It is now that I make pleasur in writing you a few lines to let you know that I am still in the land of the living hoping ~~this~~ these few lines will find you all enjoying the best of health I have no news to write you this time more than ever have got a plenty of hard work to do it is rumerd her to day that Sharlett has ~~gone~~ gave up and if that be So I Don't See anything to hendr the Yankees from coming thru and when ever they thru N. C. W I dont see any use of us staying here any longer I all wae's have said when ever the Yankees got my home that I was not a going to stay her any longer for I dont think we could do any good Tho I am willing to stay here as long as we can keep them back I am afraid that when ever the Spring campaign opens that the Yankees will whip us for our lines is a getting so weak that we are well fottifide her if we had the men they never could whip us The men is what is likeing here and we would ~~want~~ like to have some more rashons then we have got tho our brigaid getts more rashens then any other troops that ar about ~~here~~ here for the most of the men get meat onst a week and we get some x every day we are a getting some brandy now and we will get some this evening.


