both of the state of Tennessee and County of Washington
witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum
of ten dollars the receipt whereof the said Miller
doth hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained
sold and by these presents doth grant bargain sell
alien confirm and convey unto the said congregations
their heirs or assigns for ever a certain tract or par-
cel of land containing one acre and forty poles more or
less for a ditch church, beginning at a black oak on
John Warr's line now William Clogdes then west four
teen poles and twenty two links to a stake then south
fourteen poles and twenty two links to a stake then east
fourteen poles and twenty two links to a stake in said
Warr's line then north the said line to the beginning.

This Indenture Indenture made this sixteenth day
of September in the year of our Lord one thousand seven
hundred and ninety six Between Colonel Charles Robert
son of Jonesborough and M^r. Samuel May Merchant of
the same place both of the state of Tennessee Witnesseth
that the said Charles Robertson for and in consideration
of the sum of one hundred pounds to him in hand paid
by the said Samuel May the receipt whereof is hereby
acknowledged, hath granted bargained and sold a
certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in
County of Washington and state aforesaid and bounded
as followeth Viz. beginning at a hickory and two
white oaks on the North side of Nolichucky river
North one hundred & seventy two poles with John James
line to a marked Chestnut on David Hoffmans line
thence with said line South seventy six feet
thence five poles to two gums James M^r. Adams
thence with said M^r. Adams line West one hundred
and fifty six poles to Jacob Browns corner a black oak
and two white oaks thence South one hundred and
fifty six poles to two white oaks and a hickory thence
thence of said Nolichucky river to the beginning
