"Sweeter also than honey."

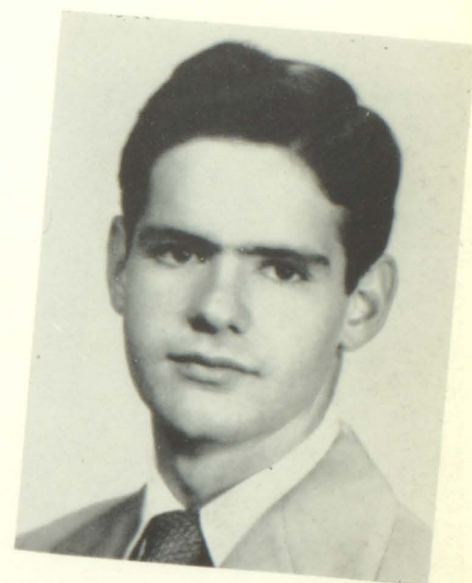
