The school began in 1931-32 with only an eighth grade, housed upstairs in College Street elementary school. Everybody took the same academic subjects.

Each year thereafter, another grade was added, and the subjects broadened to include business education, fine arts, and vocational courses.


In January, 1938, two hundred-sixty-eight students, freshman through juniors, were moved into the first unit of the Hapeville High School building. In 1949, the second unit was completed with cafeteria and auditorium for 464 students. Ninety-three seniors graduated.


In 1959, the third unit was completed. The physical education classes moved from the City Gym to the school campus, thus accommodating its present 860 students.


After twenty-five years of expansion, the school, housed in a complete plant, operates as a fully accredited senior high school.

TO MY FRIENDS OF HAPEVILLE HIGH SCHOOL:

All my days I shall remember that New Year's Day of 1939 when student body and faculty assembled for the first time in the brand-new high school on the hill-top. I remember the fresh, clean, new-paint smell of the school on that January day twenty-five years ago.

There was one thing about the school in its early days that amused me, and those of you who were there then will remember it - that dinky little platform or stage in the auditorium. When as many as three people were on it, its capacity was taxed.

But we were all so proud of this new school which had been developing year by year over at College Street, and which now was ready to move out on its own. Students were proud of it, the faculty was proud of it, and the community was proud of it.

And twenty-five years later we are still proud of Hapeville High School. We are grateful for the thousands of young men and women who have found in the school such a rich source of qualification for life and vocation. The contribution these young people have made and are making in so many areas of service to community, state and nation is incalculable.

It was a rare privilege and one I shall never forget to have been the first principal of the new Hapeville High School. My associations with students, faculty and community are among the most pleasurable of my life.

But while it is good to think of the school's past, it is even better to think of her great potential for the future. It is a wonderfully fine school today with an able principal and faculty, a challenging student body, and serving one of the best communities to be found anywhere.

And so while rejoicing in the bright legacy of Hapeville High School's history, I congratulate the school upon the promise of her future.



This background gave to Hapeville High School from its very beginning a mold and a purpose to which all succeeding student bodies have subscribed with sincerity of purpose and the resultant achievement. The diversified recognition that has come to the School during these twenty-five years has bespoken fully the high caliber of its program and its personnel. Successful, outstanding and purposeful products are the best index of the quality of the individual school. Hapeville High ranks high in this evaluation.

The members of the Fulton County Board of Education and the other members of the Administrative Staff join me in these expressions of sincere congratulations as your school begins another quarter century of service to the community, to Georgia and to the nation.
















