I sure would like to run into Bill but I guess we are many miles apart. I am on a small Island in the Western Pacific and I would like to say which one but can't now. You have heard of it and heard of it plenty but maybe you will want to know more if I get home O.K.

I've seen a lot that will forever be on my mind. I've never been in combat but I've seen plenty of dead Japs and some live prisoners. I sure don't sleep very sound yet and won't do long as there are live Japs running loose. Tell every one there I would like to see them and if its Gods will I will be back someday. Give my regards to Bill when you write. Hope to hear from you again soon. Letters sure mean alot on an Island like this one. Remember us in your prayers.
