1936—Mr. Deck "started the ball rolling" and Mrs. Cochran agreed to act as our first librarian.

1938—Miss Jones came to old Richardson High as teacher and part-time librarian. The library had 332 books, 6 student library assistants, 15 magazines on the shelves. Library quarters were in a principal's discarded office with reading tables in the rear of the adjoining auditorium.

1943—The library moved into the new building—beautiful new library quarters and equipment—2500 books, 20 magazines, 23 library assistants.

1950—Library room lengthened 30 feet and remodeled—4000 books, 37 magazines, 25 student assistants and Miss Derrick joined the Staff as Clerical Assistant.


You remember my ambition was to go to Emory University and afterwards get married? Emory has just offered me a lifetime scholarship to that school. They don't have much faith in me, do they?
