

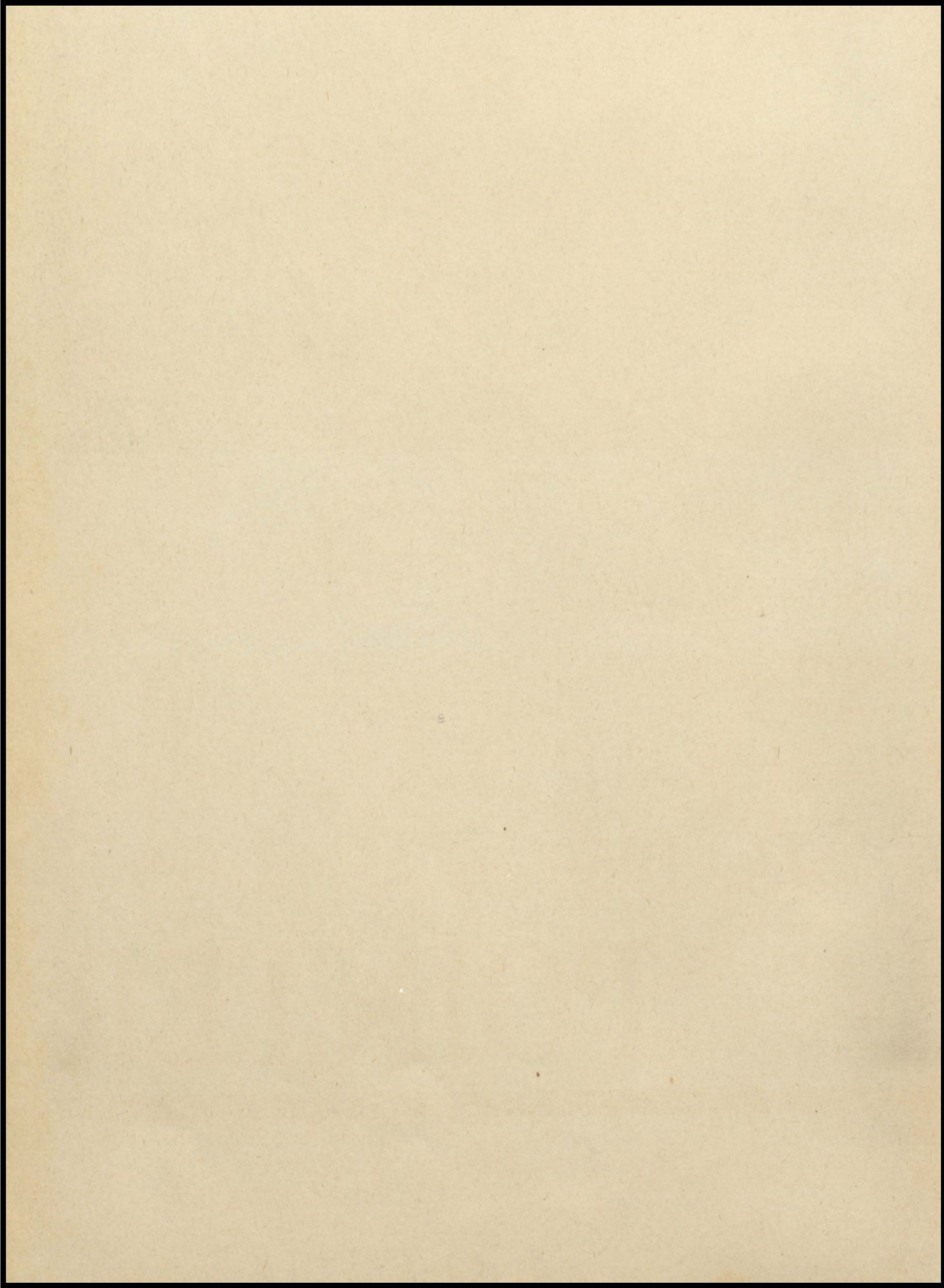

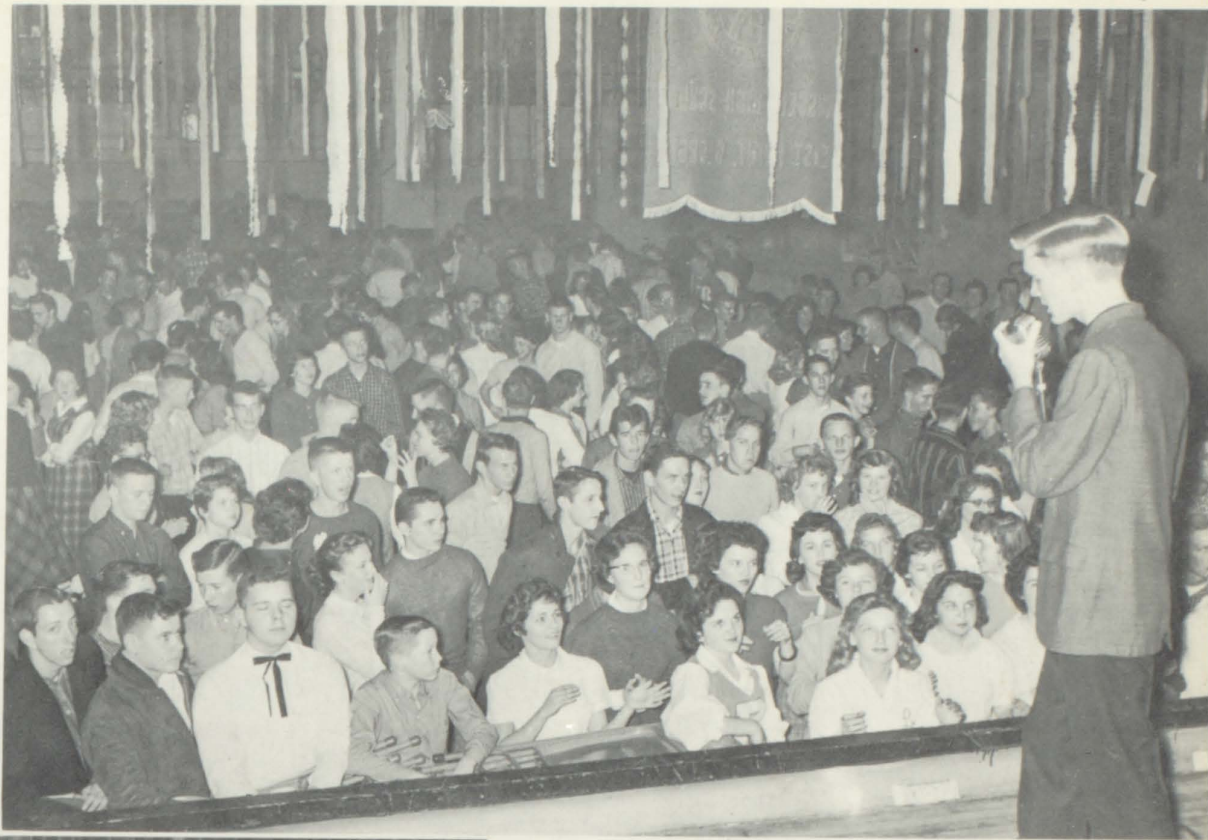

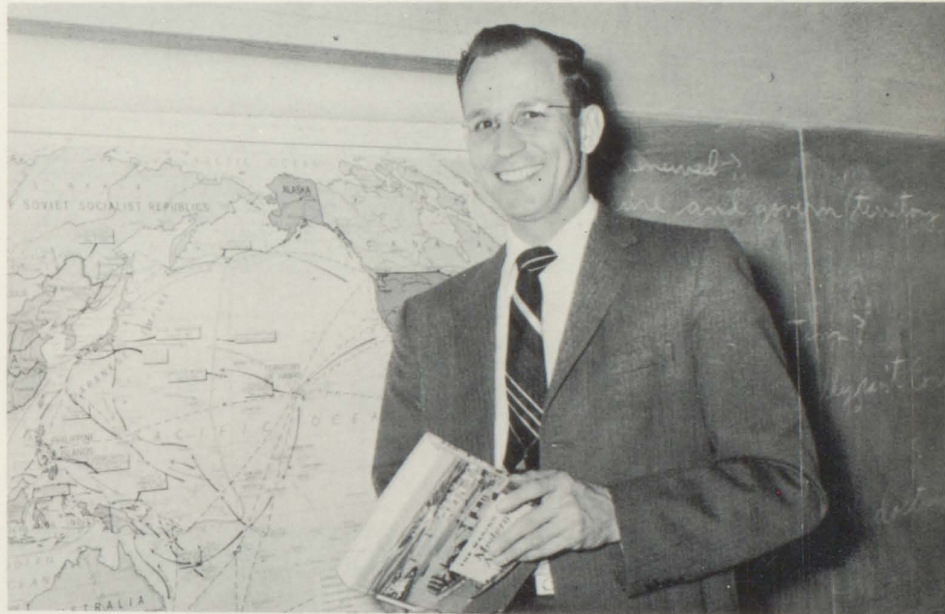
THE COACHING STAFF

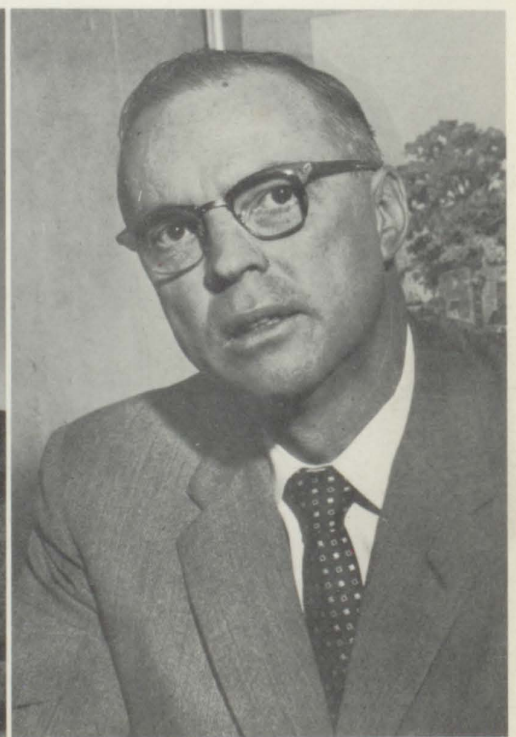

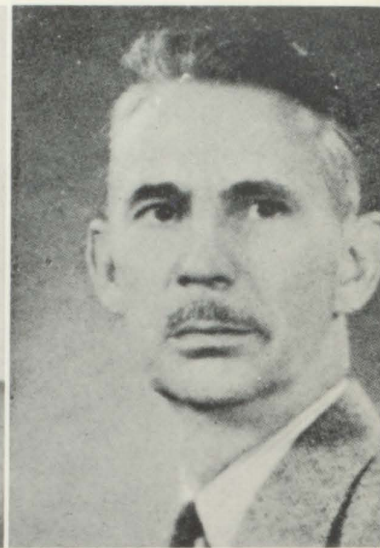

Mr. Evans is Head of the Industrial Arts Department; he has taught many of his students in Wood Shop so well that they have won prizes for their work.

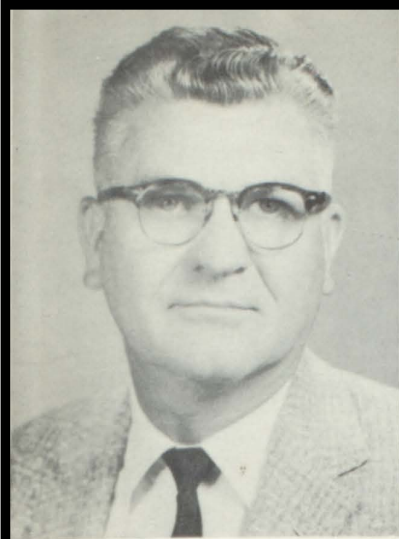

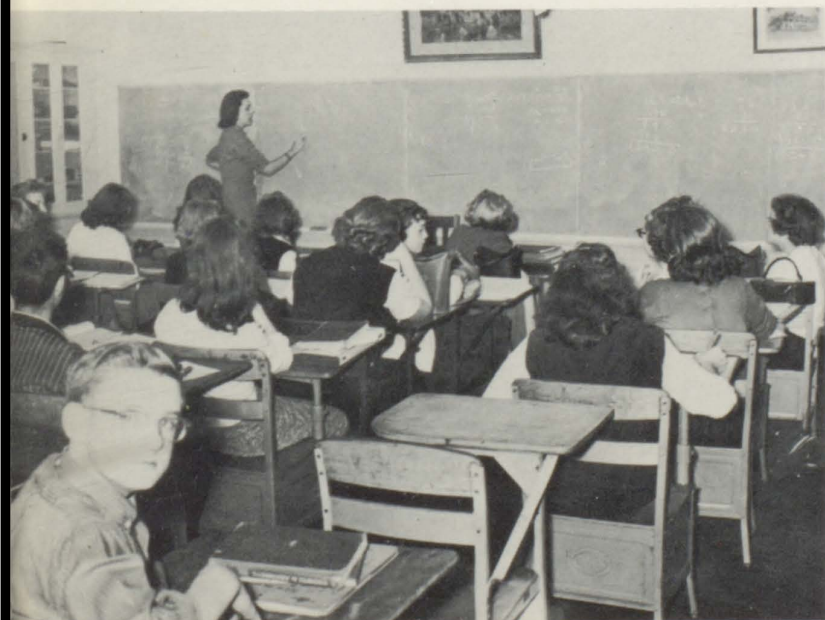

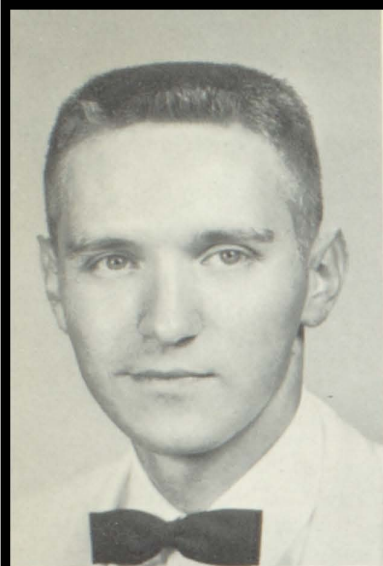
Mrs. Barnes is well loved by her eighth grade students for her teaching ability and good humor. Home Economics and Physical Education are her specialties.

Students who learn Arithmetic and Algebra from Miss Crowe will never forget it—a fine teacher and interesting subjects.

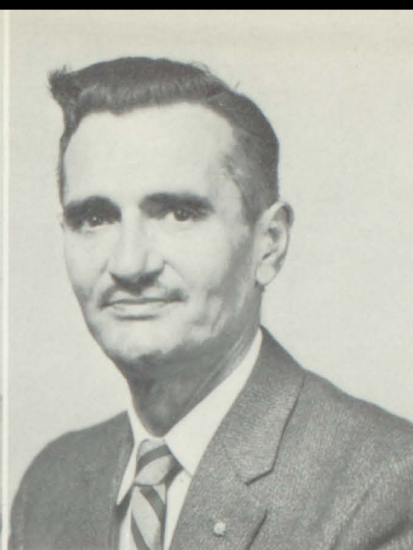
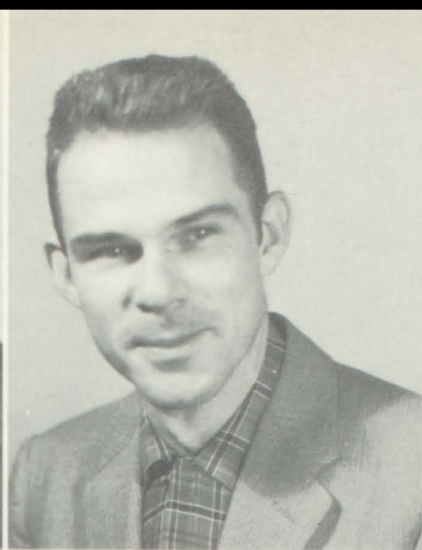
Baseball and History—a unique combination, perhaps, but one which Mr. Dodd blends so well that the best is attained in both.

Learn those bones! Cut up those frogs! Miss Galloway's Sophomore Biology students will forever be grateful for the wonderful foundation she gives them.

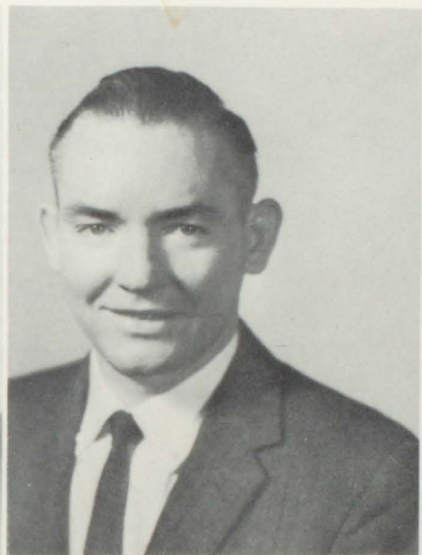
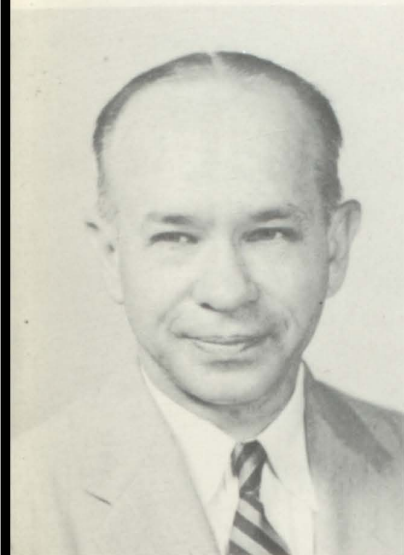

Mr. Griggers is one of our capable Mathematics teachers. He teaches well the fundamentals needed in order to go on to bigger and better things in Mathematics.

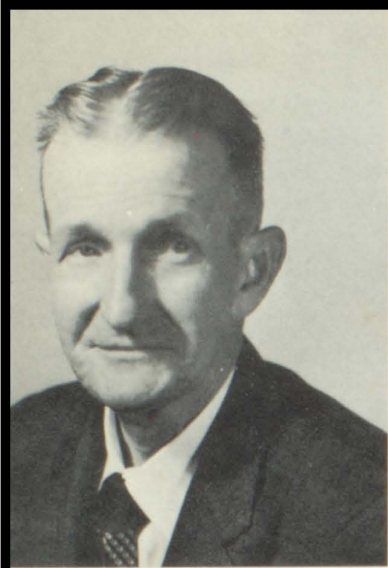
We best know Mr. Grindle for his superb work as Advisor for the Russell Bank. He also teaches Business Education.

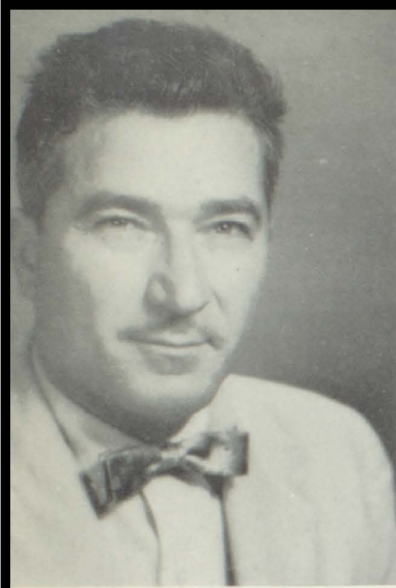
Where are my gym shoes? Miss Martin's Physical Education class proves very active even if shoes are misplaced. No matter on what sport we are concentrating she can beat us all.

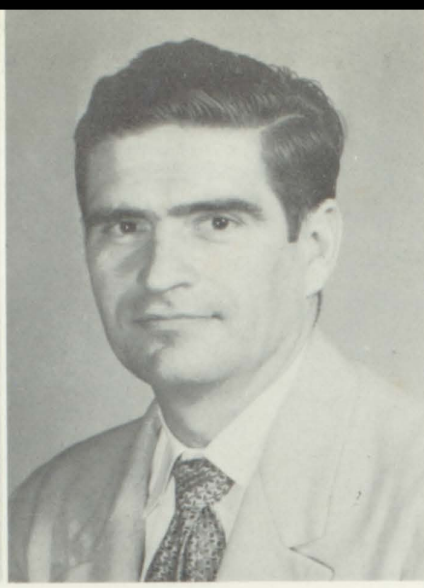

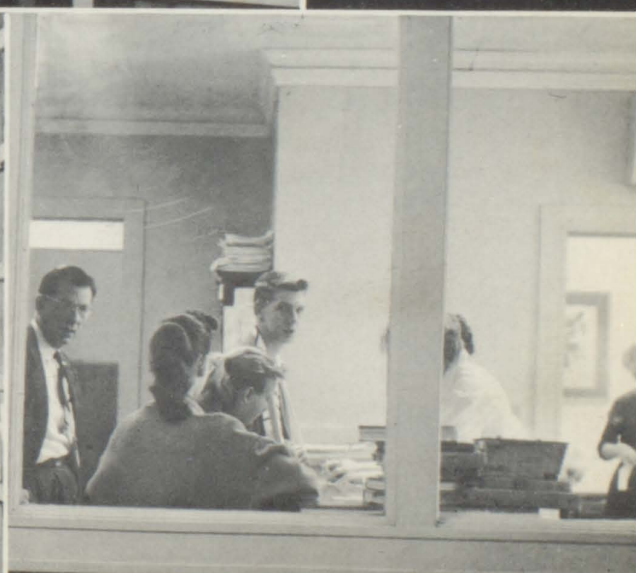
... THEIR PATIENCE AND UNDERSTANDING
