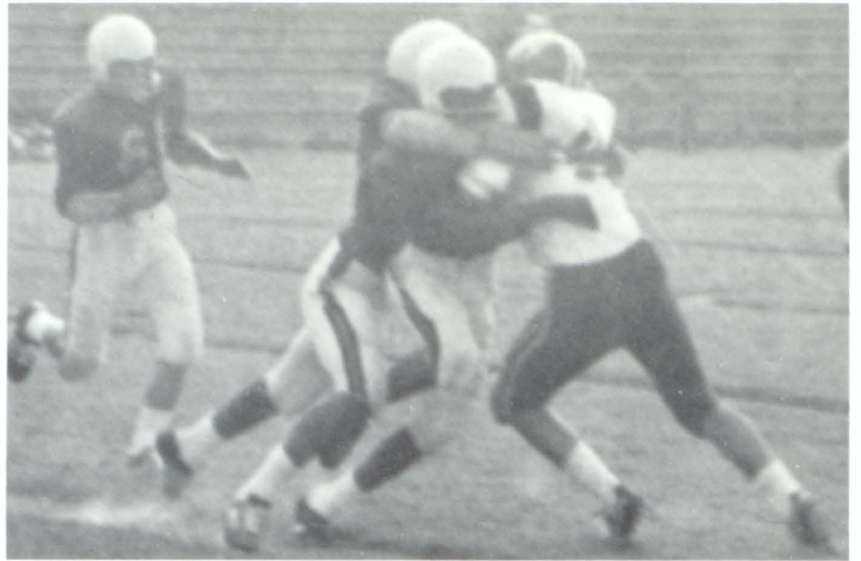

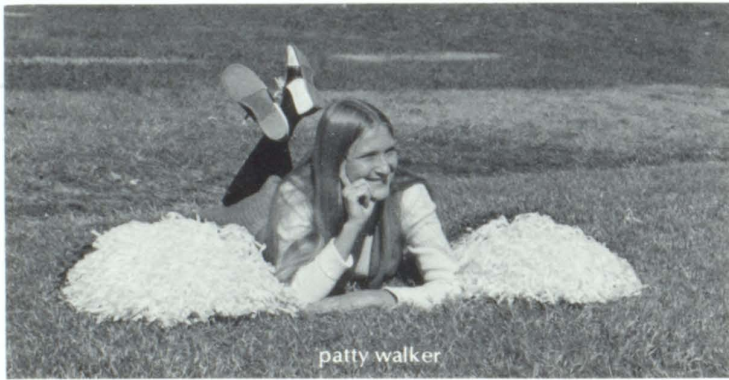

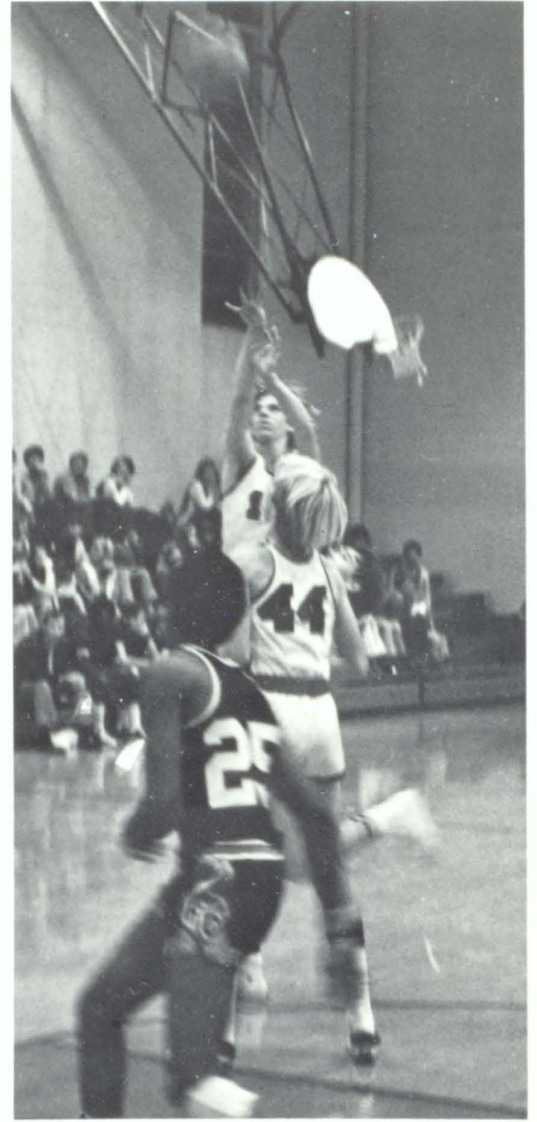
varsity boys go aggressive

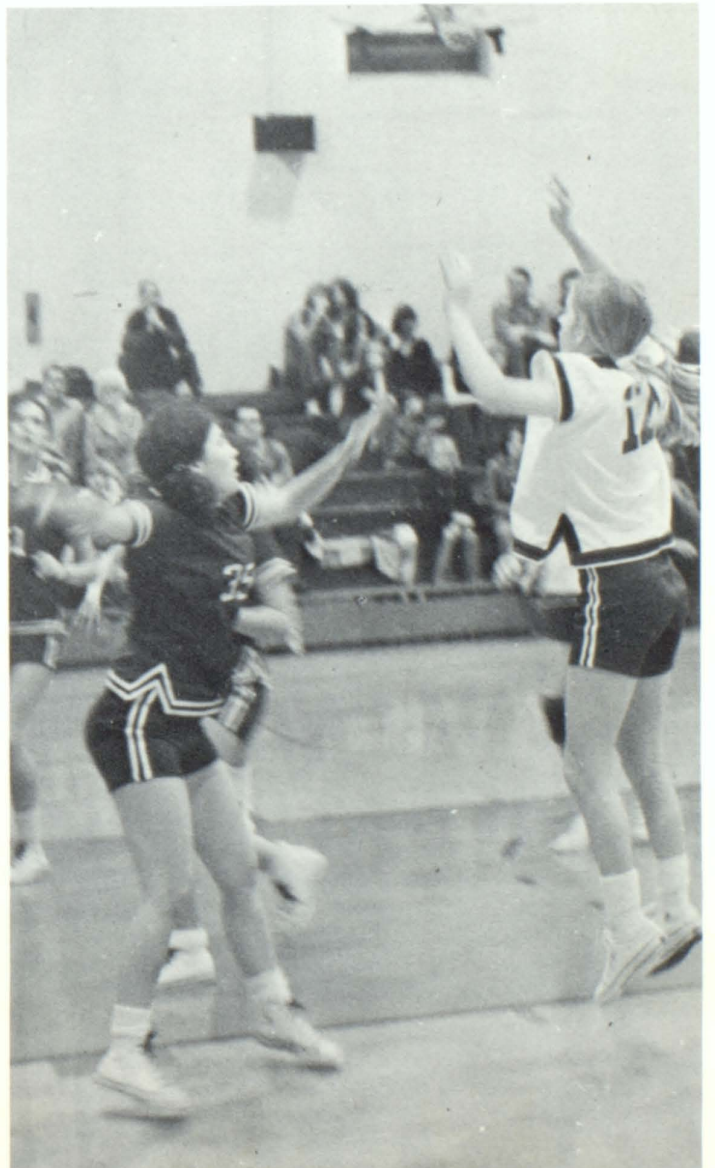


new coach, squad learn together.

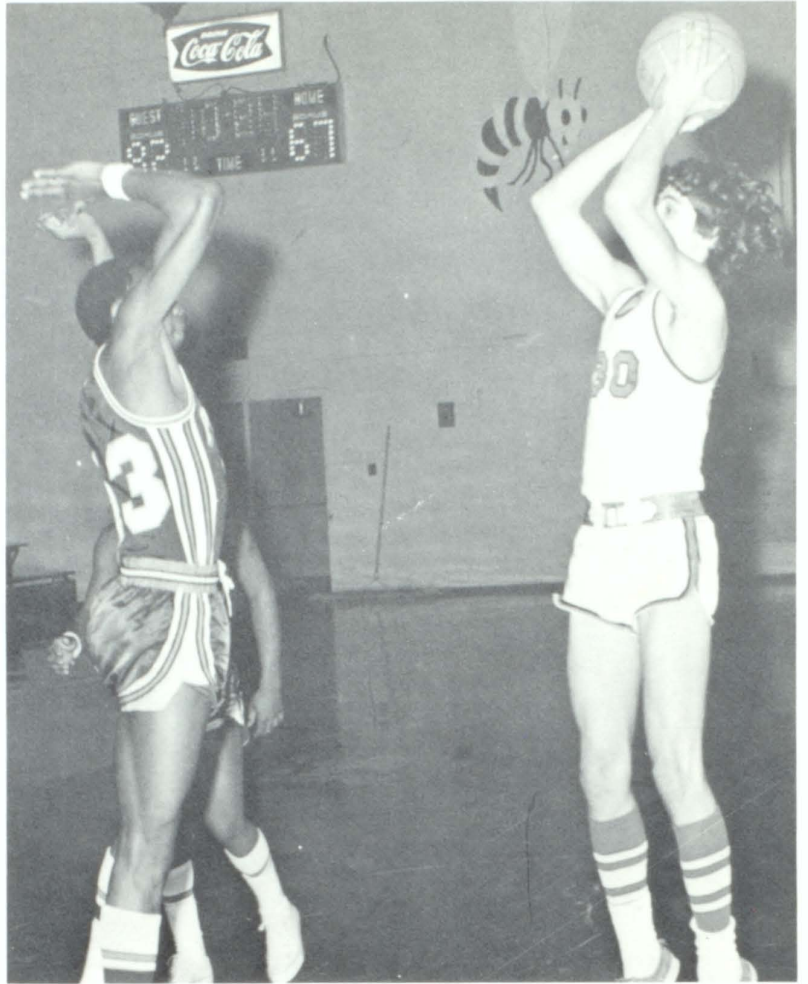

b-team gets it together

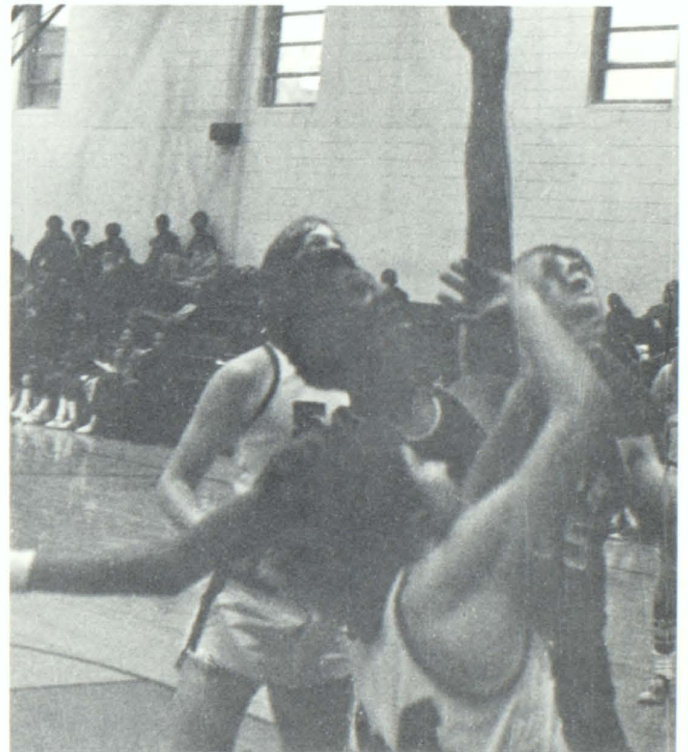

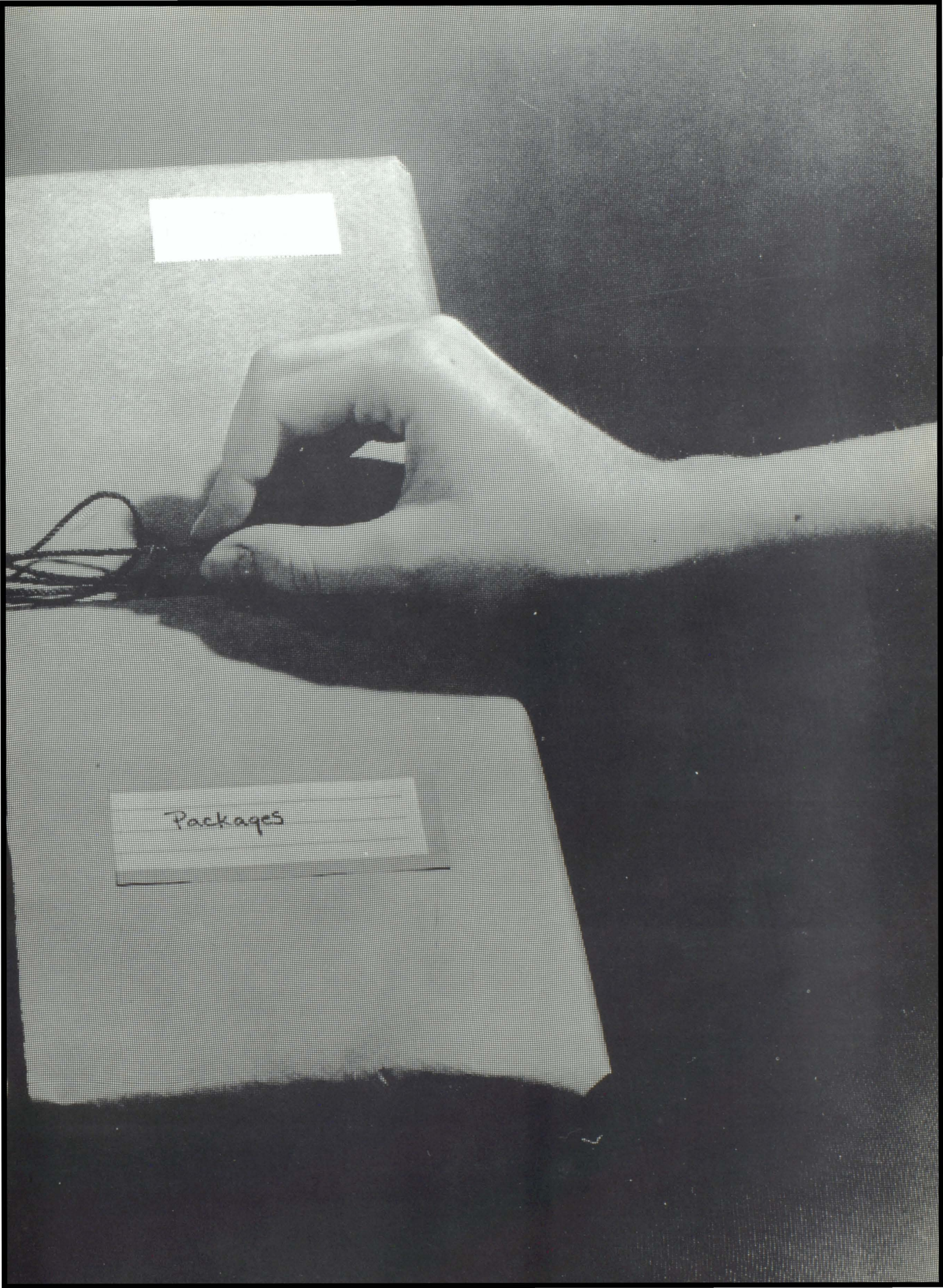
tennis stars region champs

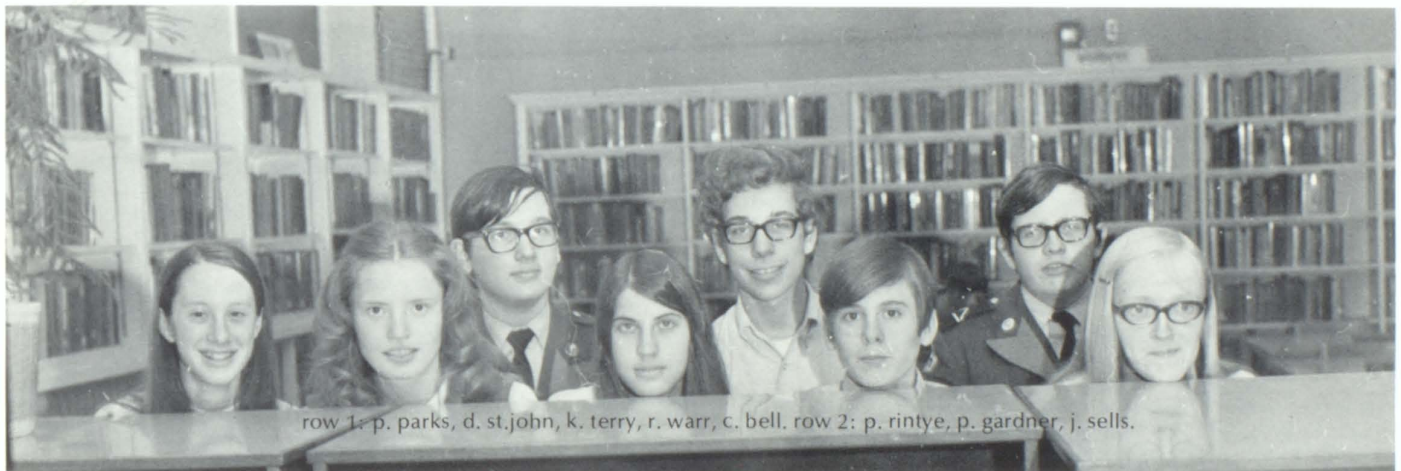

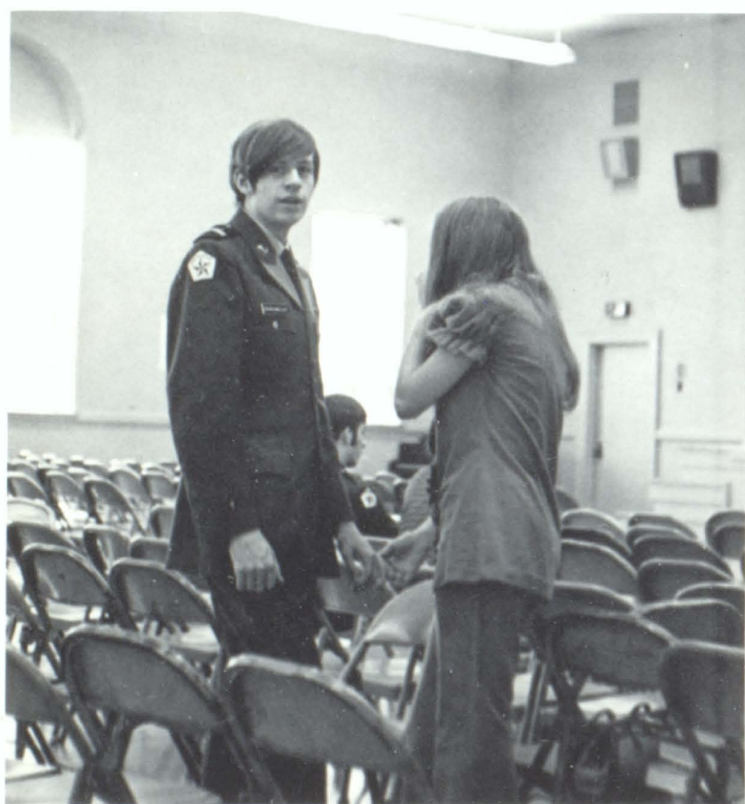

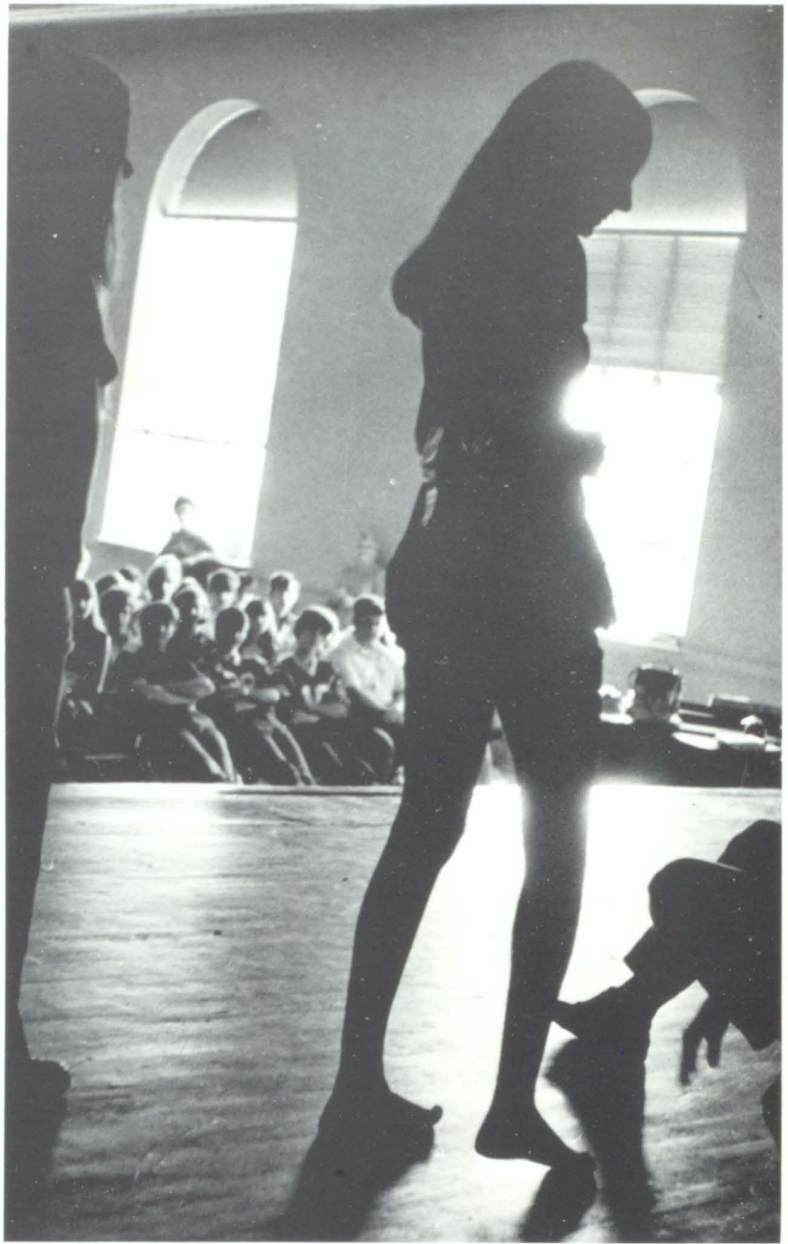

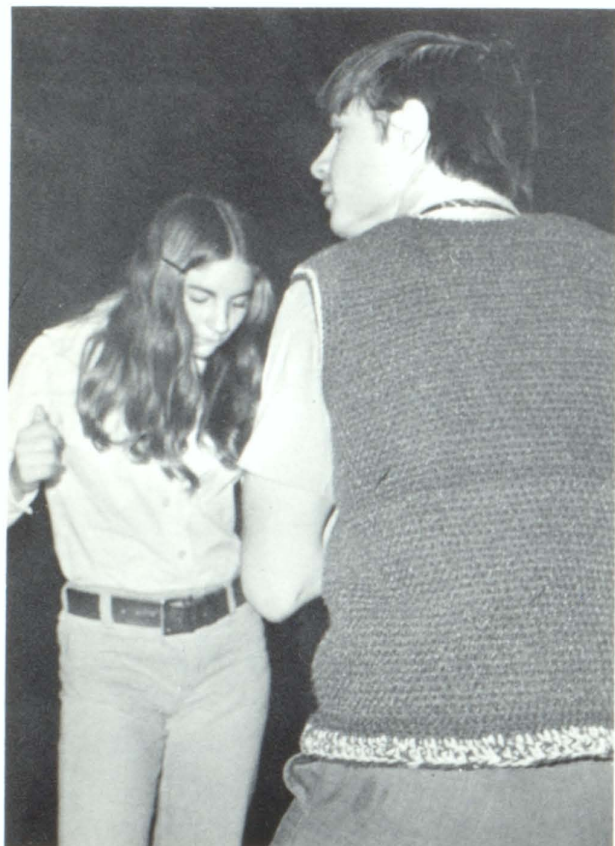

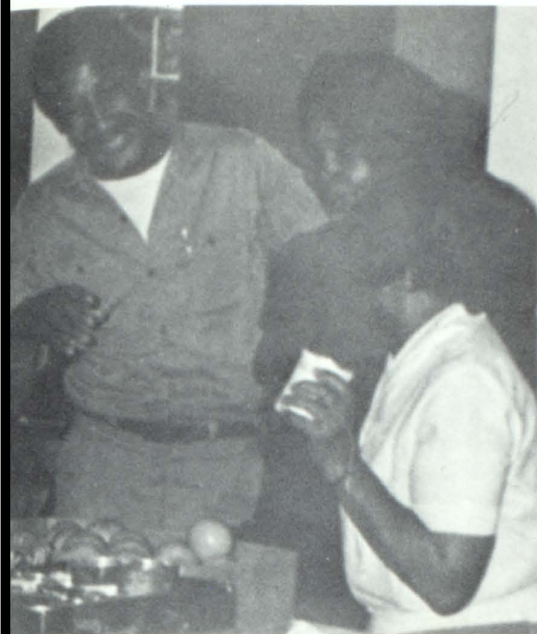

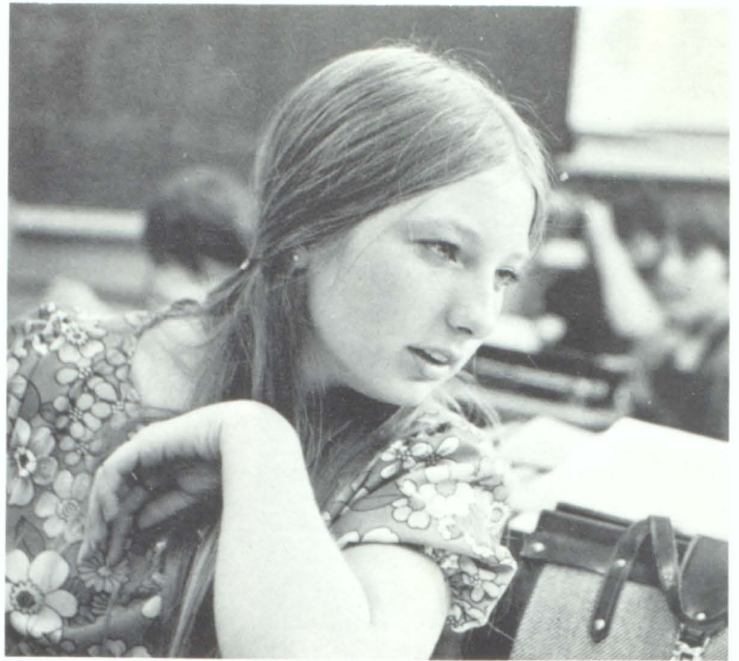
