Ma Day lived in the mountains near Boone, NC as a single mother after the death of her husband, Paul. Her favorite son, Rodney, died of Scarlet fever (?), leaving two small sons, Ernest and Duke, in her care. Through connections with a kind woman from New Jersey, she was able to sell hand-made quilts and other sewn items - the subject of this letter.
