


ITS PEOPLE-





#### ITS PROGRESS-







#### Science Helps Students Understand Their Environment







### Physical Education Stresses The Maximum Development of Physical And Mental Capacities





















### '67 Hornets Engage In Exciting Season










### Varsity Ranks Second In Region




#### Varsity Basketball Cheerleaders Encourage Audience To Back Team With Necessary Spirit










