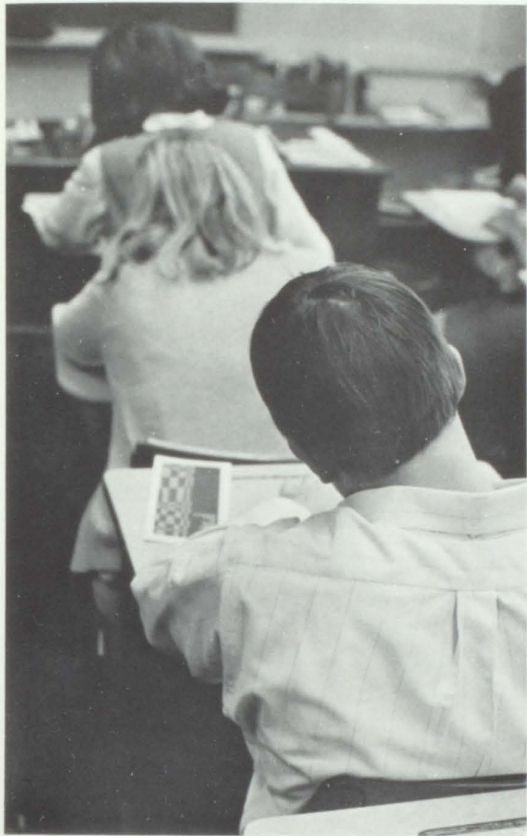


#### ITS PROGRESS—

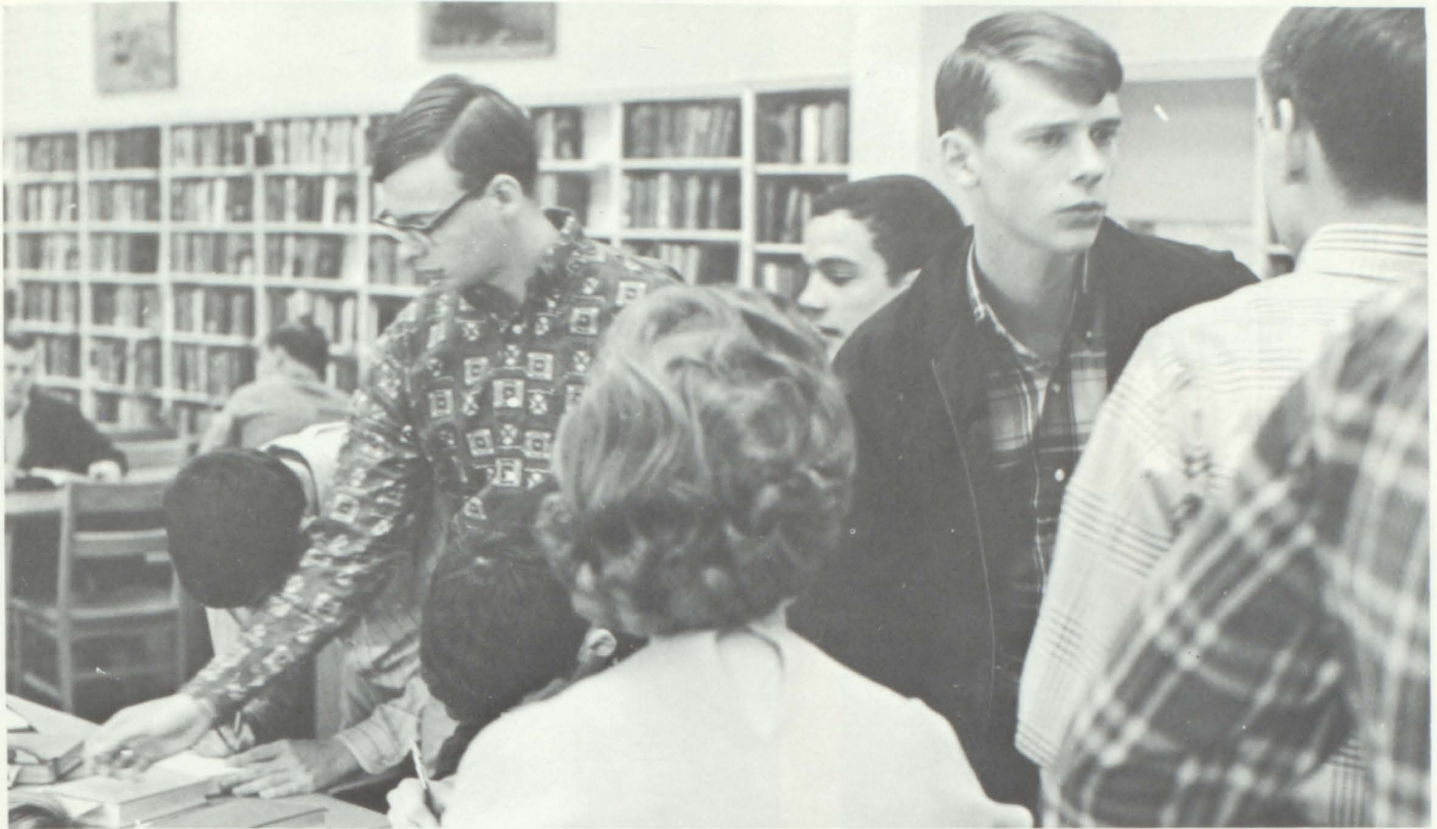
## Library Becomes Center Of Instructional Materials

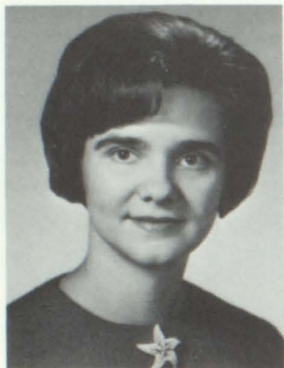

## Science Helps Students Understand Their Environment

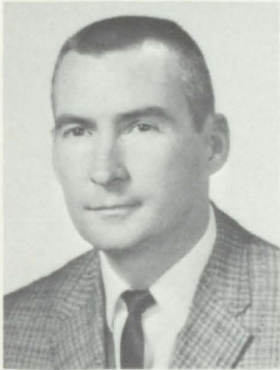

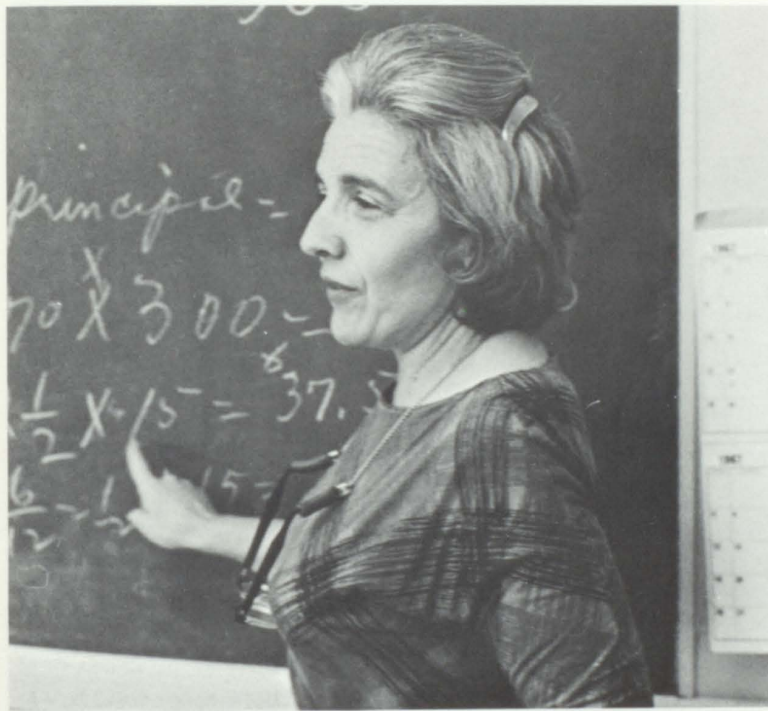

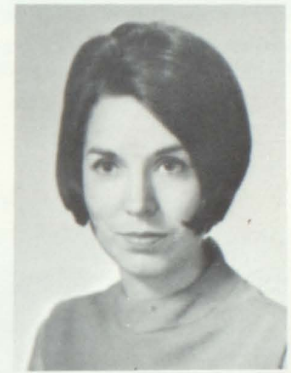

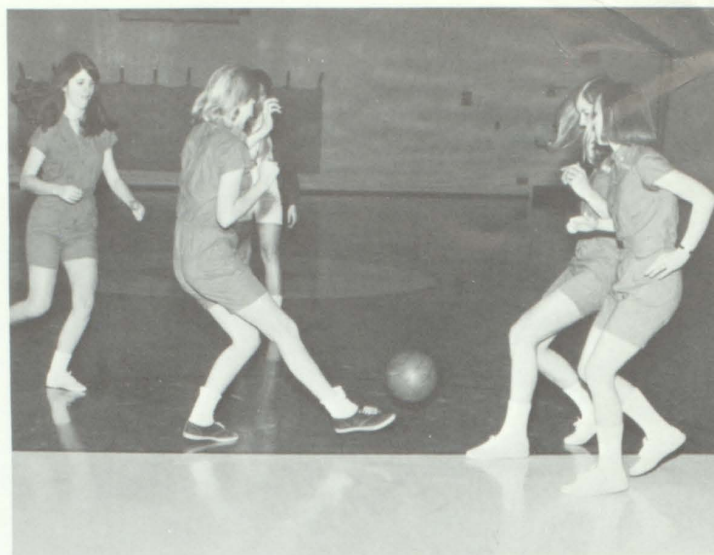

## Physical Education Stresses The Maximum Development of Physical And Mental Capacities

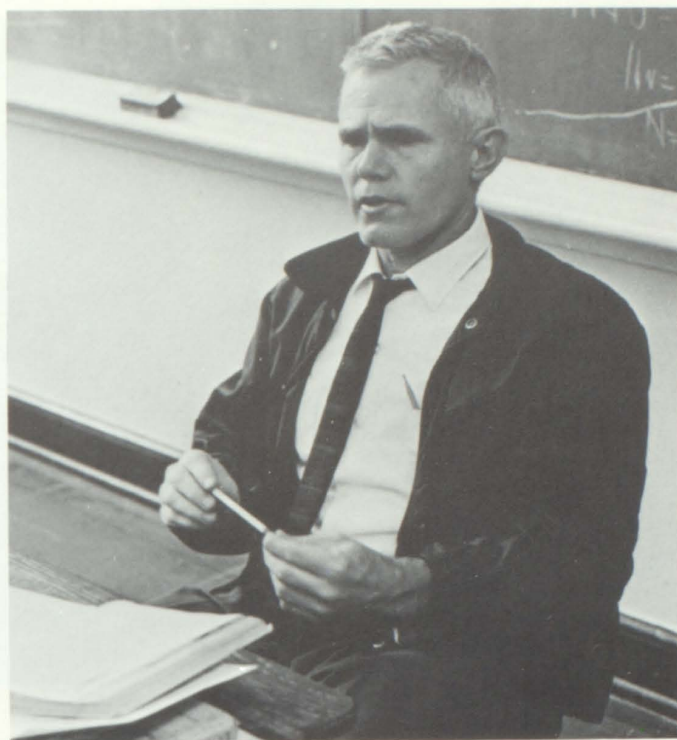

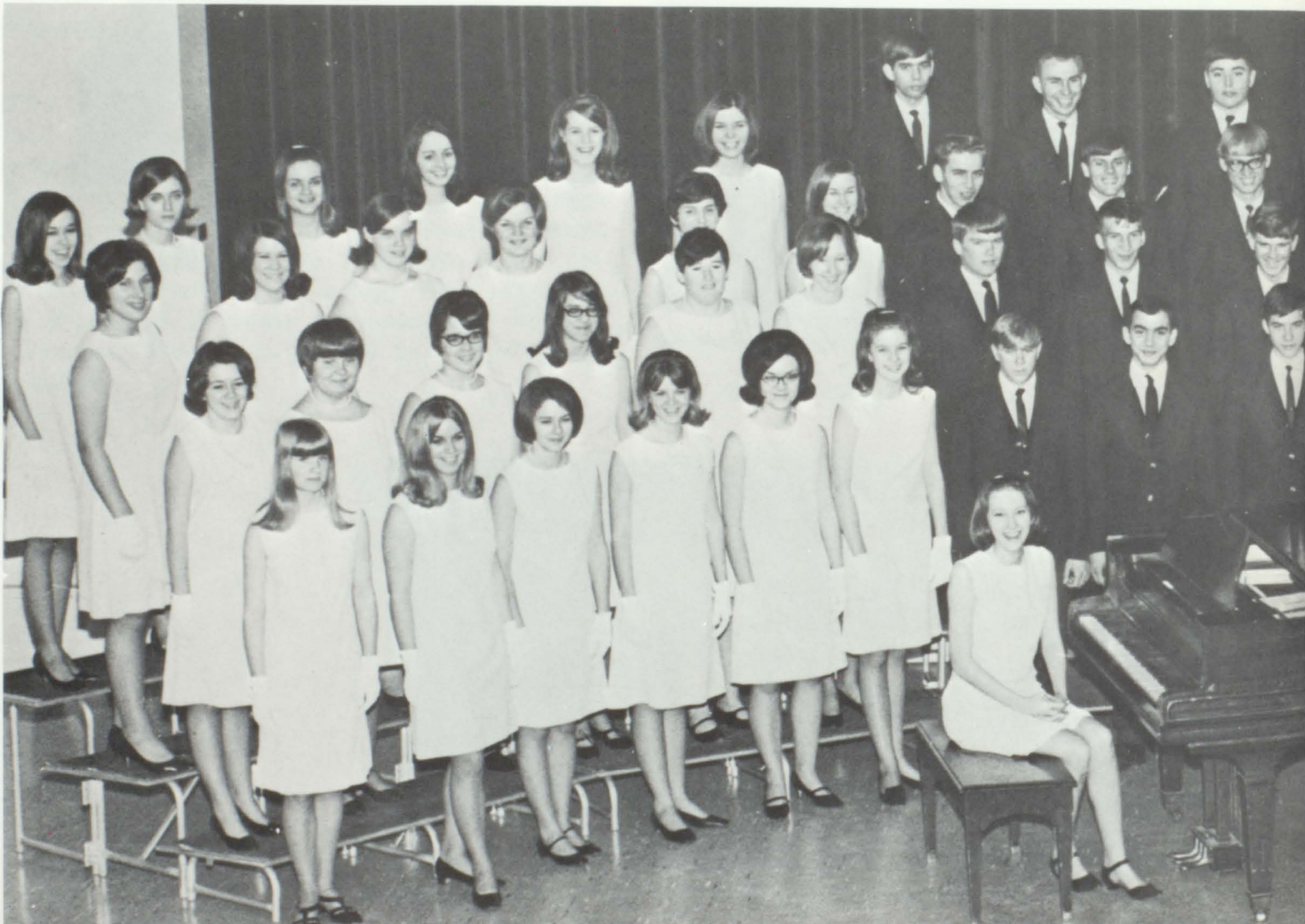

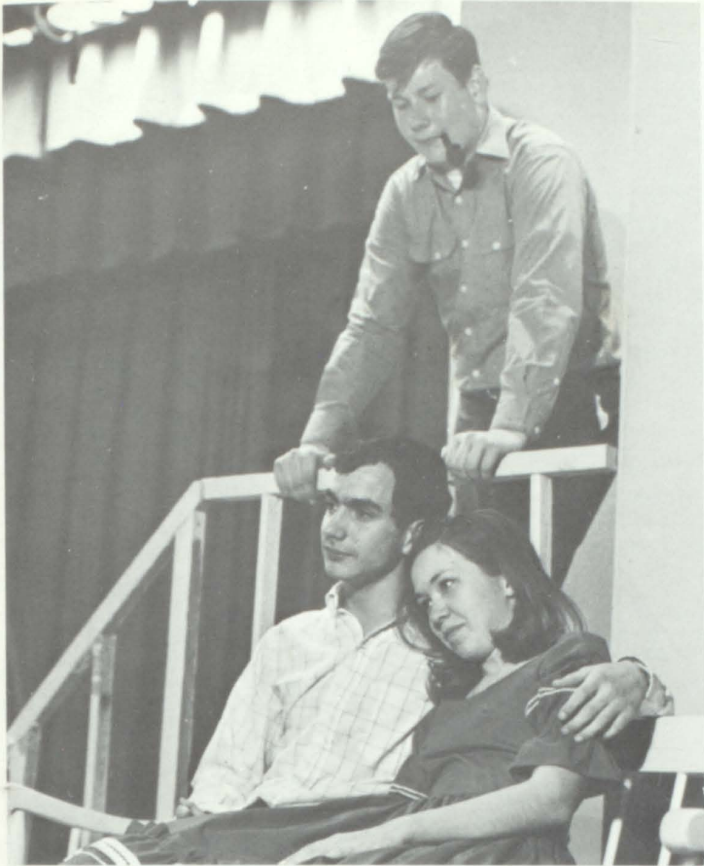

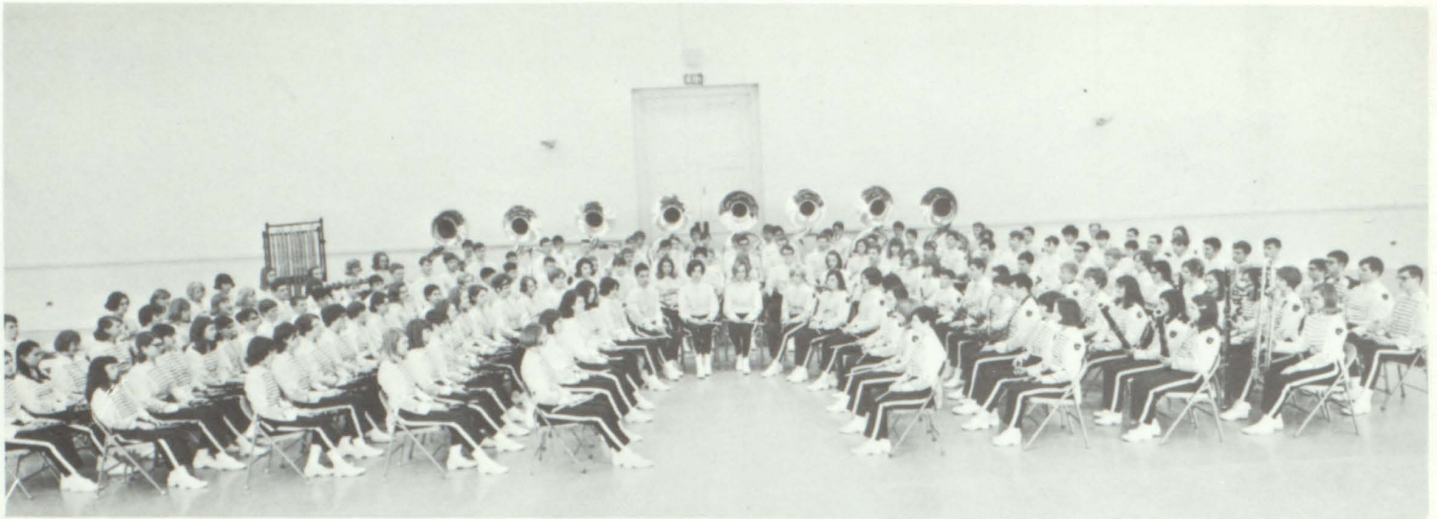

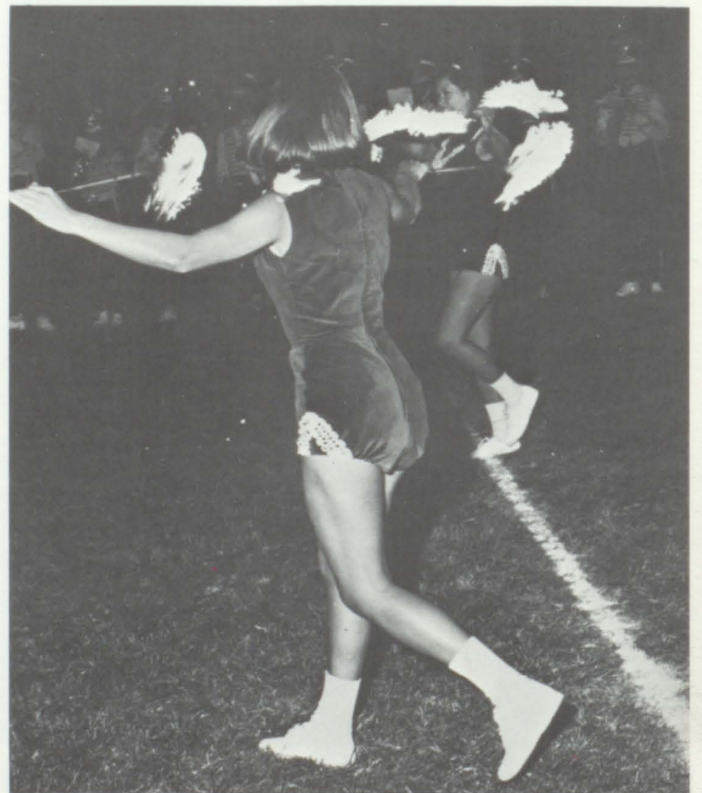

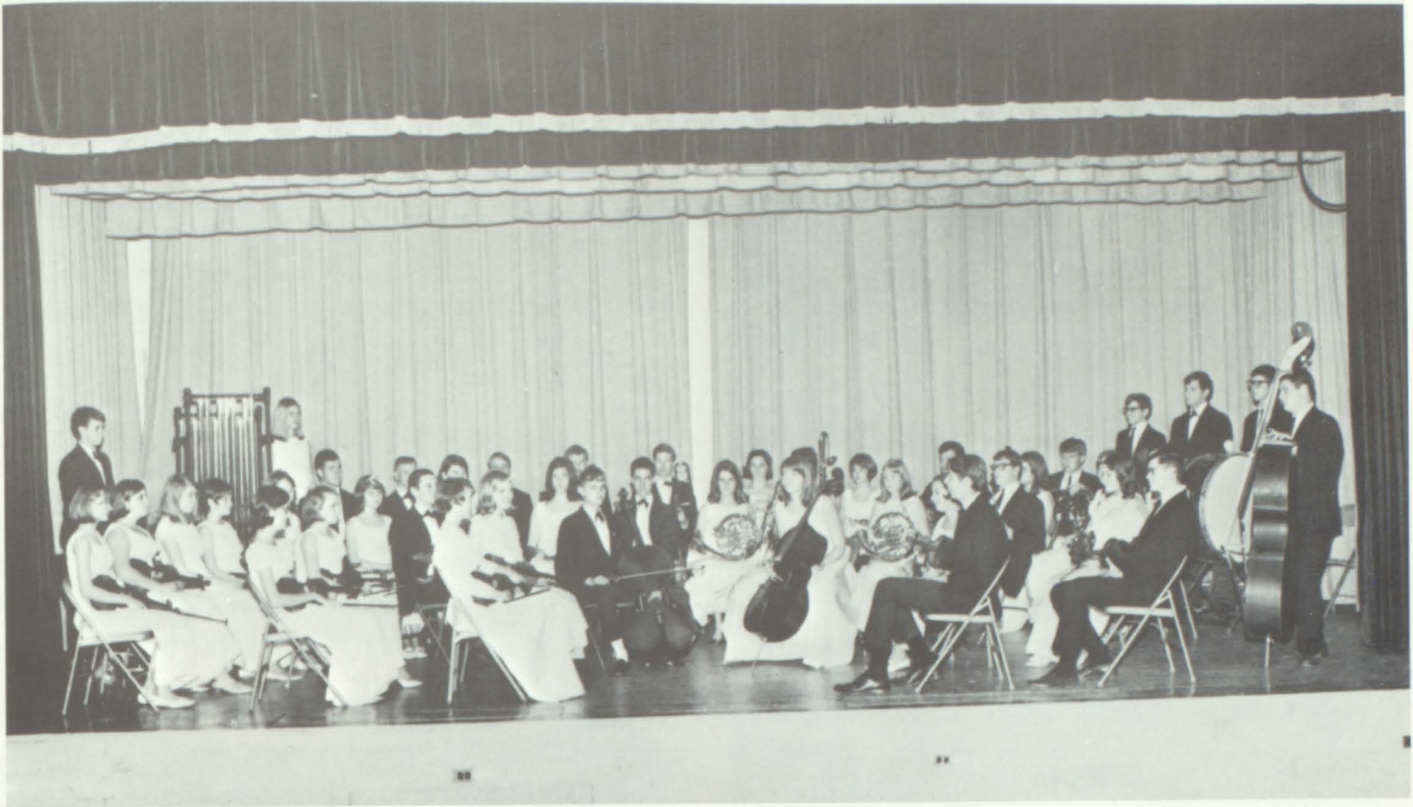
## Hapeville's Twirlers Show Talent And Versatility

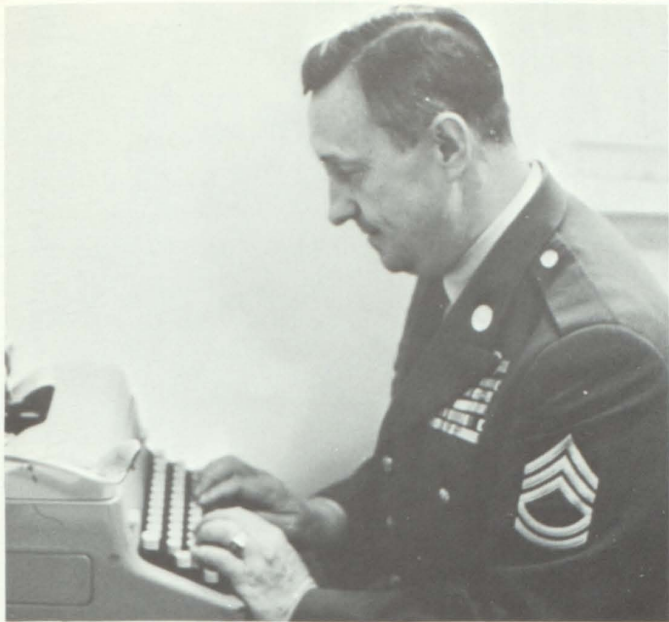

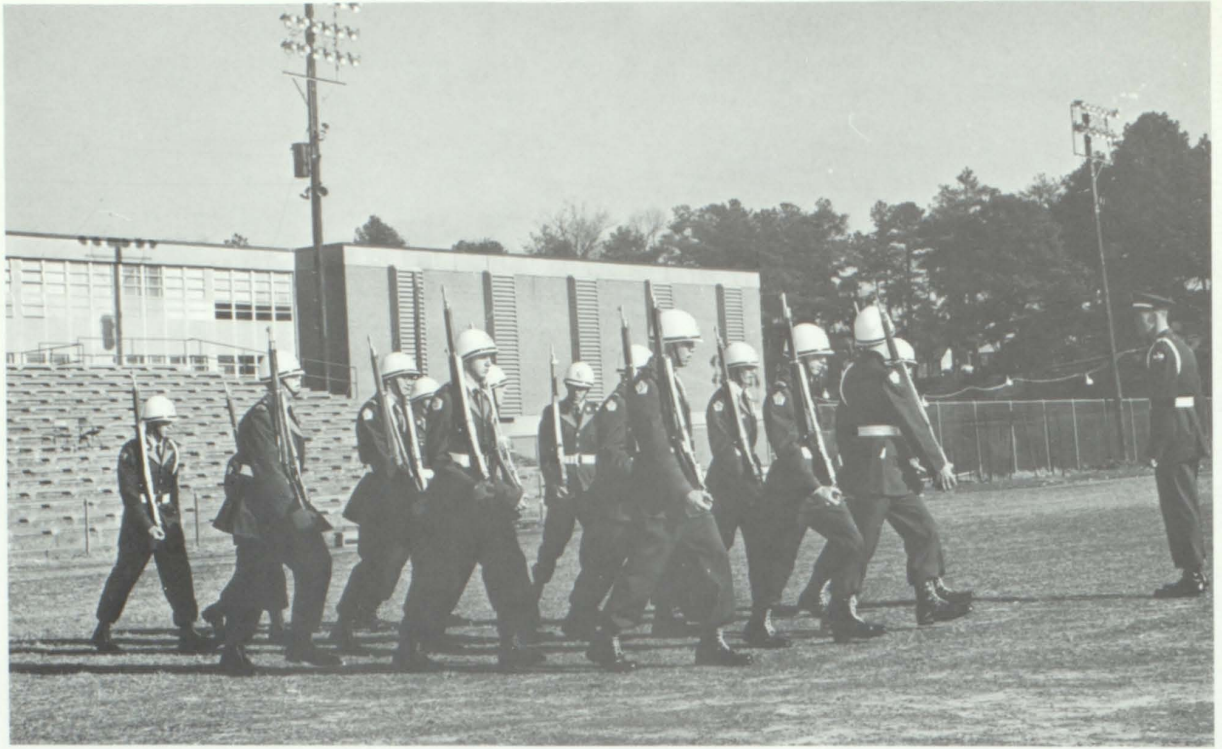
## A-Company Works Toward High Goals

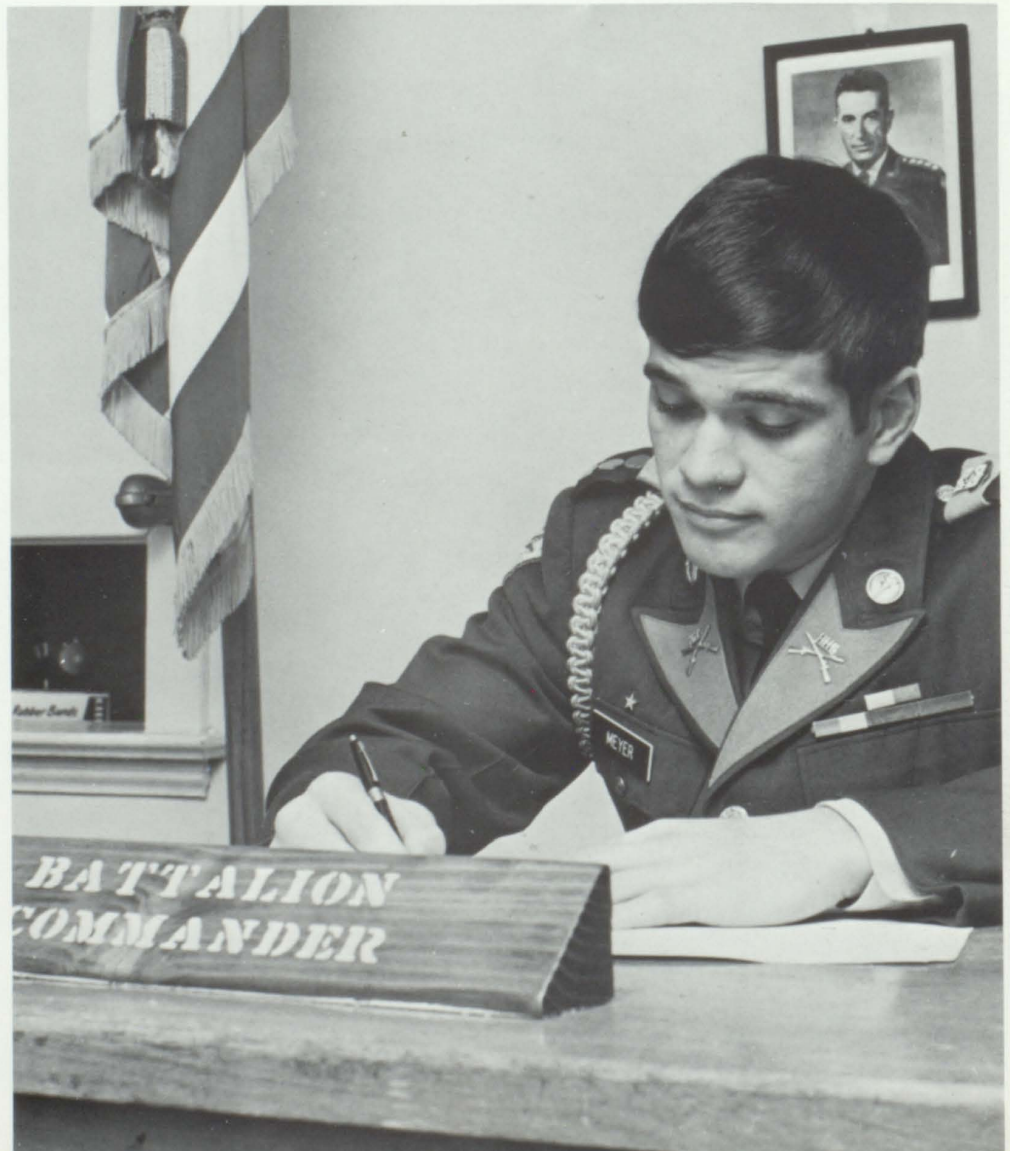

## Red Cross Volunteers Aid Students And Faculty

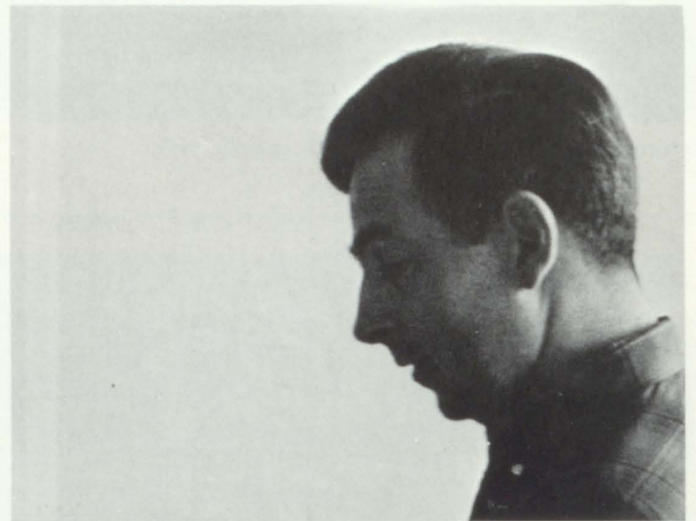

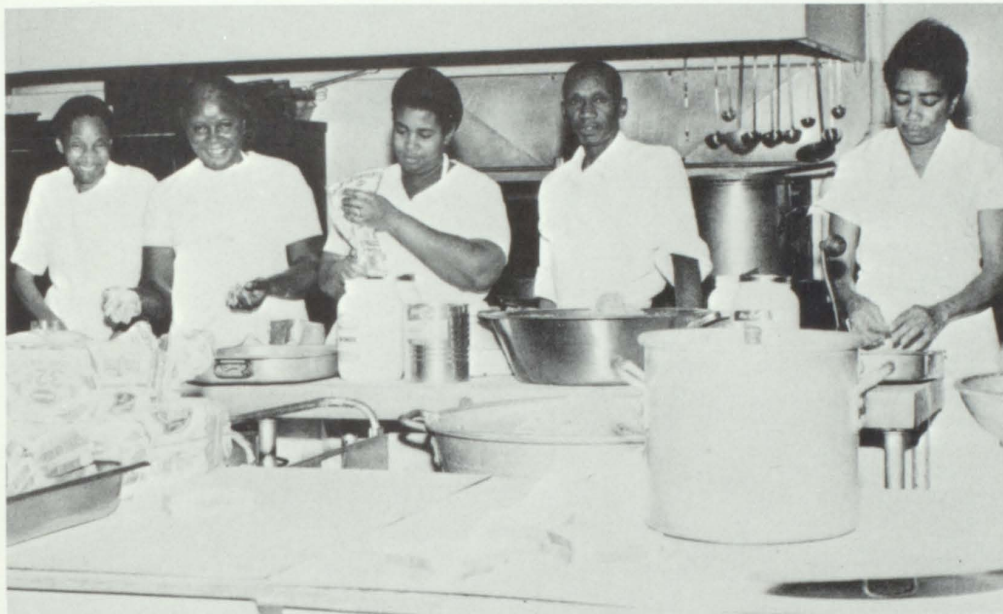




## Cafeteria Staff Tries New Ideas

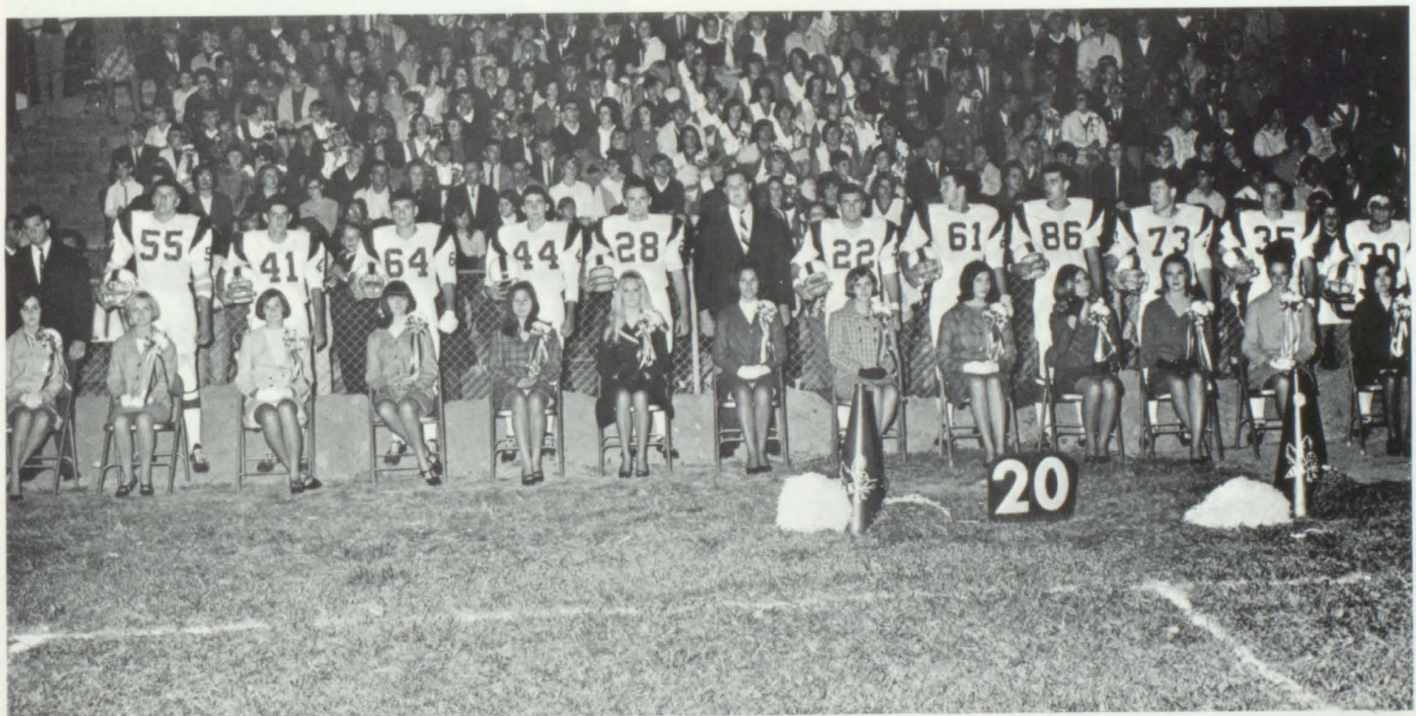

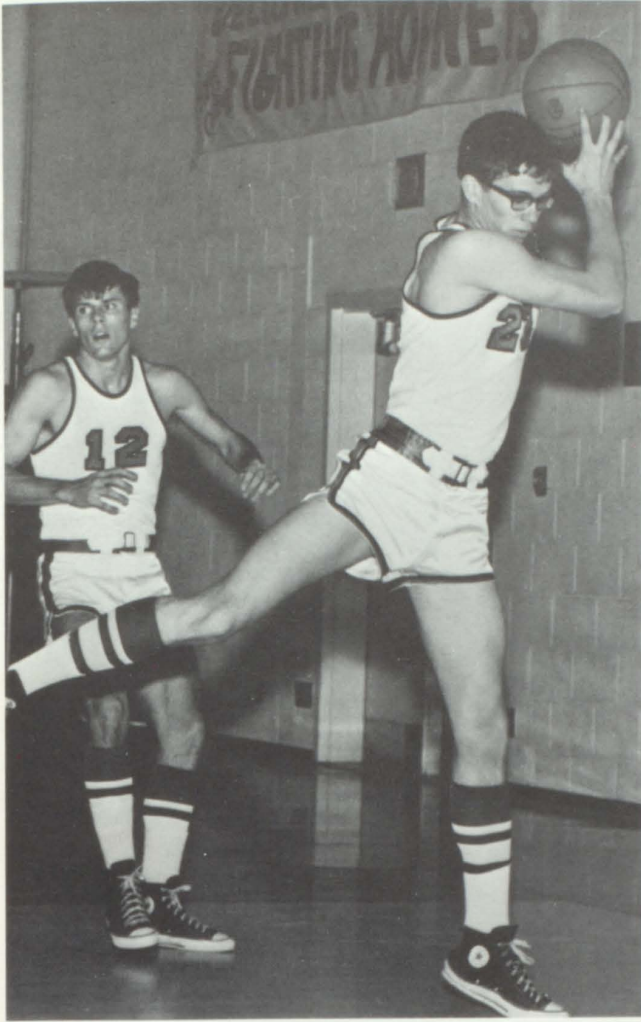

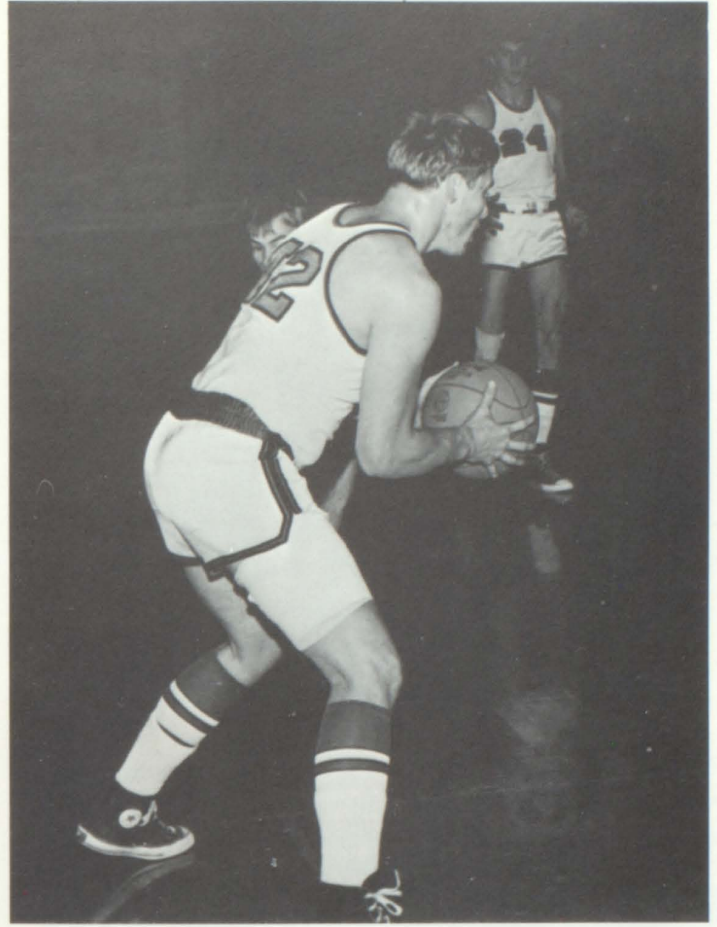

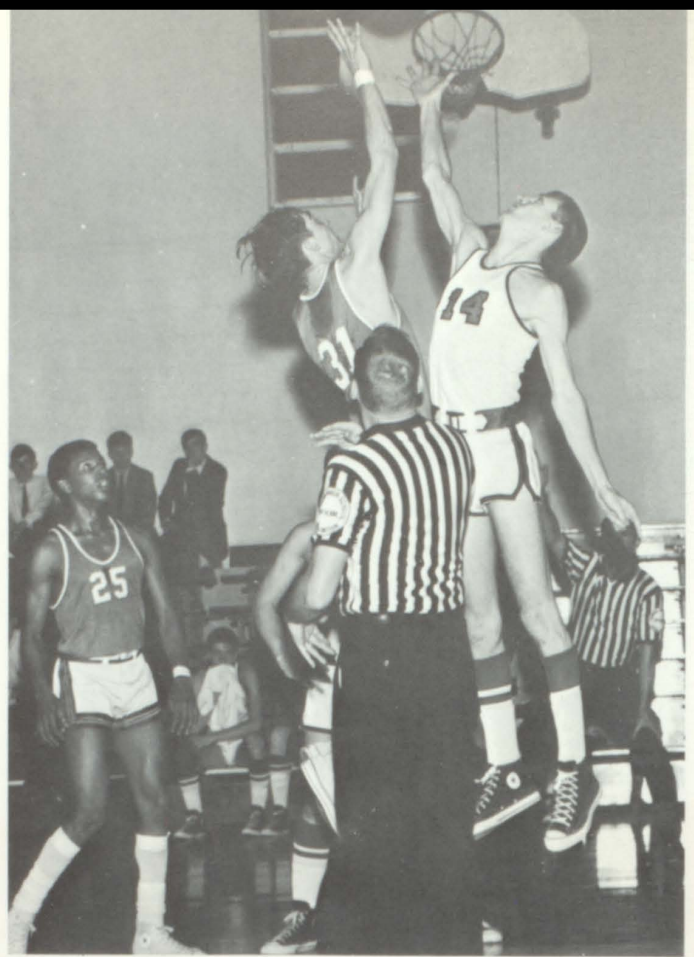

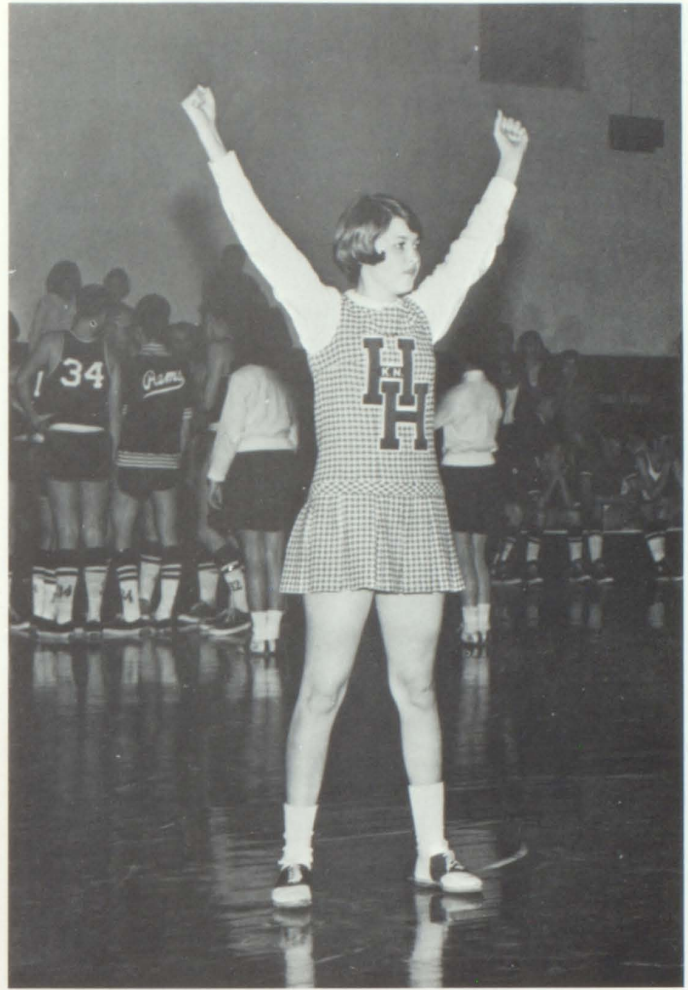

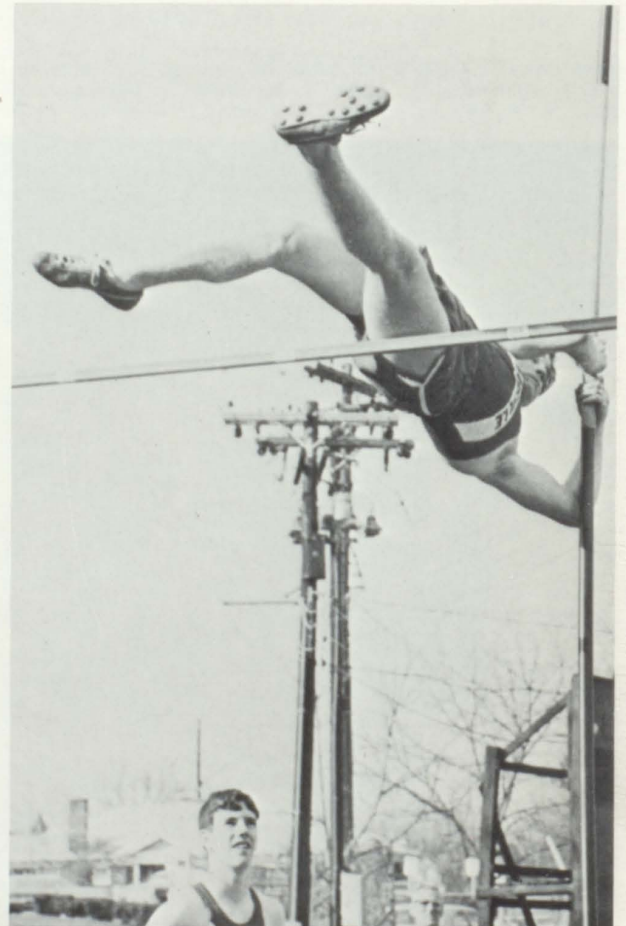

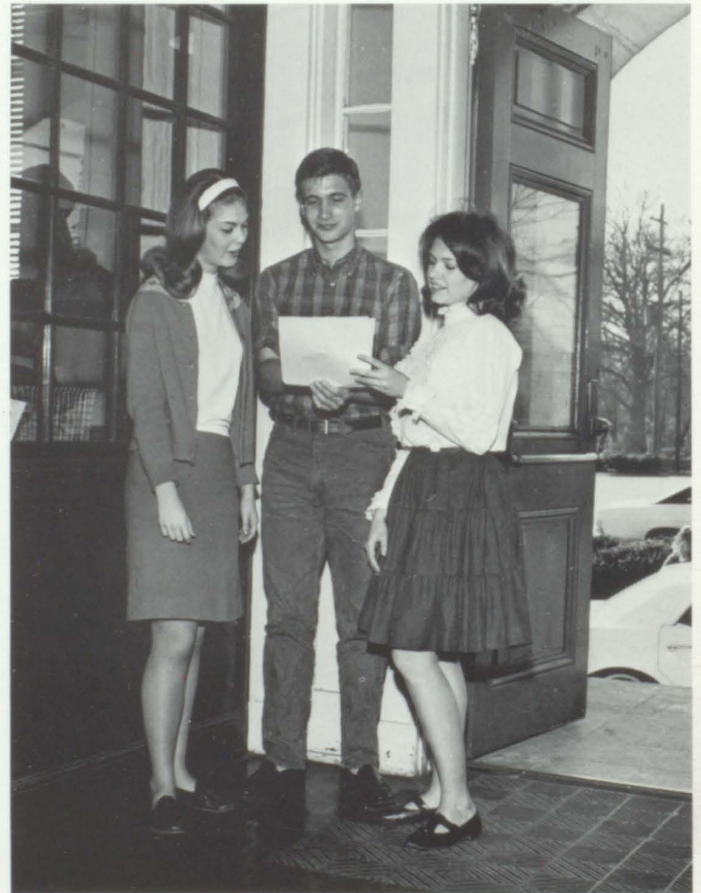

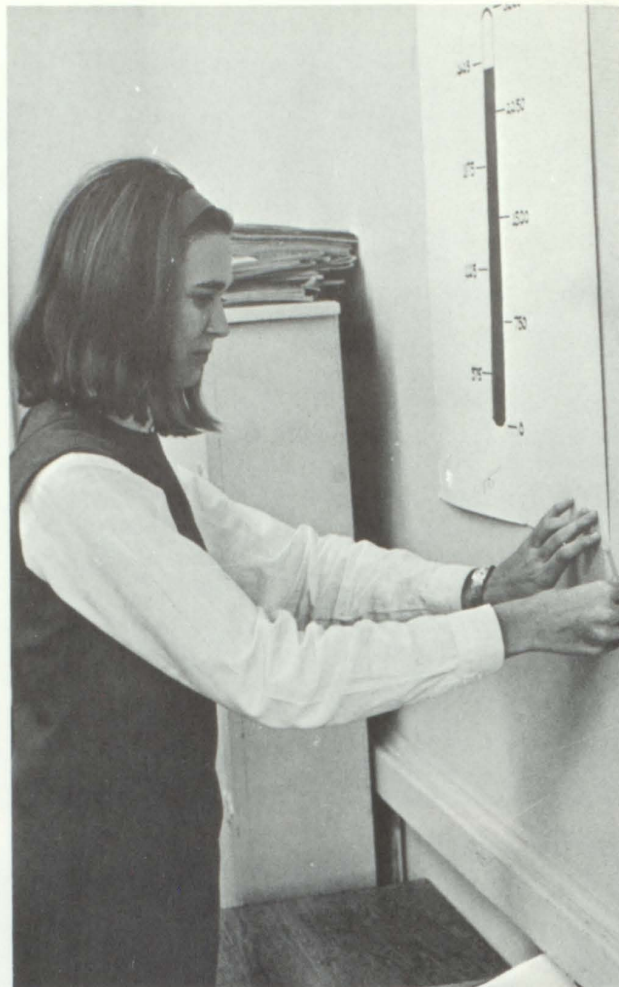

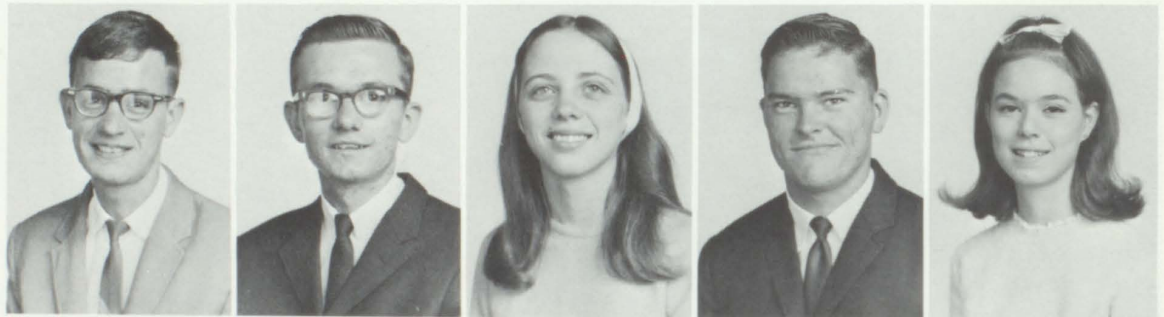
## Juniors Prepare To Take Over The Leadership Of The School

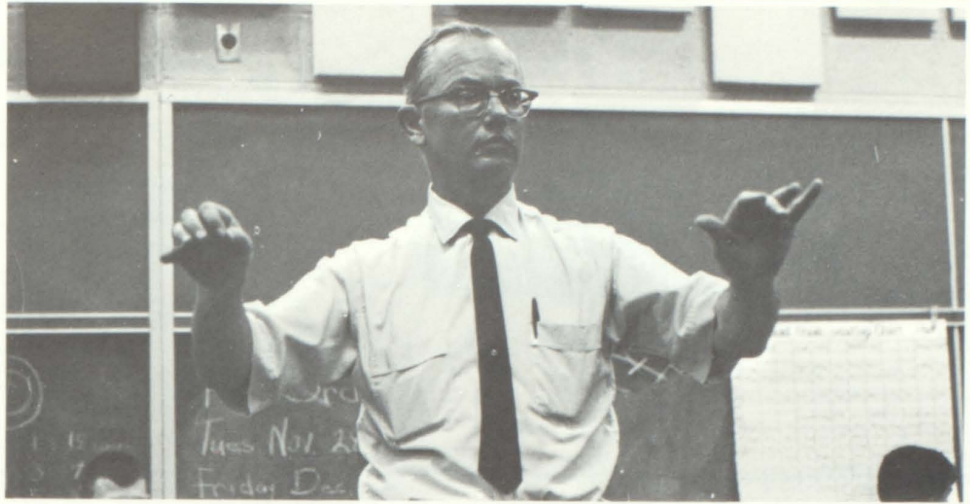
