The 10<sup>th</sup> Session closed, the 14<sup>th</sup> of June 1858 under the care of Mr Thomas P Summers with an examination of two days and exhibition of one day.

At a meeting of the board of Trustees in May last Mr Thomas P Summers was unanimous by elected Teacher for, the next sessions of 10 months.

The 12<sup>th</sup> Session was opened this the 18<sup>th</sup> of August 1858 under the care of Mr. Thomas. P. Summers

The 12<sup>th</sup> Session closed on the the 2<sup>nd</sup> of June 1859 with an examination of two day and exhibition of one day

May, the 5<sup>th</sup> 1859  
The Board was called to order by the President 1st Mr Thomas P Summers was unanimously elected Teacher for, the next Session of 10 mos to commence on Thursday August the 28<sup>th</sup>, 1859

May the 5<sup>th</sup> 1839  
At a regular meeting of the

Whereas Thomas P. Summers  
has been acting as Principal  
of Boons Creek male & female  
Seminary for more than two  
years -

Resolved That we the Board  
of Trustees recognize him not  
only as a gentleman but  
also as a faithfull and com-  
petent teacher and on our  
part have no desire to make  
a change but while he con-  
tinues to foster the interest  
of said Institution as heretofore  
he will receive our cordial  
co-operation

Resolved Farther That the school  
is meeting and we believe  
under the administration of  
Mr Summers will continue to meet  
our most sanguine expecta-  
tions

The Principal reciprocates  
the spirit of the above resolu-  
tion and pledges the best  
orts of his head and heart  
to continue to merit the esteem

and confidence of the  
Trustees and his patrons  
generally

Pursuant to a call of Mr. S. P. Summey,  
the Principal of the School. The Trustees met  
at the Seminary on the 14<sup>th</sup> of May 1860  
for the transaction of such business as  
should come before them for the advan-  
tage of the interest of the school.
