How many people actually know for what the name WAHINA actually stands? The actual word "Wahina" was chosen soon after East High School was formed. It was taken from an Indian word which meant "Thunderbird" in accordance with the newly-chosen symbol of our school - the Thunderbird.

In addition, the Wahina represents many long hard hours of planning and preparing and many sacrifices by its staff in order to produce one of the best yearbooks in the state. We thank the Wahina staff for their time and contributions.




Tradition


















Student Life





























Faculty

The instructors have succeeded in achieving an atmosphere of friendly rapport between themselves and the students. This helps to maintain a relaxed environment throughout all phases of school life.


















Building








Junior Class History






Lost In Space





Senior Class Play


"THE DIARY OF ANNE FRANK"
