



The educational program is planned to meet the needs of all children. Schools are planned and built to meet the needs of the educational program.




MENTAL GROWTH






MORAL GROWTH



The kind of life children will live is influenced by the quality of the environment which is created for them throughout the school.




Functional Design and Flexible Arrangement of Materials and Equipment in Space







An Entrance to a School








