The seniors of ' 63 have the distinction of being the first class to have attended East High for the entire three years of its existence.

As sophomores we attended the split sessions in the old Cheyenne High building. Girls are not likely to forget the drippy hair or fashionable suits of their sophomore swimming classes. Whether working in Student Senate or playing on the football team, we lent a hand in establishing the new East High School.

In the fall of 1962 we forgot the leaky ceilings and battered desks of the old building as we moved into the new "plant." Many will recall the hours spent on the junior class float, "Clean up the Tigers, " for the homecoming parade. Many of the highlights of our junior year were in sports. Counting on a fast backfield and fourteen returning lettermen, East High's football team entered the ' 62 season hoping to better the previous season records of East's short history.

In a preseason game against Central on August 31, over 4000 fans saw the underdog Indians surprise the T-Birds 12-6. East's offensive mistakes allowed Central to take a $2-1$ edge in this cross-town rivalry, but did not break our determination.

Breaking the Sterling jinx with a $26-0$ victory on September 7 put East in the winning column. Two juniors, halfback Mike Cartwright, and quarterback John Whitney, accounted for all the touchdowns.

East lost its first road game to Sidney, Nebraska, 14-0 on September 14. More offensive mistakes plagued the team in this game, although David James, a new junior, did well at halfback, replacing injured Bob Fintus.

Homecoming spirit and more experience proved a good combination as East defeated Rawlins 26-0 on September 21. Rawlins' defense couldn't hold the East attack led by Bob Fintus, Ron tenBensel, and John Whitney.


A series of road trips got off to a bad start as East lost to Sheridan 27-0 on September 28. East came close to the goal line in four different drives, but couldn't seem to crack the Sheridan defense.

The morale of fans and players was heightened as East came from behind to upset its next road opponent, Rock Springs, 33-20.

Supported by three busses of EHS students, the team played one of its best offensive games of the season against Casper on October 19. It seemed another upset was in the making as East held Casper 6-0 going into the fourth quarter, but two desperation touchdowns by Casper gave East its first conference loss of the season.

The second conference loss came October 26 as the Laramie Plainsmen defeated East 35-0. East could not control Laramie's smooth running ground game.

Planning to surprise the skeptics, the T-Birds, prepared for the final important Central game on November 2. Boosted by the $100 \%$ support of East Students, the team had only defeat in store for the Indians. Two quick first-quarter touchdowns and Brent Fabians's interception gave East a 21-0 half-time lead. The stunned Indians tried unsuccessfully to come back in the second half. Another T. D. with less than two minutes to play made the score, 35-20, the largest so far in the series, and secured the third place conference spot for East.

This season's ten senior players will be missed next year, but the experienced underclassmen should lead the team through a successful ' 63 season.

## SWIMMING

East High's swimming T-Birds ended the '62-'63 season with one of the best performances in their three existing years. In dual competition the T -Birds won four of seven outings. Of nineteen teams that entered the 14 th Annual D. U. High School Invitational Swimming \& Diving Championships, the T-Birds placed sixth. The TBirds won first place in the first Cheyenne Invitational Swimming Meet. Cheyenne East placed third in the state swimming meet at Laramie.
For the first time in T-Bird history, state swimming records are held by East swimmers. Dave Shelton was the first to hold a state record by virtue of his preliminary time. Dave swam second in the finals, losing both first place and his short-lived record to a Powell backstroker. Present record holders for East are Perry Pendley in the 100 yd . breaststroke, bettering the state record by one full second with a time of $1: 12.2$, and John Carmen in the 200 yd . individual medley with a time of $2: 32.0$, bettering the state record by .8 of a second. John also broke the state record of $1: 05$ with a time of $1: 04.0$ in the 100 yd . butterfly.
