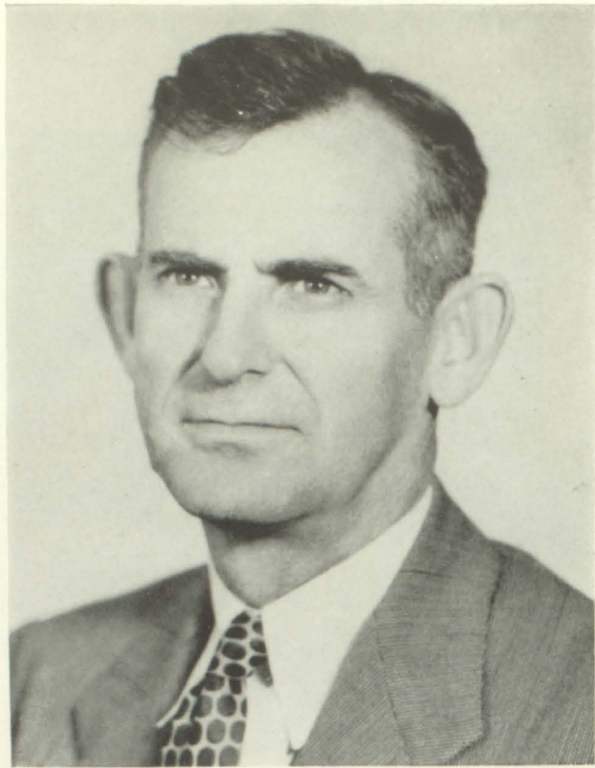


MR. JOHN G. LEWIS

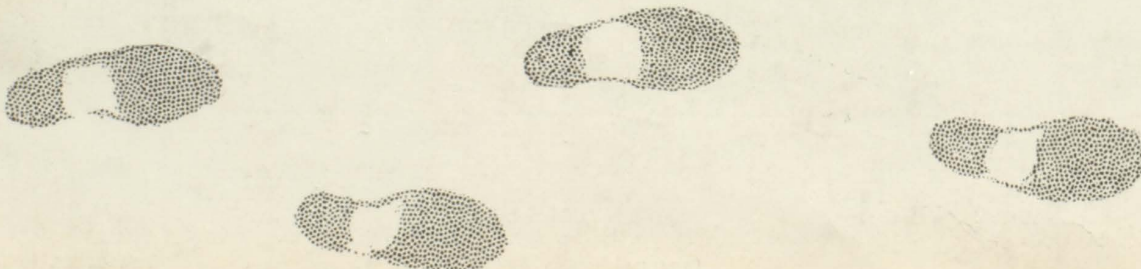
This, our senior year has passed quickly—all too quickly. Soon the highlights of our daily schedule will fade into

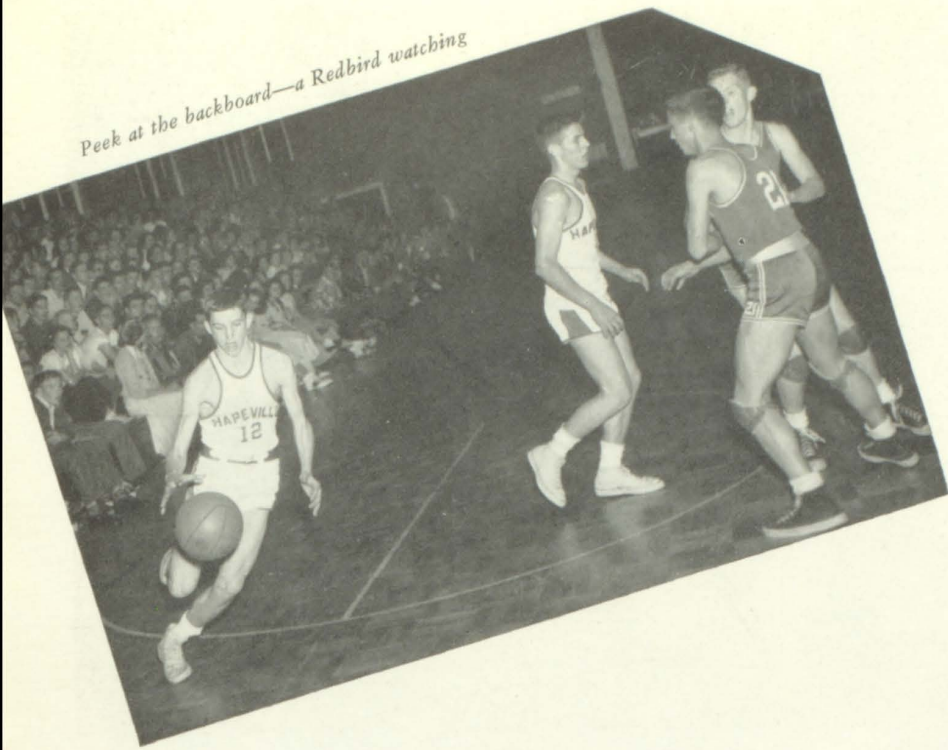

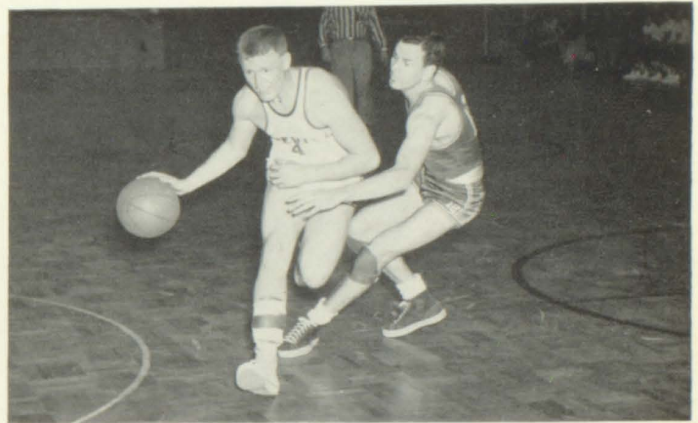
