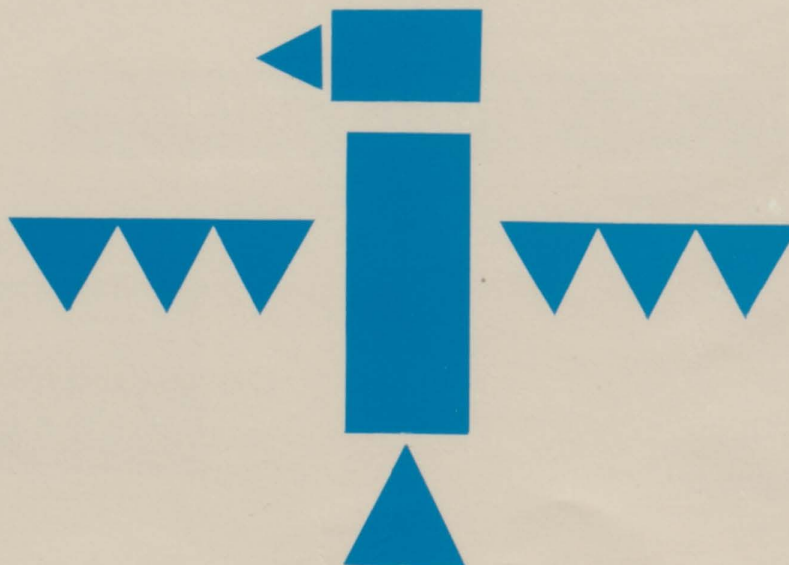

We, the staff of the 1967 Wahina, feel that our school motto, "Excellence In Everything", describes our beloved school perfectly.

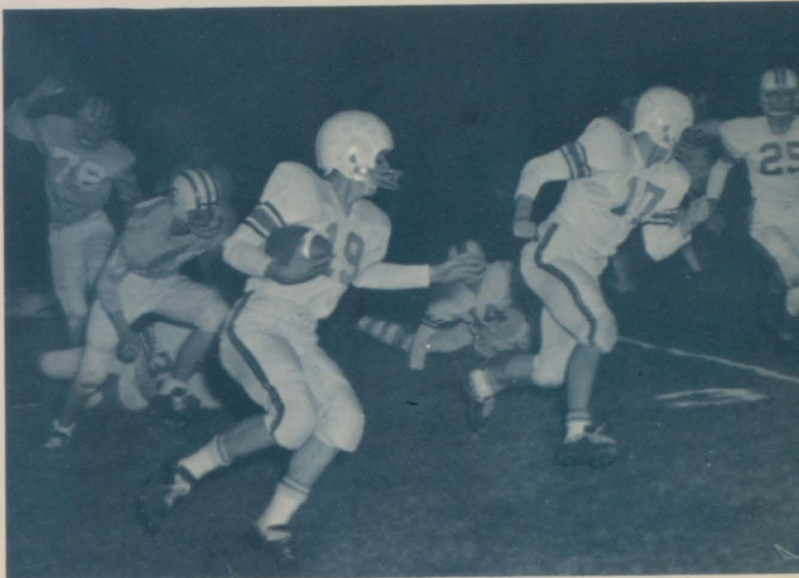

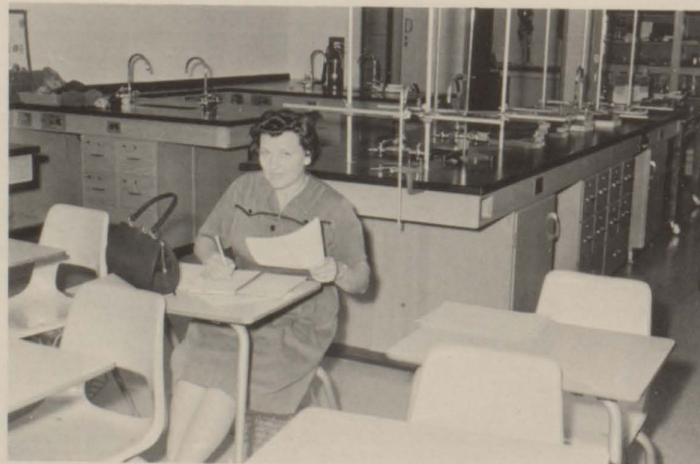
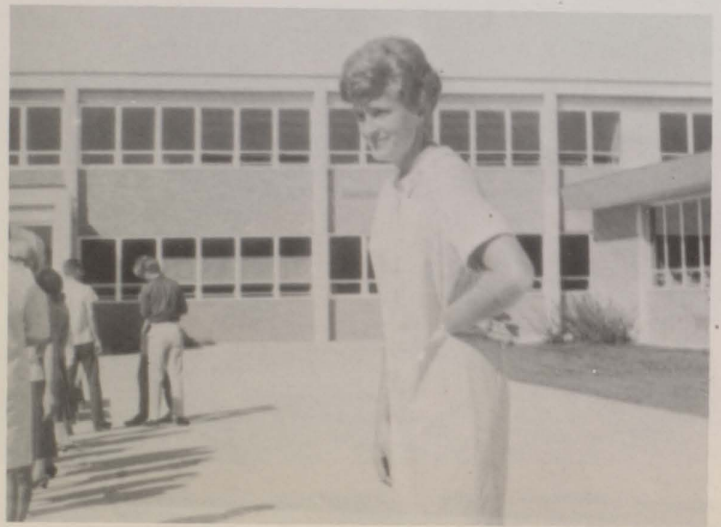


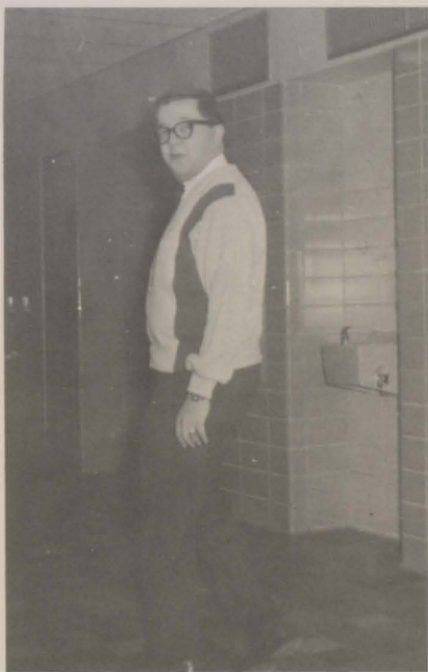
Faculty

The instructors have succeeded in achieving an atmosphere of friendly rapport between themselves and the students. This helps to maintain a relaxed environment throughout all phases of school life.



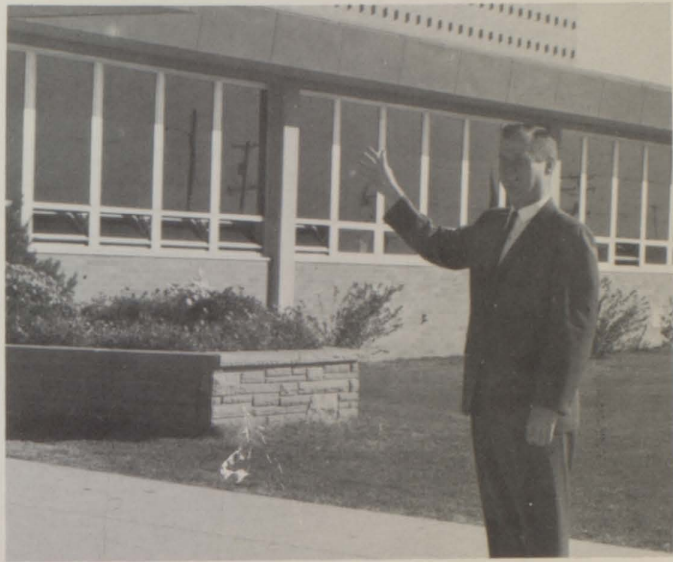


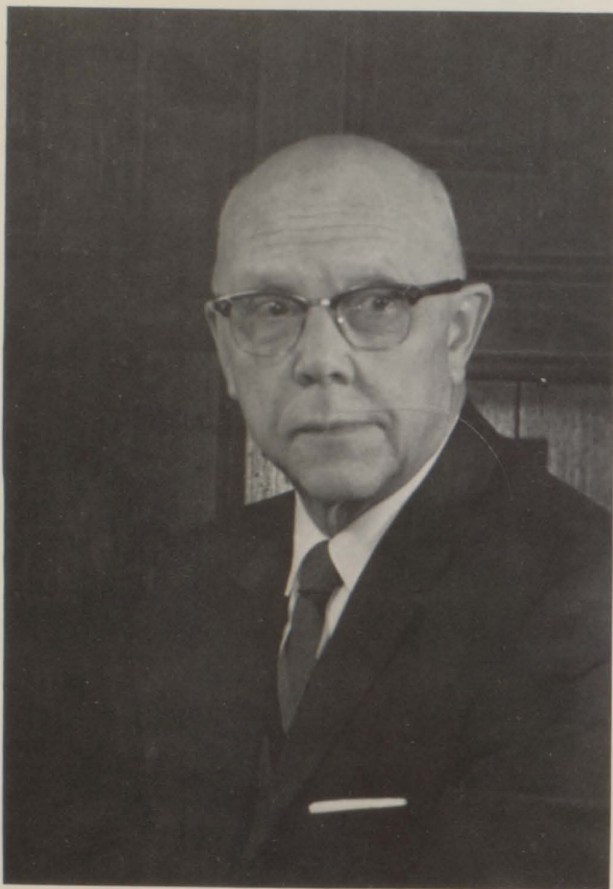
Building

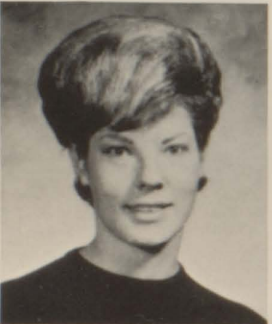

To evaluate what is read.

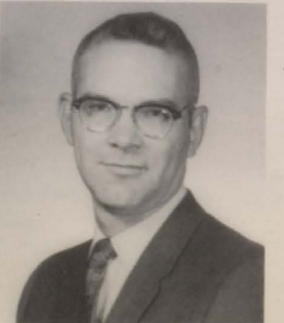

N. H. S.

National Honor Society is an organization whose object is to create an enthusiasm for scholarship, to stimulate a desire to render service, to promote worthy leadership, and to encourage the development of character in students. Members are chosen by the faculty on the basis of four ideas: Scholarship, Service, Leadership, and Character.

Candidates eligible for election into National Honor Society must be in the upper third of their class, and must have maintained, up to the time of election, a scholastic average of a 2.0 or better. Although these are rigid requirements, National Honor Society is even more select. Not more than 10% of the enrollment of the junior class and not more than 15% of the enrollment of the senior class may be elected to membership.

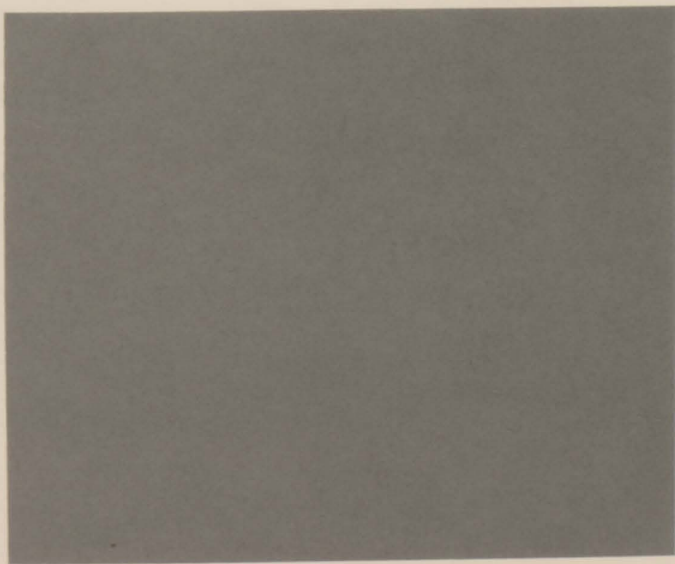
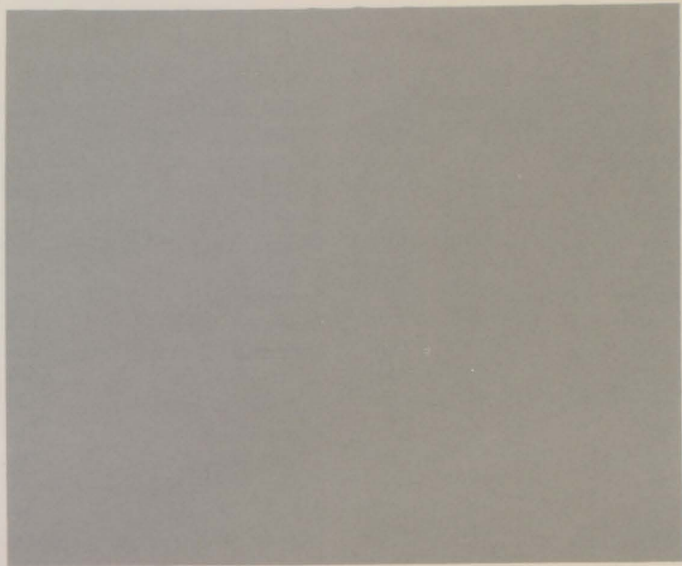
Afghanistan

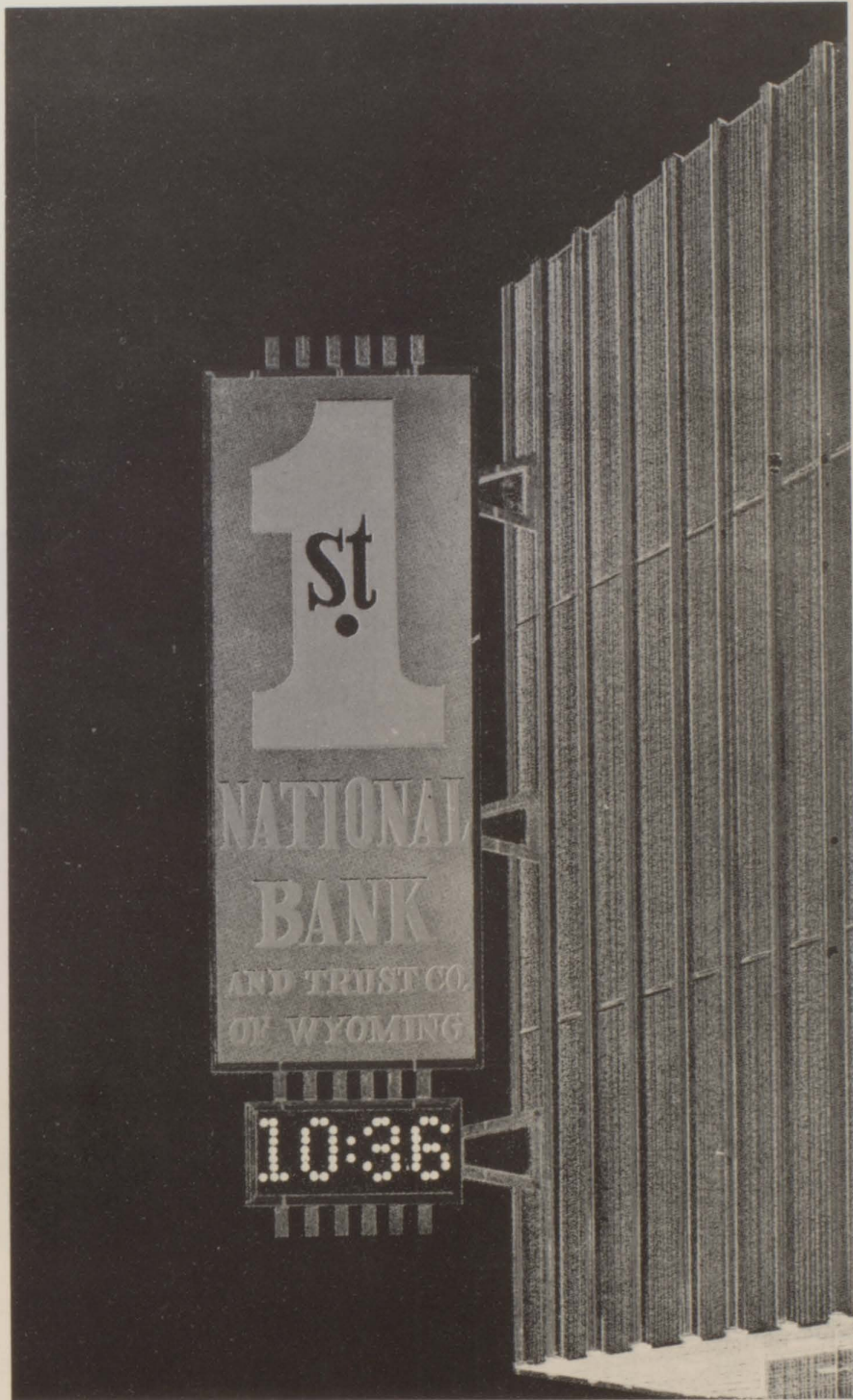

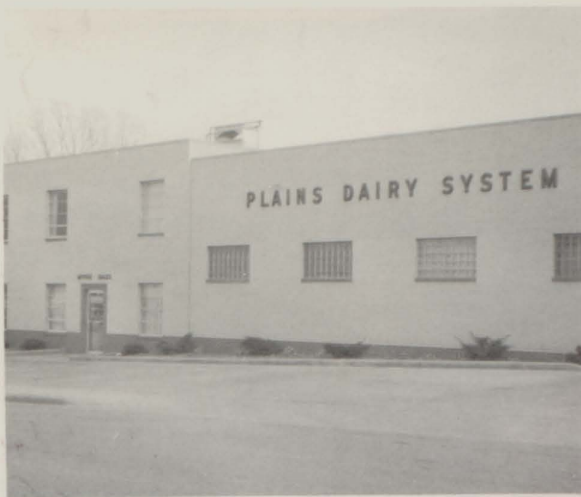
