

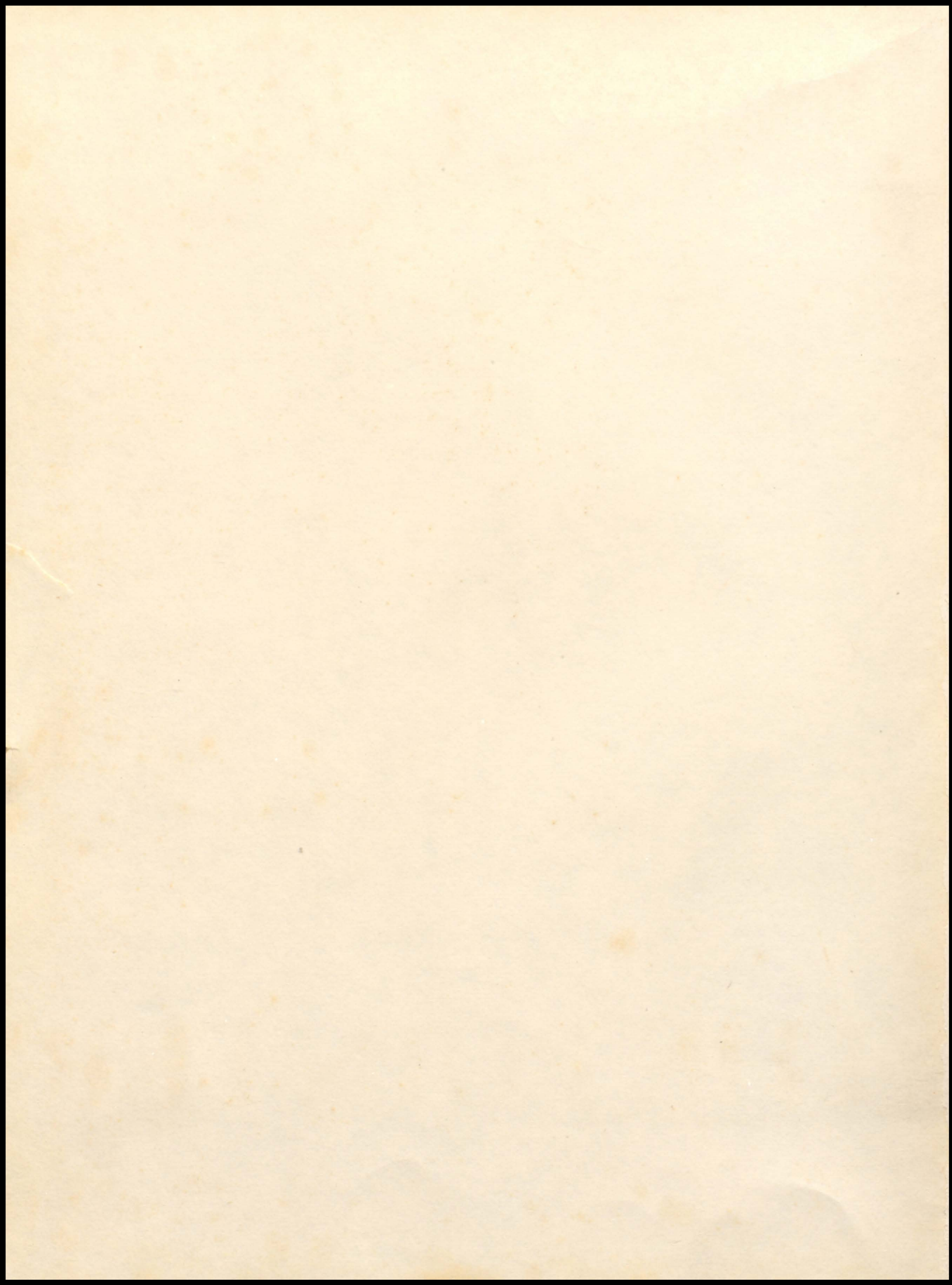

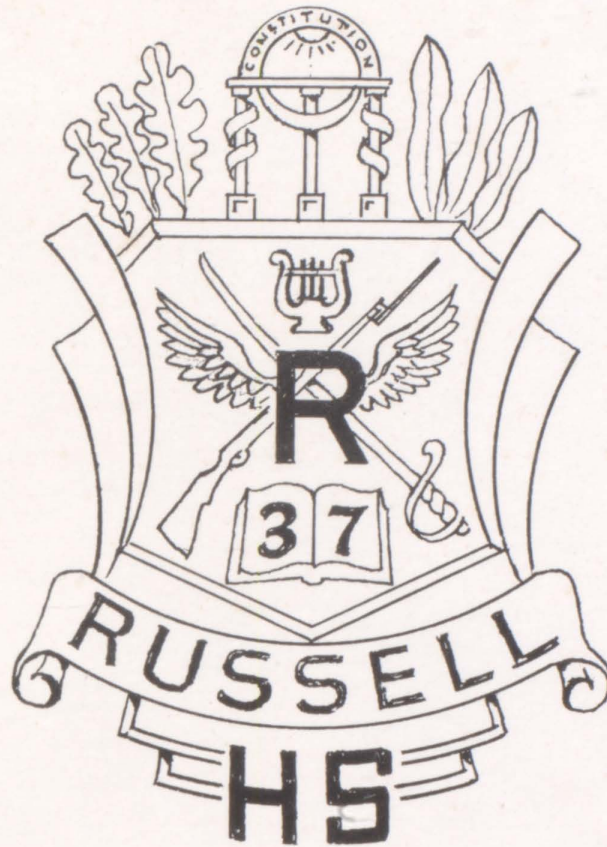

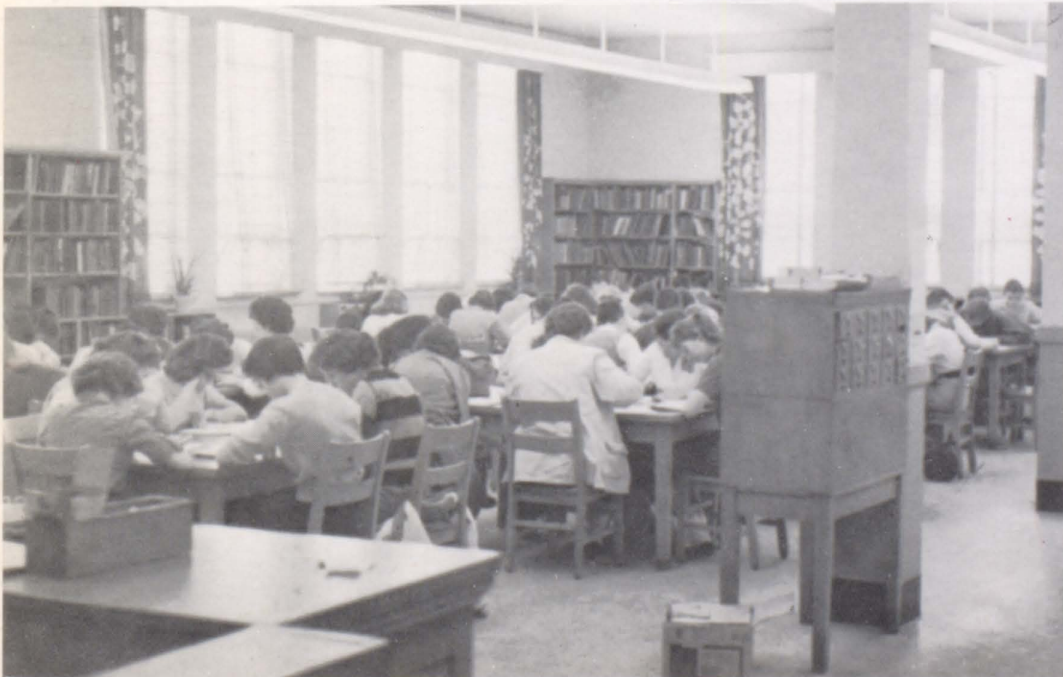
FOREWORD

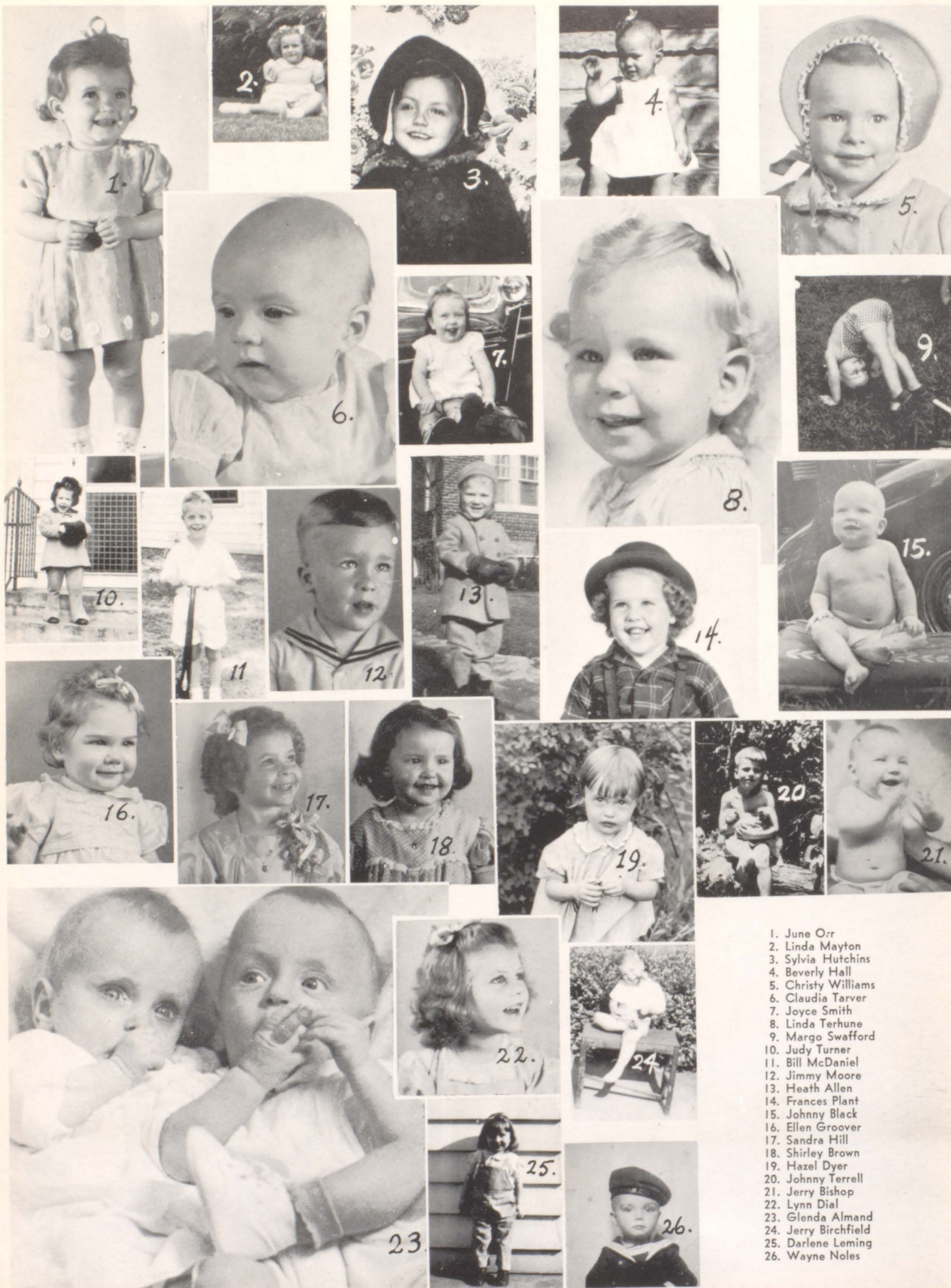

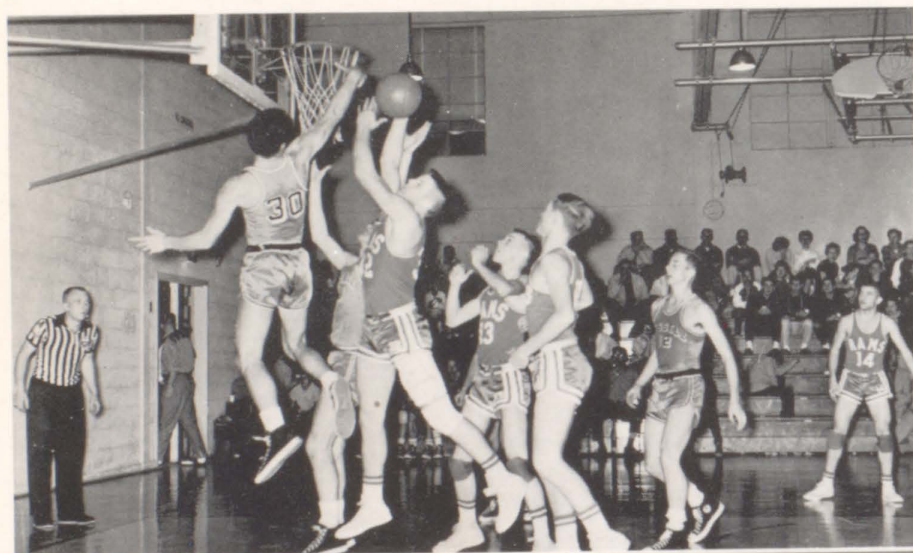
