## **Coordinator System** Installed at East High

The coordinators said they all enjoy working at East and with both faculty and students. They said they feel this new system is working out well and will try to improve on it as the need arises.

Although Garmon has a small staff of four or five to help put out the 15 issues of the THUNDERBOLT that are expected this year, he says that through the help of club reporters and other outside assistance, the students can expect a topnotch paper.

"I have a very small staff,"

Garmon said, "but they all have big ideas. I think by the end of the year, we can make this paper No. 1 in the state.

"I have a very fine sports editor, Dwayne Zobell, that knows what he is talking about when he writes a story. He himself is involved in the sports program here at East. My three news-men, Bob Campbell, Joe Braly and Becky all look to be good writers," Garmon added.

Garmon then spoke of THUNDERBOLT business manager Randy Child.

"He will probably be the best business manager; in the history of the THUNDERBOLT, I got him started kind of late but once he got going he was selling ads like mad. Without him, I doubt that the staff and I could put out an eight page paper this first issue."

Garmon added that the THUNDERBOLT was probably the only high school paper in Wyoming to publish only a weekand-a-half after school started.

Virginia Allen is sponsor of the THUNDERBOLT for her 12th consecutive year.

Both editors agreed that . it will be because of the changes in format that really decides whether or not their medias are well received by the students.

Miss Sanchez is keeping secret about most of the annual in hopes of surprising the students and presenting them with a respectible yearbook.

The 17-year-old editor said she hopes to depict the student life both at East High and in the community and that the book will cover everybody not just the popular students.

A change that Miss Sanchez says will help the yearbook a great deal has been a change in com-

panies. The Wahina is now being published by Walsworth.

Garmon says he hopes that his experience at working on both the Wyoming State Tribune and Wyoming Eagle staffs will help him to put out good newspapers. Garmon, at the present, is sports editor for the Wyoming State Tribune and student page editor for the Wyoming Eagle. He also takes pictures for both papers.






Looking back, the season record is misleading. Sure, East played some pretty sad games, but they also had more than their share of bad luck. Through this experience, we should look for better things next year.


Coach Art Phillips was the engineer behind all this winning. Indeed, Phillips has had a winning tradition at East for the past ten years.

All of us will remember that Homecoming 1972 was a well-planned, well-run series of fabulous experiences that showed how fine the East High student body really was.




















AS A SENIOR, WHAT SUGGESTIONS WOULD YOU LEAVE FOR IMPROVEMENT OF EAST HIGH?

I wouldn't improve East. I think it's great the way it is. The improvements come with the students and faculty as they get to know each other better on an educational and personal level.





#### **AUGUST**


The 1972-73 school year began on Friday, August 25. Sophomores were not only the new faces around East High School; Mr. Roy Troyer, principal, was also an addition. Several changes had been made with the administration. Each class had its own office, coordinator, and counselor. This was the year school began at 8:00 and the students were released for an hour lunch. The sophomores were not allowed to pick their teachers at registration; but were given first choice of classes, to the dismay of some seniors.

#### SEPTEMBER


#### APRIL


#### MAY


