

**East Tennessee State University
Women's Reentry Scholarship**

The scholarship assists women who are older than the traditional college student and have made the commitment to attend ETSU. It is intended to help women prepare themselves academically at the undergraduate level with the training or retraining needed to enter the job market. The scholarship is designed to help fill the gap between the amount the ETSU Office of Financial Aid has awarded and the amount of actual need as determined by application to that office.

The scholarship was established in 1978 by interested faculty, staff and administrators at the University. Continuing support is also provided by the Johnson City and Kingsport chapters of the American Association of University Women and the Business and Professional Women's Chapter of Johnson City.

A committee composed of donor representatives is responsible for the application and selection process. Finalists are interviewed and scholarship recipients are chosen on the basis of need and personal commitment to clearly defined educational and career goals. Applicants must document eligibility for financial aid through the ETSU Office of Financial Aid.

Since its inception, 25 scholarships have been awarded in amounts ranging from \$50 to \$1000 for a total of \$7500. Donations are tax deductible and are eligible for the ETSU corporate matching program.
