Sapphoan Literary Society

Constitution.

We, the students of the East Tennessee State normal school, in order to promote our literary attainments and to encourage the social welfare of ourselves and the school, do ordain and establish this Constitution for this society, This Nov. 13, 1911.

Article I.

This society shall be known as The Sapphonian Literary Society.

Article II.

Motto.

Labor conquers all things.

Article III.

Membership.

Section 1.

The members of this society shall consist of two classes: Active and Honorary.

Section 2.

Active members.

The active members of this Society shall be composed of the young women belonging to the normal department of this school.

Section 3.

Honorary members.

The honorary members of this Society shall be limited to the lady teachers, matrons and any other person receiving a majority of two thirds of votes of members present.

Article IV.

Officers.

The officers of this society shall consist of a president, Vice president, Recording and Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, Critic, Chaplain and Editor.

Article V.

Duties of officers.

Section 1.

President.

It shall be the duty of the President to preside over the meeting of the Society, enforce and observe of the constitution, By Laws, Rules of order of this Society, have a special watch over all the interests of the society, appoint committees and see that they perform the duties that are placed upon them.

Section 2. Vice President.

The duties of the Vice President shall be to assist the President and perform her duties in her absence.

Section 3. Recording Secretary.

The duties of the Recording Secretary shall be to call the roll, read the Minutes of the previous meeting take correct Minutes of all proceedings and upon the approval of the Society, record them in a book kept for that purpose, to keep a record of the members, to obtain the signature of each new member to the Constitution, to keep records of all committees appointed and notify all persons appointed in committees.

Section 4. Corresponding Secretary.

The duties of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to attend to all correspondence pertaining to the Society.

Section 5. Treasurer.

The duties of the Treasurer shall be to keep safely all money belonging to the Society, and to pay out, only such sums as the Recording Secretary gives written order to collect all dues and fines, to submit a written report at the close of each term.

Section 6. Critic.

The duties of the Critic shall be to criticize the literary meetings of the Society.

Section 7. Editor.

The duties of the Editor shall be to prepare publications and Society Journals.

Section 8. Chaplain.

The duties of the Chaplain shall be to conduct the opening exercises of the literary meetings.

Article VI. Meetings.

This Society shall meet in the

Society Hall every two weeks at three thirty P. M. on Friday Afternoon. The meeting shall be opened with prayer. The first part of the meeting shall be devoted to business, the remainder to the Literary Programme.

Article VII. Elections.

An election of all officers with the exception of the Treasurer shall be held at the first regular meeting in September the first regular meeting in December and the first regular meeting in March.

Article VIII. Amendments.

This Constitution may be amended at any regular business meeting by a two thirds vote of the members present provided the proposed amendment shall have been read to the Society and deposited with the Secretary at the regular business meeting preceding.

By-Laws.

Section I. Order of procedure.
Order of procedure shall be as follows:
Calling house to order, Prayer, Roll-call
Reading of minutes, Reports of Committees,
Unfinished business, new business, pro-
gramme, Critics Report, adjournment.

Section II. Literary Exercises.
The literary exercises shall consist of
Essays, Debates, Music, the Sapphonian
Journal and such other exercises, as
the Programme Committee shall deem
proper.

Section III. Programme Committee.
A committee shall be appointed at
the last regular meeting in February
to prepare the programmes for the fol-
lowing school year.

Section IV. Members.
New members shall sign the consti-
tution within four weeks from their
entrance into the society and pay In-
stitution fee of twenty five cents.

Section V. Honorary Members.
Honorary members shall not be
entitled to vote or hold office.

Section VI. Dues.
A sum of twenty five cents a term
shall be required of each member.

Section VII. No member shall be entitled to vote
or hold office, who has not paid her
dues.

Section VIII. Should an officer neglect the duties

of her office or prove incompetent to
discharge the same, she may be re-
moved from office by a vote of two-
thirds of the members present.

Section IX. All vacancies in office shall be fill-
ed by election.

Section X. Eight members including an officer,
shall constitute a quorum suffi-
cient to transact business.

Section XI. If any persons be absent from
roll-call without valid and satis-
factory excuse approved by the
President, she shall be fined ten
cents. For non-performance of duty,
a member shall be fined ten cents.

Section XII. When fines and dues of any member
shall have accumulated to the amount
of fifty cents the name of that mem-
ber shall be dropped from roll-call
until all such dues shall be paid.

Section XIII. Upon the request of five members
a special meeting shall be called by
the President.

Section XIV. The Emblem of this Society shall be
The colors of this Society shall be
Red and Gold.

Section XV. These By-Laws may be amended
by a two-thirds vote of the mem-
bers present at any regular meet-
ing, provided the amendment is
presented in writing and read by
the Secretary at least two weeks be-
fore the amendment is acted
upon.

- I. This Society shall meet in the Society Hall, once every week at a time most convenient for the majority of the members.
- II. The dues of this Society shall be fixed by a vote of the majority of its members present, at the first regular meeting in each term.

This Constitution may be amended at any regular business meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members present, provided the proposed amendment shall have been read to the society and deposited with the Secretary at the preceding business meeting.

The emblem of this society shall be a pin adopted in 1918.

These By-Laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any regular meeting, provided the amendment is presented in writing, and has been read by Secretary at least one week before the amendment is acted upon.

I Amendment.

The President of this society shall have charge of the society banner during term of office.

II Amendment.

All property and records belonging to the society shall be placed in the matron's

care during vacation.

III. Amendment

The emblem of the Sapphonian Literary Society shall be a 10K gold pin with the Greek letters S. O. (The first and last letter of the word Sappho from which the name Sapphonian is derived) engraved upon black enamel, surrounded by fourteen pearls.

IV. Amendment

For an unexcused absence of active members from a regular meeting of the society, a fine of ten cents shall be imposed for each offence. For non-performance of duty, when assigned part on the program, a fine of twenty-five cents shall be imposed.

V. The dues of this society shall be fixed by a vote of the majority of its members present at the first regular meeting in each term.

VI. Every new member, upon becoming a member, must pay an initiation fee of fifty cents.
