A SKETCH OF THE / BOWMANS WRITTEN FOR D.F.BOWMAN in APRIL, 1914.

My great Grandfather Bowman lived in Rockingham County, Va. His wife's maiden name was Millhouse. The Indians killed her folks, all but her; she hid until they went away. My great grandfather moved a family to Washington county, Tennessee; and bought some land and on his way home he was taken sick and died about the year 1783, and soon afterward my great grandmother with her family moved to Tenn. They moved and settled on Boone's Creek at what is now called Floursville. She and her four sons and one daughter came to Tenn. Their names were Jacob, Daniel, Joseph and John and Catherine. Jacob lived in Tenn. for a while, then moved to North Carolina, near Bakersville. Daniel lived on Boone's Creek.

Joseph bought a farm on Knob Creek where Dr. S.J.Bowman now lives. He married a Miss Hoss. She was the mother of four children, one died when small. Their names were John, Elizabeth, and Susannah. John married Salina Broyles and lived near Johnson City. Elizabeth married Henry Bashor. Susannah married James Crouch. Their mother died and their father went to Rockingham county, Va. and married Christina Beahm in 1819. She was the mother of six children. Their names were Daniel, David, Joseph and Catherine, Mary and Sarah. Daniel married Catherine Lair, David married Elizabeth Garst; Joseph married Susannah Arnold; Catherine married John Lair; Mary married Henry Garst; Sarah married Jacob Clark.

Catherine Bowman, my great aunt, married John Miller. She was the mother of several children. Her daughter Margaret married Adam Sell. Catherine was very strong, and it was said that she could stand in a half bushel and shoulder three bushels of wheat.

My great grandmother Bowman married Isaac Hammer for her second husband. Daniel Bowman and Krouse organized the Church of the Brethren at Knob Creek in the year 1800. My great grandmother Hammer and her husband were buried in the Hammer graveyard. It is on the farm now owned by Dr. J.D.Thomas.

John was my grandfather. He lived where they first settled on Boone's Creek at what is now Floursville. He built one of the first flouring mills built in East Tennessee. He hauled the burrs from Richmond, Va. with six horses. He married Eve Elizabeth Steele. They owned a large boundary of land and were buried on it- on the farm now owned by D.Hale. They were the parents of fourteen children. Thirteen lived to be married.

They gave each a farm. Their names were: Benjamin, Jacob, Samuel, Isaac, Mattison, Susan, Rebecca, Sallie, Daniel, Mary, Catherine, John, and Joseph, and he married Mahala Carr; John married Eliza Miller; Daniel married Elizabeth Miller; Benjamin mar. Eliza Gates; Jacob married Sallie Campbell; Samuel married Margaret Hale; Isaac married Agnes Young; Mattison married Isabel Campbell; Susan married John Klepper; Rebecca married William H(?)ead; Sallie married Jacob Zimmerman; Mary married Jacob Highsinger; Catherine married Jacob Klepper; Joseph was my father.

He (Joseph) married Mahala Carr. They were the parents of fourteen children. Their names were Susan, Mary, Alfred, John, Richard, Calvin, Henry, Martha, Aly Ann, Bettie, Sarah Ellen, Julia, Joseph who died when small, one died in infancy.

Susan died single in 1865.

Mary married Robert White.

Alfred married Martha King. He was in the Confederate Army, and died with smallpox, near Vicksburg, Miss. and buried there in cemetery, Mar. 1863

John died single.

Richard married Mary White.

Calvin married Mollie Berry.

Henry married Ann King.

Martha married Isaac Hartsell.

Aly Ann married Henry Sellars. She died and left one son, Charley.

Bettie married D.C. Swadley; she died and left six children. he died before she did.

Sarah Ellen died single with lock jaw in Oct. 1867.

Julia married D.K. Brobeck.

My father Joseph Bowman was born August 18, 1805, and died January 23, 1896; aged 90 years, 5 mos, and 5 days. My mother Mahala Bowman was born April 22, 1811, She died Sept. 27, 1898, aged 87 years, 5 mos 5 days.

Richard Bowman was in the Confederate Army. He was captured the 17th day of May 1863, in Mississippi at Big Black. He was a prisoner twenty one months, lacking one day. He was first taken to Indianapolis, then to Fort Delaware, Md. then to Point Lookout, Md. from there he was sent to Richmond and got his furlough and started for home in February 1865. Richard Bowman, for whom this sketch was written, died with paralysis. He had the first stroke May 18th, 1912; second stroke May 7th, 1915; the third stroke when he died August 28th, 1914. He was aged seventy six years, nine months, and eight days.

## The Bowman of Tennessee

My great-great grandfather on my father's side was Jacob Bowman of Rockingham Country Virginia He was also my great great great grandfather on my mother's side. His children were Jacob, John, Daniel, David Mary, Catherine Joseph. He purchased a tract of land in East Tenn, Washington County in about 1783 & built before settling in the new home. His widow moved to Tennessee in 1801 (5) according to Mrs. Sallie Ackers of Broadway Va, two of her children remain in Va, at time of moving to Tennessee They were 1 David born Oct 20 1777, He married Catherine Grantz, the granddaughter of Bishop Michael Grantz she born Nov 9 1782, to this union 12 children were born, as follows (1) Jacob born April 9 1801 I have no date about him (2) Magdalene Born Jan 2 1803, married Joel Spitzer and moved to Missouri (3) Elizabeth married John Harber who was the mother of lat John C Harber of Harrisonburg (4) Catherine Born Nov 21 1806 first married Samuel Rhodes and later David Sherkley, Sallie Ackers was a daughter of first m and Johnston Sherkley of second (5) Susan married John Showalter, a brother of Christian she born Dec 1808 late W.J. Showalter of the National geographic magazine was a grand son

(6) Frances Born Mar 16 1811 married John Rhodes  
David Rhodes and Frederick of Pleasant Valley  
were her sons

7) Hannah married Christian Sites she born  
May 8. 1813 The late David Sites of Broad Way Va  
Mary who married a Bowman were her children

(8) Annie Born Sept 7 1815 married a Baker, Delilah  
was one of her daughters She married Henry & Rhodes

They moved to Missouri and founded a prosperous  
family in Ray County

(10) Sarah born ~~April~~ June 20, 1820 married  
Christian Showalters

(11) Lydia Born Dec 14 1822 married  
Philip Depoy They moved to West Virginia  
where they died

12. Joseph born Nov 8, 1827. I have no further date about his family.

2. Mary who married Samuel Young.

Dr. W. B. Young, for 18 years president of Bridge Water College came in this line.

My great great grandmother Bowman took the young children with her to Tennessee.

1. Jacob Jr. who lived for a while in Tenn and then settled at what is now Poplar and Bakersville N.C. He was a great hunter. He reared a large family. Some of his descendants were men of ability and prominence.

The present high school at Bakersville N.C. is named in honor of members of his family. I understand that some of his descendants moved to Kentucky.

2. Daniel who married Rebecca Zimmerman in 1780 before coming to Tennessee they settled on Boones Creek. He was my great great grandfather on my mother's side, they had six children as follow,

1. Jacob who married a Malobee, he died at 30 years of age.

2. Samuel who married Anna Crouch, he was my great grandfather on my mother's side. He was a prominent deacon in the church of the

brethren and his house was used as a place of  
worship by the brethren people

2- Daniel who married Alta Ellis.

3- John A. The famous preacher who married  
Mariah Washington.

4- Susannah who married Solomon House  
in her first and James Hankle in her second in  
to Katherine who married Daniel Heeler,

5- John who settled near Floursville on Book Creek he  
married Elizabeth Steel, fourteen children was born  
to them Benjamin who married Eliza Gates:

Joseph Bowman Sr a member of the Church of  
the Brethren was known as Deacon Joe  
He was a man of prominence and influence  
He was a Carpenter Contractor and builder  
He built the brick house on Knob Creek now in  
my possession in 1818 to this house he brought  
his second bride this was the farm home for his  
& 43 acre farm which he had bought from  
the Fair Fair heirs who had secured it by  
grant from the State of N.C. before Tennessee  
was organized He also built the large brick  
house on the W.R. Reeves farm now owned by  
John Clark (Hicks) He maintained a shop in  
which he employed a number of men - 20 to 30 it is  
said he built beds chest clock cases etc No doubt  
much of the old furniture on Knob Creek & Bear  
Creek came for his shop The brethren on Knob  
Creek used his <sup>home</sup> as place of worship for  
30 years in all probability The old Knob Creek  
Congregation was organized in his home The old  
Meeting house now standing He and his second  
wife are buried in the cemetery at the Knob  
Creek church The graves are well marked  
by stones placed by his son Joseph Jr

it is suppose that his first wife was buried  
in an old private cemetery on the farm  
which he owned it is located in what is  
called The grave yard field; all graves  
are without markers except plain limestone  
rock, My great great grand mother  
Bowman widow of Jacob Sr. married  
Isaac Hammer for her second husband  
after coming to Tennessee

They are buried in a private cemetery  
on the J. Q. Thomas farm now owned by  
Edgar Thomas, Isaac Hammer was a  
preacher of prominence among the  
Brethren and was associated with  
Michael House and others in organization  
of the Knob Creek congregation in about  
1802
