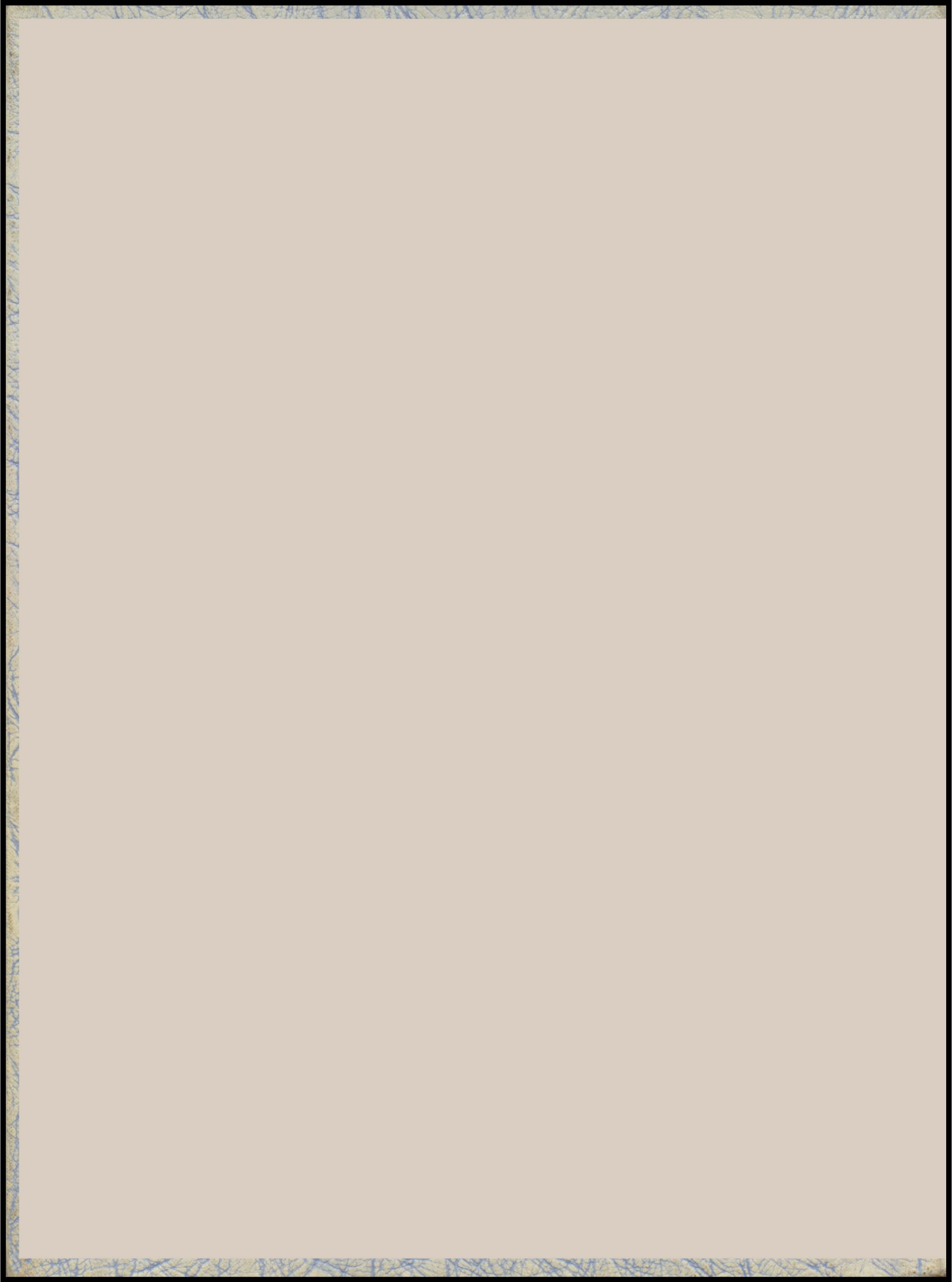

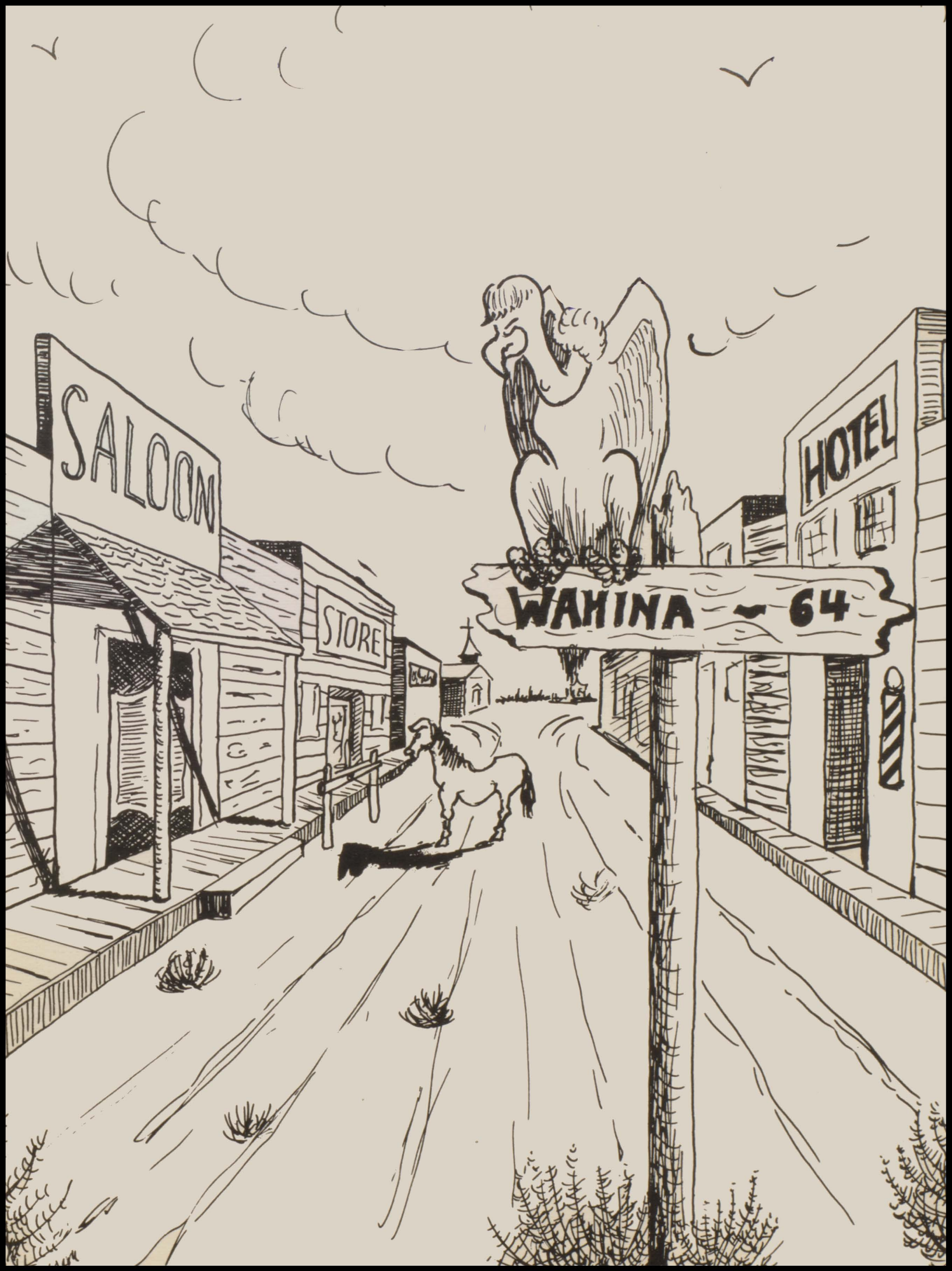

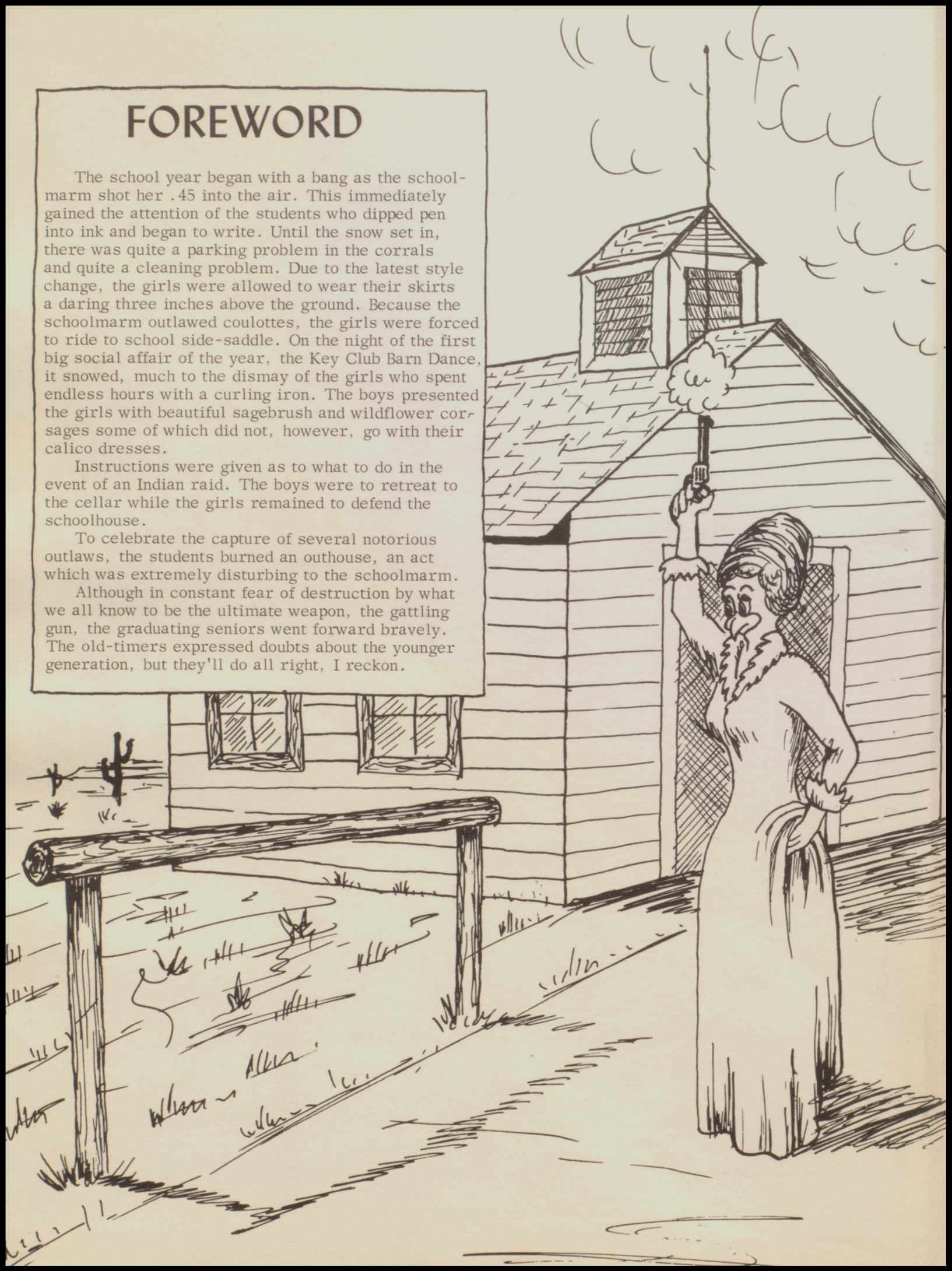
FOREWORD

Included in this department are home economics, agriculture, wood and metal shops, mechanical drawing and distributive education.



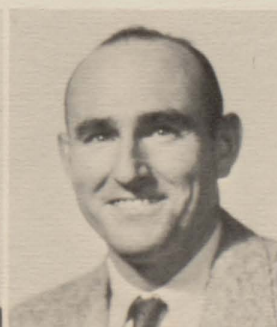

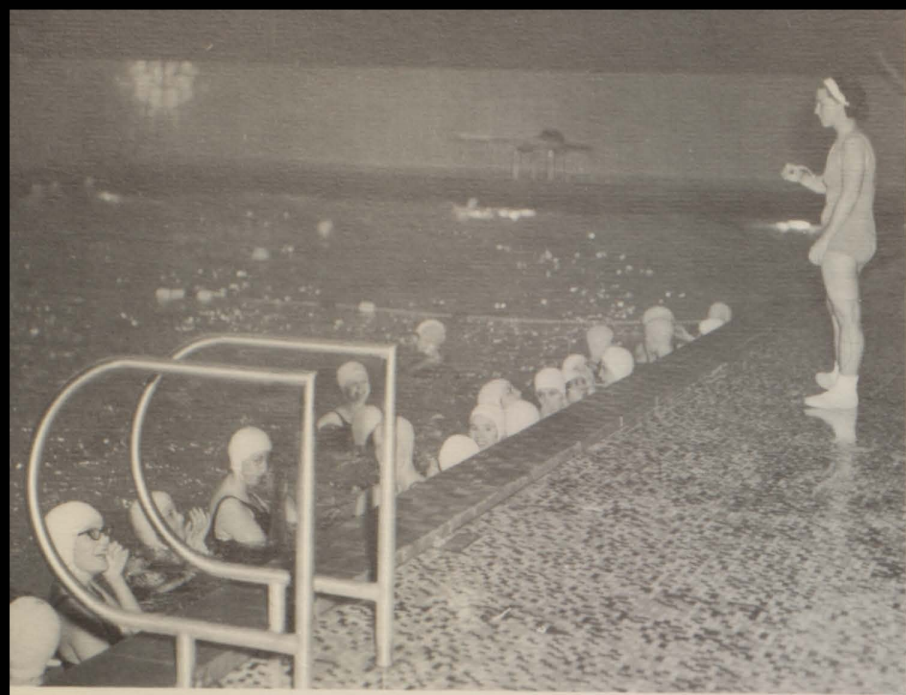

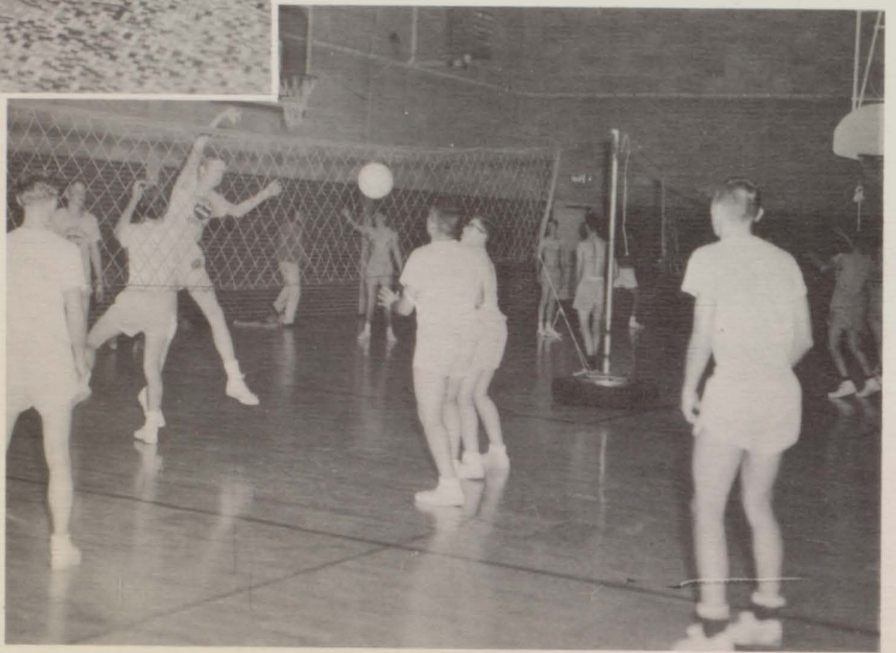

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

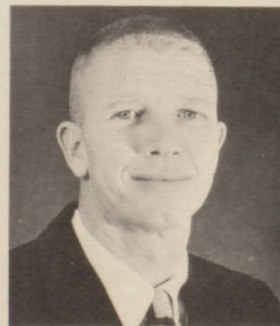

The season opened on August 30, in a game against Central, which proved to be strictly defensive. Mike Cartwright ran for six, after blocking a Central punt. Keith (Peaches) Beckwith later grabbed an Indian fumble and earned another score for East. All T-Bird fans were glad to know that this was only a practice game for the two teams.

It was East all the way, as the T-Birds nailed the Tigers at Sterling on September 6. In the second quarter, Tom Flohr made the first score on a 23-yard roll out play. Near the end of the same quarter, Dave Ward fought across the line for another TD. In the third quarter, Brent Fabian added one more touchdown to the T-Bird tally. For the final score, Tom Flohr broke loose for a 95-yard sweep around the end. The extra points were all made by the combined team of John Whitney, holding, and Jack Lane, kicking.

Entering battle against Sidney on September 13, two sustained drives through the line earned two touchdowns for East. Scorers in the game were Fabian and Cartwright. Danny Madrid sent a blocked punt into the end zone for a safety. Once again the extra points were made by Lane and Whitney.

At Rawlins, on September 20, our boys met a club inspired with the pressures of Homecoming. In a mud-covered field, East found its main strength in the middle of the line. Fabian scrambled across for the sole East touchdown. The extra point was carried by Cartwright. Everyone thought that the T-Birds would have won by a greater margin, had the field been dry.

On September 27, after travelling 300 miles, East arrived at Rapid City with hopes of being the first team from Cheyenne to defeat the Cobblers. Throughout the first half, both teams were held scoreless. In the final quarter, Fabian charged across to give six points to the T-Birds. Lane and Flohr handled the conversion. The tough Cobblers, however, outlasted our team in a fourth quarter stand.

In another defensive battle, East won its Homecoming on October 1 over Rock Springs. Dave Ward and Tom Flohr scored, leaving the extra points to Jack Lane.

In a hard-fought game against Casper, the T-Birds failed to earn enough points, as a 78-yard pass from Gary Rusk to Brent Fabian accounted for the only East touchdown.

On October 26, East lost the game to Laramie because an extra point attempt missed the crossbars. Tom Flohr scored the single East touchdown in a disappointing game which was attended at Laramie by 500 loyal fans.

East found the going easier against Torrington on November 1. Ward and Flohr scored two of the three East TD's. Lane maneuvered all three extra points.

In a final game against Central, East never got into motion as Dave Ward carried the only score for the T-Birds. All loyal fans were sad to lose the trophy and end the season in this way.

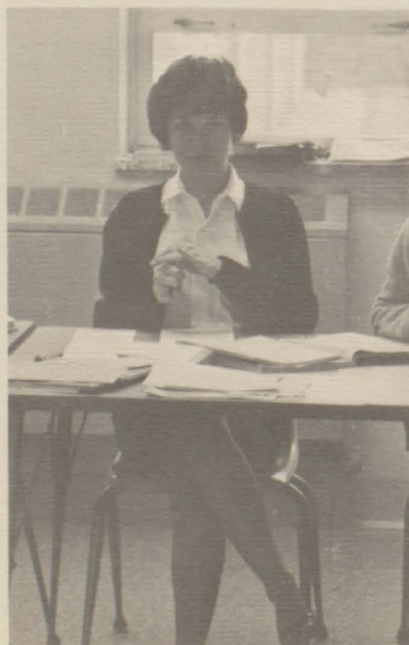

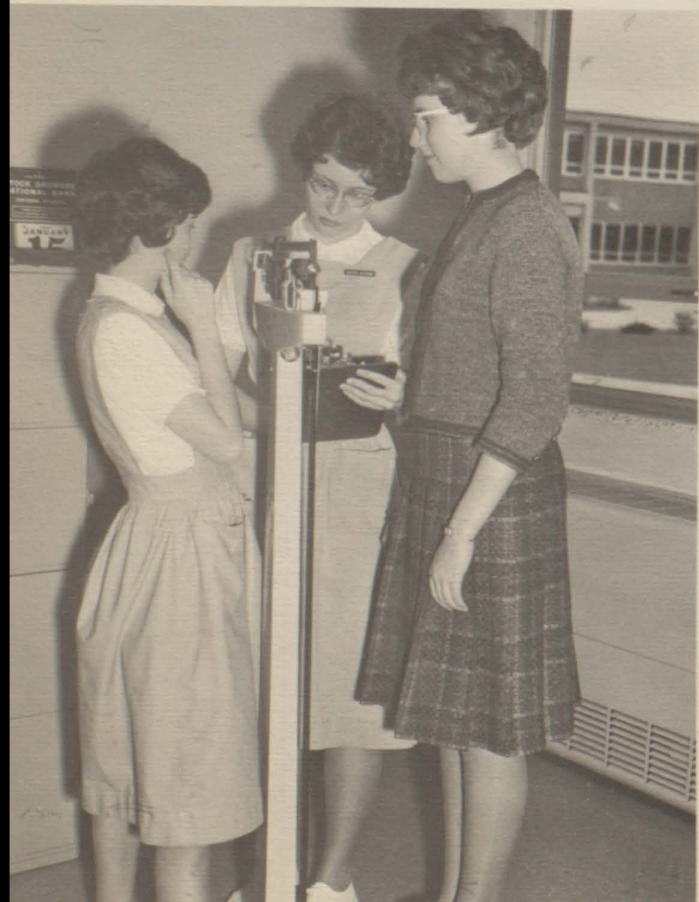

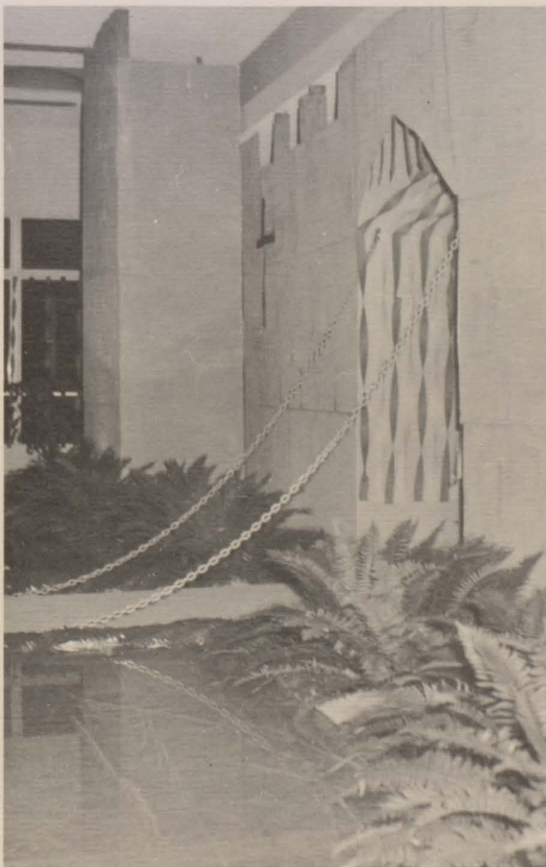

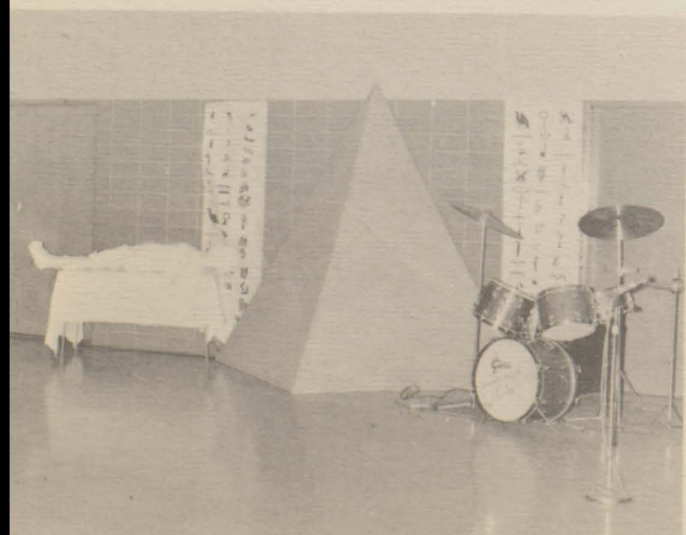
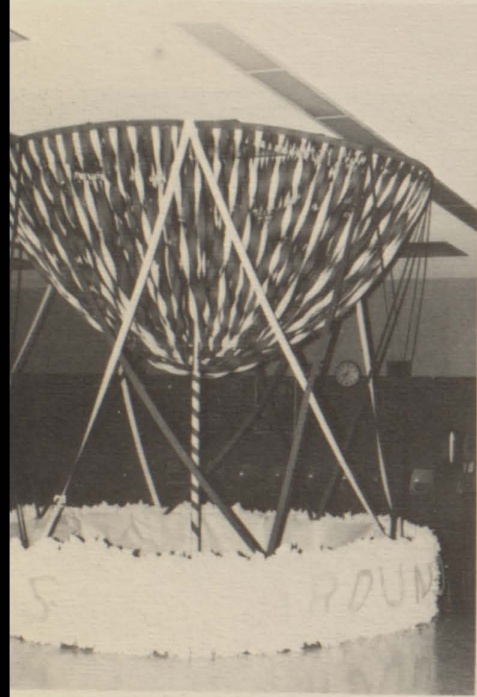
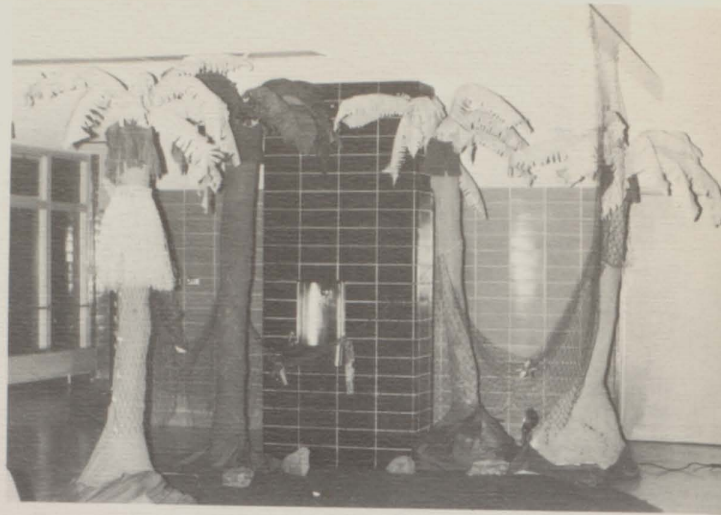


JUNIOR VARIETY SHOW
