We had 'em for

we come up here on.
The food here isn't
very good. We have
chicken pretty often.
There isn't much if
any supplies coming in
here, as all the American
troops are moving off.
We have another
month or so here.

As you say there
is no need of us
here but it takes a

long time to get the
troops moved. Combat
troops get priority.

Bay! They are really
discharging iron in the
states now. A million
last month.

I'm not doing any
thing hardly now. Just
laying around afternoons
work about 2 hrs.
mornings. Not bad at
all if the food was
any good.

Well take it easy,
I hope you miss the
"flu."

Dear Mother,

How are things going there? I am doing O.K. We have practically closed down here. Only about two wards left open and we have a very few patients.

About forty of the fellows leave for home in a day or so. There won't be too many left. Most of them have over 40 months overseas.

The mail doesn't come in very good yet. I don't suppose it will ever improve here. I

gat five letters yesterday
but none today.

I have just been
listening to the World
Series a rebroad-cast.
The direct broadcast
would be heard here
around four o'clock in
the morning.

Has Wayne been
home yet? I havent
heard from him in
some time.

Have you missed the
"flop"? I hope so. Most
of the ventures seem to
have been down. Dad
wont work shaker as
a tobacco hand, had?

His hands blister very
easily dont they. Help
should be getting plentiful

again soon.

I thought the school teachers had gotten away from the habit of taking the kids to revivals. I guess there wouldn't be anyone there hardly if it wasn't for the kids, daytime I mean.

No the box Helen sent has not arrived yet. There hasn't been any 2nd class mail in for quit some time.

I hope Dean is doing O.K. Hope she isn't homesick.

Helen and the Jenkins seem to have had a slight mix-up. I guess its over by now. Helen said she'd probably go

down home to stay soon.
Every one here is
waiting around to go home
it seems. If we don't
go to Japan, I might
get home around next
spring otherwise I don't
know.

I don't know as I
need any thing at the
present. If I do need
any thing, I'll let you
know when we get
moved.

Thanks for the 'Xmas present I'll get it around April if we move before I get it. We should do something by next month at least. Things seem to happen awfully slow.

this time? ha. I heard from
Wayne yesterday, he had written
it when he was home. He said

They seem to be sort of swamped with work. I guess it all piles up at once. I'm not working much at present.

The food is pretty good now. We had a sort of "honeydew mellow" for supper. We have oranges now also fresh eggs and meat.

It's rather warm here tonight, even

There isn't much news
I don't know nothing. The
old men are still waiting
to go home. I don't know

over central here.
