I want to ask you for some information regarding our contract with the Virginia and Southwestern Railway Company.

During the month of December 1912 I turned in time ticket for sixteen(I6) hours overtime on clericial work. The railway Co. returned these tickets and refused to allow the overtime, claiming that they cannot pay overtime for clericial work. If I understand our contract, it plainly says that at stations where only one Operator or Clerk Operator is employed, ten hours will constitute a day and Operators being held on duty after the ten hours have been completed will be allowed overtime at the rate of thirty (30) cents per hour.

It is impossible for me to complete the clericial work assigned me during the ten hours and I want to know if the Company has any right to require me to do the clericial work and not allow evertime for same. A prompt reply will be appreciated.
