As head of the shops, Mr. Evans has made outstanding advancement. His students have constructed beautiful chests, book ends and other useful articles.





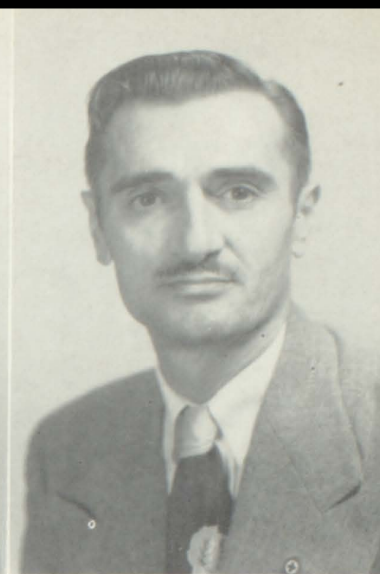

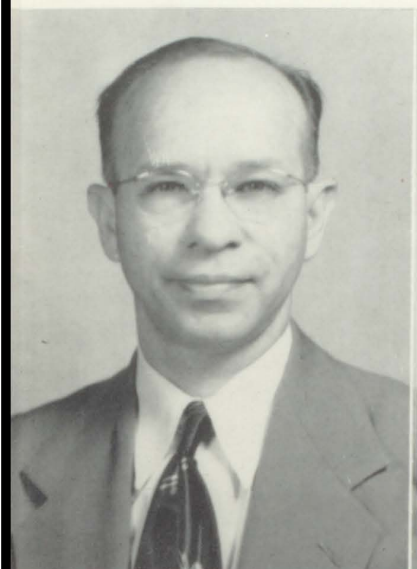

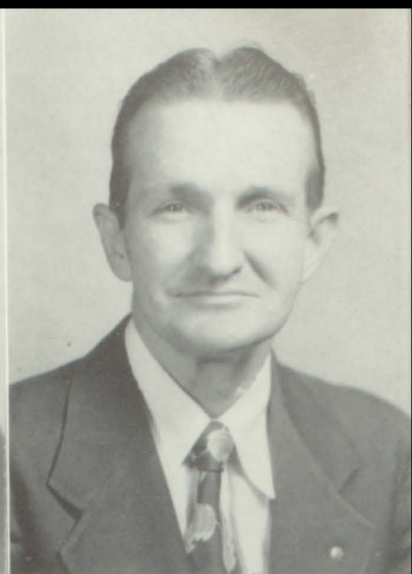

Miss McDaniel has contributed much of her time and effort furthering the students' knowledge of books. She keeps the library as clean as she would her own home.





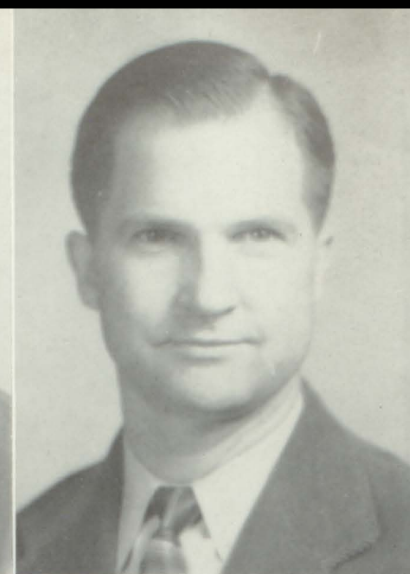

Athletic grants-in-aid were awarded by Georgia Tech to Jimmy Dial, and Auburn to Billy Moran.

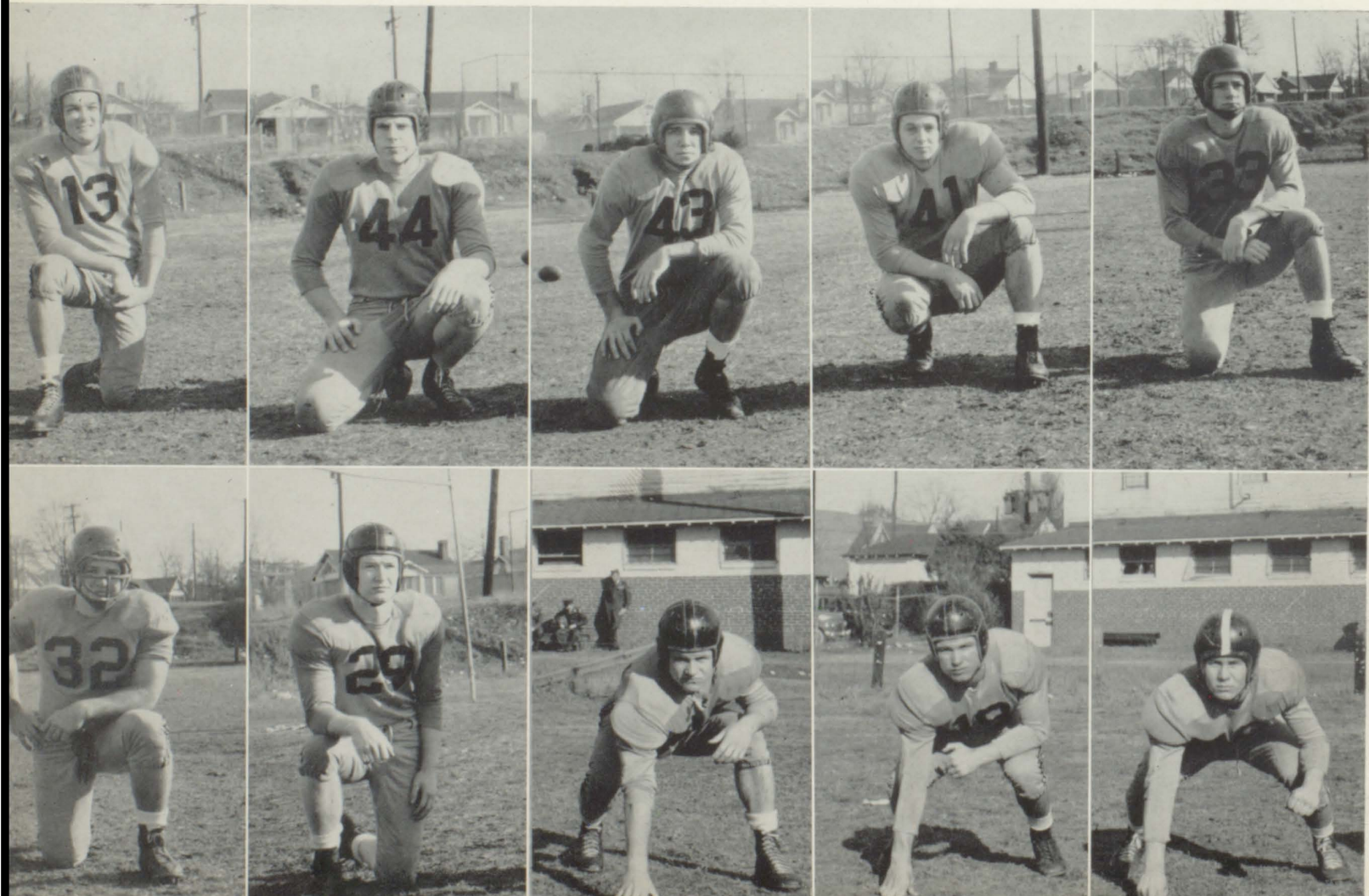
