Just try from now on walking down the hall with a smile; speak to the teachers and other students. You'll be surprised how much better you feel and how much better the people you meet will feel.

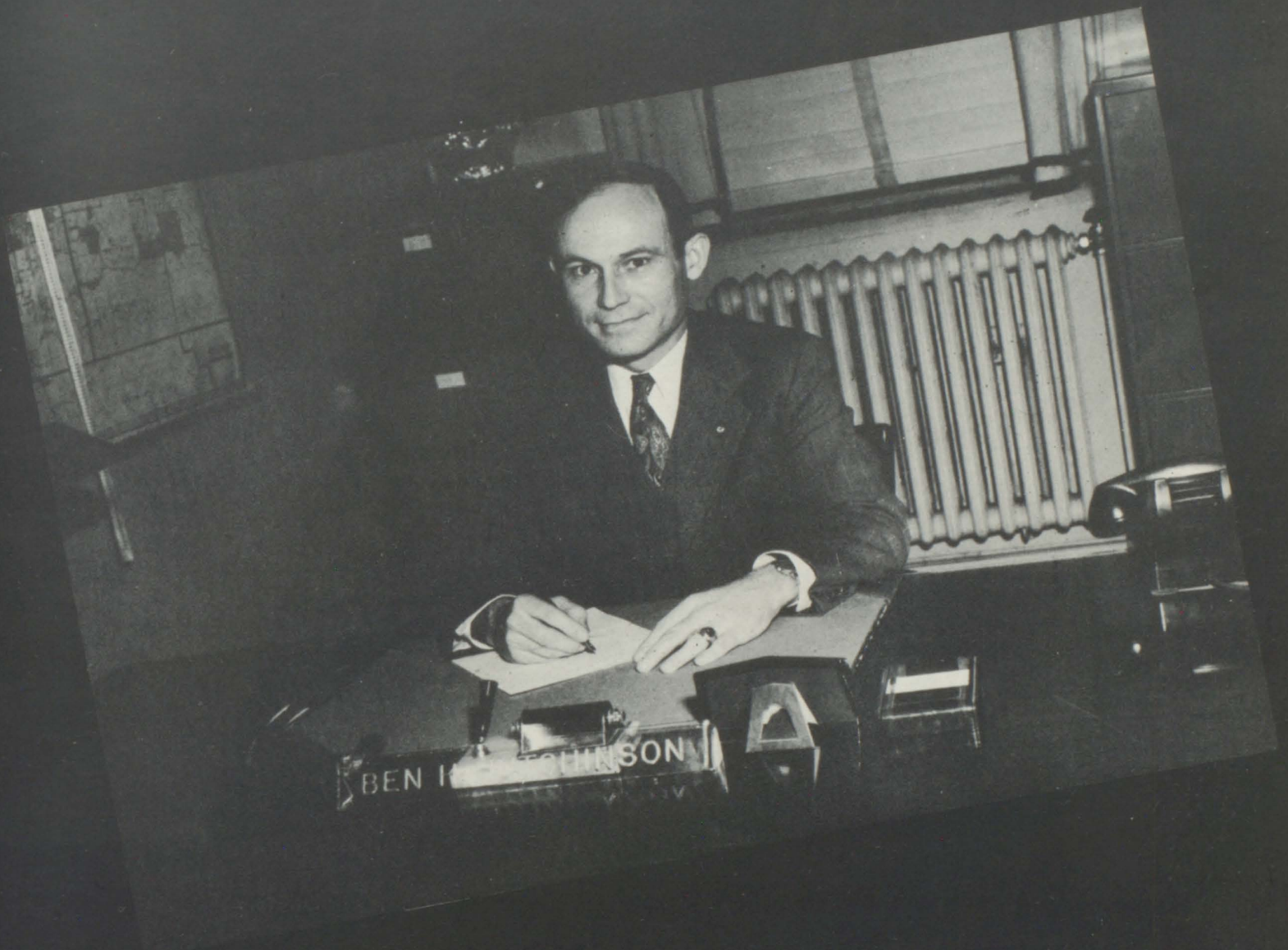

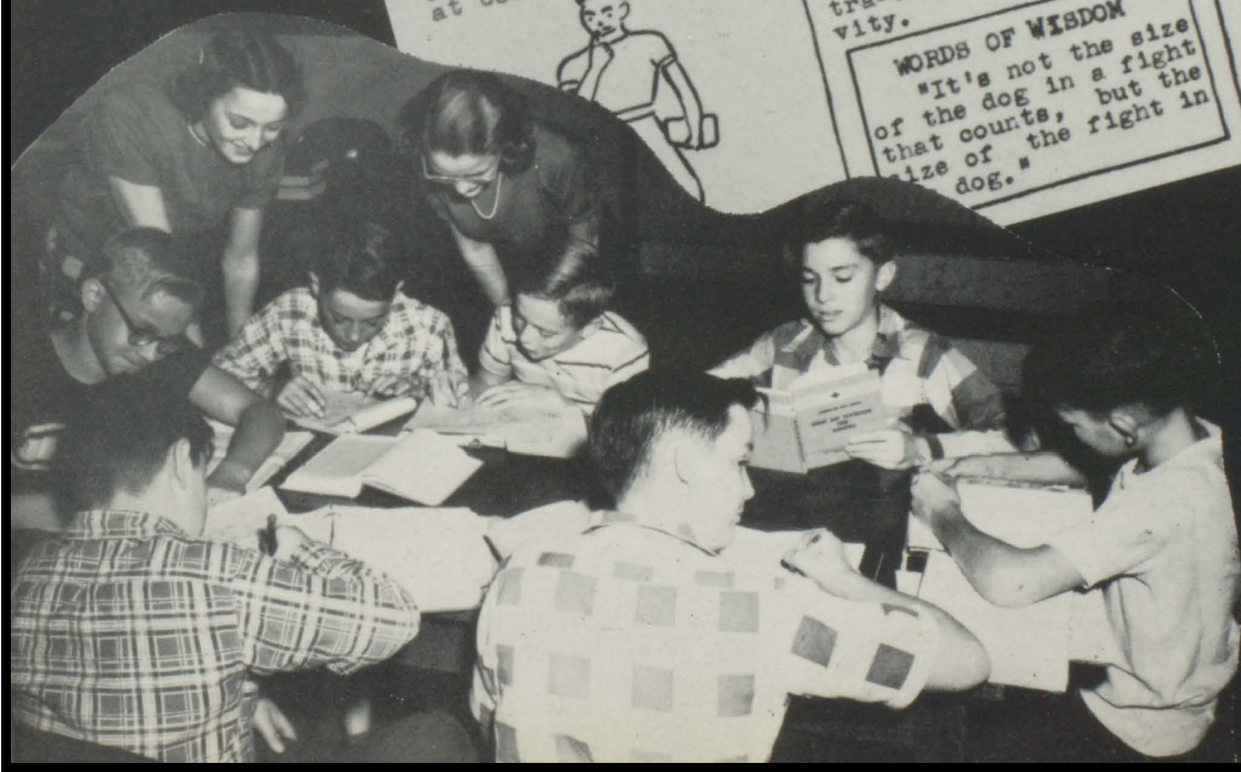
### Sub-Freshmen Learn Dancing
