TABLE I—The total number of instructional employees (academic and vocational teachers, teaching principals, librarians, counselors, exceptional children teachers, and other regular program teachers) in each school should be reported in Cols. 1 through 8. The certificates and permits for the personnel listed in Cols. 1 through 8 should be reported in Cols. 9 through 16. The number recorded in Col. 16 should equal the number recorded in Col. 8.

Kindergarten, special adult programs, evening extension, veterans, and O.S.Y. teachers, part and full-time, should be reported in Cols. 17 through 20. Another System). PLEASE NOTE THAT THE ATTORNEY GENERAL HAS RULED THAT A WRITTEN AGREEMENT IS NECESSARY IF THE AVERAGE DAILY ATTENDANCE OF CHILDREN LIVING IN ONE SCHOOL SYSTEM AND ATTENDING SCHOOL IN ANOTHER SYSTEM IS TO BE CREDITED TO EITHER SYSTEM. ACCORDING TO THE RULING, NEITHER SYSTEM CAN CLAIM THE A.D.A. FOR THESE CHILDREN IN THE ABSENCE OF SUCH AN AGREEMENT. This ruling should be taken into consideration in completing this report. In cases where children cross county or independent school system lines, the superintendents of the systems involved should see that their reports are in agreement.

The Yearly Aggregate Days of Attendance of all pupils (grades 1-12) in the school system divided by 180 should equal (or almost equal) the total A.D.A. (grades 1-12) for the system. Since the A.D.A. figures per grade per school have been rounded to the nearest whole number, it is almost impossible for the two figures to be exactly the same.

TABLE IV-Enrollment By Grades-The enrollment of any grade or school will always exceed the Average Daily Attendance.
