Dear Mr Perry:

I am submitting herewith the much delayed annual report for the operation of the Fulton County School System for the year 1937-38. I regret the delay, but compiling the figures necessary for ninety-one schools has been more of a job than we anticipated.

You will find on Page 4, Section VI, "D", the cost of operation, we listed the cost of supply fees, together with such other contributions as might have been made by PTA's or received from plays and entertainments. The bulk of this, however, is the fees charged our children for expendable materials and supplies.

Your instructions called for the use of the figures referred to above in arriving at the cost per pupil for expenses as found under Section VII, "D". We did not use these figures at all in figuring the per pupil expenditure cost for numerous items, but we used instead the total cost of operating the school system, exclusive of teachers' salaries. The figures contained in Section VI, "D", were derived, as stated above, primarily from fees and I am attaching to this report a list of the fees charged our students, by grades, for the expendable materials so that you can understand where we received the bulk of the funds in this section.

We have a uniform salary schedule, and pay our teachers for ten months in the year. The salaries listed under Section IX covers total salaries for all teachers in each school and we didn't feel it was necessary to duplicate by filling in additional columns.

If you find any other discrepencies in the report and need additional information, please call us and we shall be glad to furnish it.
