GREETING.

KNOW YE, That in consideration of an ENTRY made in the ENTRY TAKER'S OFFICE of

Washington County, of No. 736 dated the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of November 1842 by Joseph Bowman

there is GRANTED by the State of Tennessee unto the said Joseph Bowman and his heirs, a

certain TRACT OF LAND, containing Two hundred and eighty eight

Acres, lying in the County aforesaid on Knob Creek Beginning at a planted rock

Henry James corner. Then north forty three west twenty four poles to a stake near a school house. Then north thirty two east three poles to a stake. Then north forty three west six poles to a stake. Then south thirty two west three poles to a stake. Then north forty three west one hundred and eighty poles to a rock. Then south thirty four west one hundred and five poles to a spanish oak. Then north fifty six west forty four poles to a forked chestnut on the top of Indian Ridge. Then north thirty three east one hundred and ninety two poles to a planted rock. Then south sixty east one hundred and twenty eight poles to a white oak James White corner. Then with an agreed boundary between D. Bowman & White the following courses & distances. South fifty five east thirty seven poles to a white oak near a road. Then north fifty five east twenty two poles to a black oak. Then south fifty eight east fifty poles to a white oak. Then south twenty seven east forty poles to a white oak sapling. Then south fifty three east twenty six poles to an elm and two oaks on the bank of said creek. Then south twenty two east eighteen poles to a dogwood and cedar on the north bank of said creek. Then up the same with its meanders to a buckeye dogwood & maple the White corner. Then with his line west forty four poles to a small cucumber where a hickory stood. Then north seven poles to a dogwood. Then west fifty three poles to two ash trees. Then north sixty nine west twenty three poles to a planted rock. Then south forty five west thirty five poles to the Beginning.
