Yes, our class has been a wonderful one - rock painting, totem-pole protecting, Laramie beating and all!



In our next battle against Casper, the T-Birds were overpowered by the Mustangs.



rich, mature sound.









as 'Climb Every Mountain', 'Do, Re, Mi', and 'My Favorite Things'.


