Another System). PLEASE NOTE THAT THE ATTORNEY GENERAL HAS RULED THAT A WRITTEN AGREEMENT IS NECESSARY IF THE AVERAGE DAILY ATTENDANCE OF CHILDREN LIVING IN ONE SCHOOL SYSTEM AND ATTENDING SCHOOL IN ANOTHER SYSTEM IS TO BE CREDITED TO EITHER SYSTEM. ACCORDING TO THE RULING, NEITHER SYSTEM CAN CLAIM THE A.D.A. FOR THESE CHILDREN IN THE ABSENCE OF SUCH AN AGREEMENT. This ruling should be taken into consideration in completing this report. In cases where children cross county or independent school system lines, the superintendents of the systems involved should see that their reports are in agreement.

The Yearly Aggregate Days of Attendance of all pupils (grades 1-12) in the school system divided by 180 should equal (or almost equal) the total A.D.A. (grades 1-12) for the system. Since the A.D.A. figures per grade per school have been rounded to the nearest whole number, it is almost impossible for the two figures to be exactly the same.

TABLE IV—Enrollment By Grades—The enrollment of any grade or school will always exceed the Average Daily Attendance.

THE ENROLLMENT IN THIS TABLE MEANS THE TOTAL ENROLLMENT, INCLUDING THE CHILDREN PREVIOUSLY ENROLLED THIS YEAR IN ANOTHER GEORGIA SCHOOL.

Please note that **Exceptional Children In Special Classes** are reported in one column only and are not included in the totals (grades 1-12). The Exceptional Children reported in this table are those who are in classes with a special allotted teacher who keeps an attendance register for their accounting.

NEGRO SCHOOLS—The tables in this report for Negro Schools are identical with those used for White Schools. Hence the instruction about tables for the White Schools are also applicable to the Negro Schools.

TABLE IX—ATTENDANCE SUMMARY—The information shown in Table IX (yearly summary of attendance) is used by the State in calculating the allotment of teachers to school systems. Parts 2 and 3 of this table should show the number of pupils transferring from one school system to another under written agreement. Pupils reported in parts 2 and 3 of this table should be by agreement of system superintendents in providing educational opportunities for children. It is imperative that elementary and high school attendance be reported separately.

TABLE X AND XI—AGE AND GRADE CHART—The total number of children shown in each grade should tally with the total number of children enrolled in grades 1-12 as shown in Table IV on page 4. Please note that the AGES ARE AS OF SEPTEMBER 1, 1959. Previously Enrolled Children are reported by grade in Col. A only.

CONCLUSION—After all information about each school has been properly recorded in the tables of this report, please be sure that the totals shown at the bottom of tables are correct.
